

SENATE BILL No. 333

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 4-20.5.

Synopsis: State house preservation commission. Establishes a commission consisting of various state house officeholders and agencies to oversee certain aspects of the management of the state house.

Effective: July 1, 2000.

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January 10, 2000, read first time and referred to Committee on Rules and Legislative Procedure.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 4-20.5-6-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 2. **Except as provided**
3 **by IC 4-20.5-21**, the department shall maintain, equip, and operate the
4 following:

- 5 (1) The state capitol building.
- 6 (2) The office buildings and other property owned or leased by the
7 state for the use of an agency.

8 SECTION 2. IC 4-20.5-21 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
9 AS A **NEW CHAPTER** TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
10 JULY 1, 2000]:

11 **Chapter 21. State House Preservation Commission**

12 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "commission" refers to the state**
13 **house preservation commission established under section 5 of this**
14 **chapter.**

15 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "exhibits or fixtures" refer to**
16 **either of the following within the state capitol building or on the**
17 **grounds of the state capitol building:**



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- 1 (1) Exhibit or display cases.
- 2 (2) Notice boards or placards.
- 3 **Sec. 3.** As used in this chapter, "permanent" means a continuous
- 4 period of thirty (30) days or more.
- 5 **Sec. 4.** As used in this chapter, "temporary" means a period of
- 6 less than thirty (30) days.
- 7 **Sec. 5.** (a) There is established the state house preservation
- 8 commission.
- 9 (b) The commission consists of the following members:
- 10 (1) The governor, or an employee of the office of the governor
- 11 appointed by the governor.
- 12 (2) The chief justice of the supreme court of Indiana.
- 13 (3) The secretary of state.
- 14 (4) The attorney general.
- 15 (5) The state superintendent of public instruction.
- 16 (6) The auditor of state.
- 17 (7) The clerk of the supreme court.
- 18 (8) The treasurer of state.
- 19 (9) The budget director.
- 20 (10) A member of the senate appointed by the president pro
- 21 tempore of the senate.
- 22 (11) A member of the house of representatives appointed by
- 23 the speaker of the house of representatives.
- 24 (12) The executive director of the legislative services agency.
- 25 (c) A person appointed to the commission under subsection (b)
- 26 serves at the pleasure of the person making the appointment.
- 27 **Sec. 6.** (a) The governor shall annually select a member of the
- 28 commission to serve as chair.
- 29 (b) The commission shall meet at the call of the chair.
- 30 **Sec. 7.** The commission's duties include the following:
- 31 (1) Review and approval of guidelines governing the
- 32 following:
- 33 (A) The temporary placement of exhibits in the public
- 34 areas of the state capitol building.
- 35 (B) The landscaping of the exterior grounds of the state
- 36 capitol building.
- 37 (2) Review and approval of the following:
- 38 (A) The addition, placement, and removal of all permanent
- 39 exhibits in the public areas of the state capitol building.
- 40 (B) The addition, placement, and removal of any statuary
- 41 or other works of art on permanent display in the public
- 42 areas and on the exterior grounds of the state capitol

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1 **building.**
2 **Sec. 8. Each member of the commission who is a member of the**
3 **general assembly is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage,**
4 **and travel allowances paid to legislators who serve as members of**
5 **interim study committees established by the legislative council.**

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
