
HOUSE BILL No. 1097

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 9-24

Synopsis: Address on BMV application. Permits an applicant for a driver's license or permit or state identification card to enter either the applicant's mailing address or residence address on the application made to the bureau of motor vehicles.

Effective: July 1, 2000.

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January 10, 2000, read first time and referred to Committee on Roads and Transportation.

HOUSE BILL No. 1097



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 9-24-9-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
- 2 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 2. Each application for a license or
- 3 permit under this chapter must require the following information:
- 4 (1) The name, age, sex, and **mailing address or residence**
- 5 address of the applicant.
- 6 (2) Whether the applicant has been licensed as an operator, a
- 7 chauffeur, or a public passenger chauffeur or has been the holder
- 8 of a learner's permit, and if so, when and by what state.
- 9 (3) Whether the applicant's license or permit has ever been
- 10 suspended or revoked, and if so, the date of and the reason for the
- 11 suspension or revocation.
- 12 (4) Whether the applicant has been convicted of a crime
- 13 punishable as a felony under Indiana motor vehicle law or any
- 14 other felony in the commission of which a motor vehicle was
- 15 used.
- 16 (5) Whether the applicant has a physical or mental disability, and
- 17 if so, the nature of the disability and other information the bureau

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1 directs.
 2 SECTION 2. IC 9-24-11-5 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
 3 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 5. (a) A permit or
 4 license issued under this chapter must bear the distinguishing number
 5 assigned to the permittee or licensee and must contain:

- 6 (1) the name;
 7 (2) the age;
 8 (3) the **mailing address or residence** address;
 9 (4) a brief description; and
 10 (5) except as provided in subsection (c), a photograph of the
 11 permittee or licensee for the purpose of identification;
 12 and additional information that the bureau considers necessary,
 13 including a space for the signature of the permittee or licensee.

14 (b) In carrying out this section, the bureau shall obtain the
 15 equipment necessary to provide the photographs for permits and
 16 licenses as provided in subsection (a).

17 (c) The following permits or licenses do not require a photograph:

- 18 (1) Learner's permit issued under IC 9-24-7.
 19 (2) Temporary motorcycle learner's permit issued under
 20 IC 9-24-8.
 21 (3) Motorcycle learner's permit issued under IC 9-24-8.
 22 (4) Operator's license reissued under IC 9-24-12-6.

23 (d) The bureau may provide for the omission of a photograph from
 24 any other license or permit if there is good cause for the omission.

25 SECTION 3. IC 9-24-13-4 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
 26 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 4. If:

- 27 (1) an individual holding a license or permit issued under this
 28 article ~~moves from~~ **changes** the address ~~where the licensee or~~
 29 ~~permittee resided at the time shown on~~ the license or permit; ~~was~~
 30 ~~granted to the licensee or permittee;~~ or
 31 (2) the name of a licensee or permittee is changed by marriage or
 32 otherwise;

33 the licensee or permittee shall immediately notify the bureau in writing
 34 of the licensee's or permittee's old and new address or of the former
 35 name and new name and the number of the license or permit held by
 36 the licensee or permittee.

37 SECTION 4. IC 9-24-14-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
 38 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 3. If a licensee or
 39 permittee who changes **mailing address or residence** address or name,
 40 by marriage or otherwise, desires to have a replacement license or
 41 permit indicating the new address or name of the licensee or permittee,
 42 the licensee or permittee may request the issuance of the replacement

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1 license or permit upon proper application and the payment of the
2 required fee as authorized by this article.

3 SECTION 5. IC 9-24-16-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
4 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 3. (a) An identification
5 card must have the same dimensions and shape as a driver's license, but
6 the card must have markings sufficient to distinguish the card from a
7 driver's license.

8 (b) The front side of an identification card must contain the
9 following information about the individual to whom the card is being
10 issued:

11 (1) Full legal name.

12 (2) **Mailing address or residence** address.

13 (3) Birth date.

14 (4) Date of issue and date of expiration.

15 (5) Distinctive identification number or Social Security account
16 number, whichever is requested by the individual.

17 (6) Sex.

18 (7) Weight.

19 (8) Height.

20 (9) Color of eyes and hair.

21 (10) Signature of the individual identified.

22 (11) Whether the individual is blind (as defined in
23 IC 12-7-2-21(1)).

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
