A HOUSE RESOLUTION in memory of Mrs. Jewell Catherine Hendley Medley, Chief Elder, The Hendley Family Association, Inc. of Tennessee.

Whereas, Jewell Catherine Hendley was born May 30, 1923 in Clay County, near the town of Moss, Tennessee. She was the daughter of Willis Aden "Adie" Hendley of Putnam County, Tennessee and Mary Daisy Landcaster of Monroe County, Kentucky;

Whereas, Jewell Hendley attended elementary Schools in Clay, Macon and Sumner Counties, Tennessee, but excelled in the 2nd grade at Beech Grove Elementary in Trousdale County, Tennessee in the school year 1937-38, under the guidance of her teacher Loucille Cothron;

Whereas, Jewell Hendley married the late Elijah Prophet Taylor of Lafayette, Tennessee, Macon County. They resided at Portland, Tennessee, Sumner County until the passing of Mr. Taylor on November 28, 1956. Of this union was born one



child, a son, Mr. Harvey Harry Taylor, June 23, 1953, born while visiting in Trafalgar, Indiana, Johnson County;

Whereas, Jewell Catherine Hendley Taylor moved to Johnson County, Indiana where she met and married Arthur E. Fulmer on July 12, 1957 at the United Baptist Church in Brown County, Indiana;

Whereas, Jewell Catherine Hendley Fulmer was a home maker residing in Johnson and Brown Counties, Indiana at various times and was an employee of Rider's Canning factory in Trafalgar, Indiana, Johnson, County for many seasons (RED GOLD tomato packing);

Whereas, Jewell Hendley, after a voluntary divorce in 1981, married Mr. William E. Medley of Franklin, Indiana, Johnson County on June 23, 1982 at the Church of Christ in Franklin, Indiana, Johnson County, where she was a member for 20 years at her passing;

Whereas, Jewell Catherine Hendley Medley ascended to the honored position of Clan Elder (eldest of the Clan) of the Francis Marion Hendley Clan, branch of The Hendley Family Association, Inc. of Tennessee on September 30, 1993;

Whereas, Jewell Catherine Hendley Medley, further ascended to the highest honor of CHIEF ELDER of The Hendley Family Association, Inc. of Tennessee (eldest of both branches of the association) on August 24, 1998; and

Whereas, Jewell Catherine Hendley Medley, Chief Elder of The Hendley Family Association, Inc. of Tennessee passed away on February 2, 1999 at Indianapolis, Indiana and was buried at Nineveh Cemetery, Johnson County, Indiana. She was the great granddaughter of Elizabeth Jane Gentry Hendley (Mother of the Great Hendley family of Tennessee), sister to the late Wilby "Wilber" J. Hendley (Clan Elder 1976-83) native of Clay County, Tennessee, life time resident of Franklin, Indiana, and to Mr. John H. Hendley (Clan Elder 1998 present) native of Clay County, Tennessee, now life long resident of Franklin, Indiana of Johnson County since 1950, Now, therefore,
