DIGEST OF SB 2 (Updated January 18, 2000 11:48 AM - DI 84)

Citations Affected: IC 4-20.5; IC 36-1.

Synopsis: Display of the Ten Commandments on public property. Authorizes the display of the Ten Commandments on real property owned by the state or a political subdivision as part of an exhibit displaying other documents of historical significance that formed and influenced the United States legal or governmental system.

Effective: July 1, 2000.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:
