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## SENATE BILL No. 331

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DIGEST OF SB 331 (Updated January 24, 2000 12:39 PM - DI 77)

**Citations Affected:** IC 14-22.

**Synopsis:** Fishing license exemption. Exempts a developmentally disabled person from the requirement to have a fishing license if the person: (1) is a resident of Indiana; and (2) is fishing with a person who holds a fishing license or who is exempt from holding a license because they are at least 65 years old.

**Effective:** July 1, 2000.

## SENATE BILL No. 331

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 14-22-11-8 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2000]: Sec. 8. (a) This section does  
3 not apply to the following:
- 4 (1) A person who is:
    - 5 (A) a resident of Indiana; and
    - 6 (B) at least sixty-five (65) years of age.
  - 7 (2) A person who is less than seventeen (17) years of age.
  - 8 (3) A person who is legally blind.
  - 9 (4) A person who is a resident patient of a state mental institution.
  - 10 (5) A person who is:
    - 11 (A) a resident of a health facility (as defined in
    - 12 IC 16-18-2-167) licensed in Indiana; and
    - 13 (B) taking part in a supervised activity of the health facility.
  - 14 (6) **A person who:**
    - 15 (A) **is a resident of Indiana;**
    - 16 (B) **has a developmental disability; and**
    - 17 (C) **is fishing with a person who holds a fishing license or**

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- 1                   **is exempt from holding a fishing license under subdivision**
- 2                   **(1).**
- 3                   (7) A resident of Indiana who fishes during a free sport fishing
