HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION memorializing Herbert John Kiesling.

Whereas, Herbert John Kiesling, professor emeritus of economics and public and environmental affairs at Indiana University, Bloomington, Indiana, died at the age of 65 on Friday, January 14, 2000, at Bloomington Hospital;

Whereas, Herbert John Kiesling was born on October 6, 1934, in St Louis, Missouri, the son of Herbert Charles Kiesling and Alice (Alt) Kiesling Erb;

Whereas, Herbert John Kiesling received a bachelor's and a master's degree from Washington University in St. Louis, Missouri, and a doctorate in economics from Harvard University;

Whereas, Herbert John Kiesling began his career at Indiana University in 1964;

Whereas, Professor Kiesling first focused his academic career on the role of collective goods in meeting the goals of individuals and societies;

Whereas, Professor Kiesling's pioneering effort to formulate a production function for education, relating achievement scores to the various inputs of the public schools in the state of New York, led to policy analyses and proposals addressing the problems of culturally and economically disadvantaged students, including the



equalization formulas for state spending on education in a school district;

Whereas, The second part of Professor Kiesling's career was focused on the ways that collective goods meet social goals, resulting in numerous publications, including two books, Taxation and Public Goods: A Welfare-Economic Critique of Tax Policy Analysis and Collective Goods, Neglected Goods: Dealing with Methodological Failure in the Social Sciences;

Whereas, Professor Kiesling was active in several community organizations, including Citizens for Community Justice and the League of Women Voters, and was a mentor for at-risk children; and

Whereas, Professor Kiesling has contributed greatly to the well-being of the citizens of our state and will be sorely missed by his family, his friends, and individuals throughout Indiana: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,
the Senate concurring:*

2 heartfelt sympathy to the family of Herbert John Kiesling on the sad
