DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3-20-24.

Synopsis: Catering hall alcoholic beverage permits. Provides that a restaurant with an alcoholic beverage permit may sell alcoholic beverages in a facility of the restaurant that is used for catered events and has accommodations for at least 250 individuals without the designation of the facility as a catering hall. (Current law defines accommodations as seating capacity for the serving of food in a room in which alcoholic beverages are sold.)

Effective: Upon passage.

HOUSE BILL No. 1260

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcoholic beverages.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-20-24 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 24. (a) This section
3 does not affect the requirements necessary to obtain a permit to sell
4 alcoholic beverages on the premises of a licensed premises.
5 (b) The commission may designate a licensed permit premises used
6 exclusively for catered events as a catering hall.
7 (c) Catering halls designated under this section are not required to
8 be open to the general public. However, if a designated catering hall
9 desires to host an event that is open to the general public, the catering
10 hall shall comply with the notice requirement under IC 7.1-3-9.5-2.
11 (d) **A licensed premises that is a restaurant may sell alcoholic**
12 **beverages in a facility of the restaurant that:**
13 **(1) is used for catered events; and**
14 **(2) has accommodations for at least two hundred fifty (250)**
15 **individuals;**
16 **without the designation of the facility as a catering hall.**
17 (e) The commission shall adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement

2 SECTION 2. **An emergency is declared for this act.**
