SENATE RESOLUTION

MR. PRESIDENT:

I offer the following resolution and move its adoption:

A SENATE RESOLUTION to honoring the public service of State Senator Katie L. Wolf upon her retirement from the Indiana State Senate.

Whereas, Katie L. Wolf has long served as an ideal legislator; tirelessly energetic, fiercely devoted to her constituents, and firmly committed to the politics of inclusion as fundamental to decision making;

Whereas, Senator Wolf serves as a shining example of all that is great and good about Indiana state government and its citizen legislature; she is a gentle lady in every sense of the phrase;

Whereas, Senator Katie Wolf's devoted public service began in the White County Courthouse where she served her fellow citizens as Clerk of the White Circuit Court for an entire decade (1968 - 1978);

Whereas, the Statehouse beckoned Katie Wolf from White County in 1984 and she was elected to a term in the Indiana House of Representatives;

Whereas, in 1986 Katie Wolf was selected to serve in the Indiana Senate representing the constituency of Senate District 7, a task she accepted with the same tireless dedication that was the hallmark of her public service in White County;

Whereas, the good people of Carroll, Clinton, Howard, Jasper, Pulaski, Stark, Tippecanoe, and White returned Senator Wolf to the Indiana State Senate in 1988, 1992, and 1996 because of her excellent representation of their interests;



Whereas, Senator Wolf has decided not to seek re-election in 2000 and thus she will be returning to her family farm and enter into retirement from her distinguished career in public service.

Be it resolved by the Senate of the General Assembly
of the State of Indiana, the House of Representatives concurring:

SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly honors the public service of their fellow legislator Katie Wolf; her career in the hallowed chambers of the State Capitol will long be remembered for her kind demeanor and effective energy for the citizens of Indiana.
