ENGROSSED HOUSE BILL No. 1050

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. P.L.37-1998, SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ
2 AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 31, 2001
3 (RETROACTIVE)]: SECTION 3. (a) As used in this SECTION,
4 "commission" refers to the Indiana commission on mental health
5 established by this SECTION.
6 (b) The Indiana commission on mental health is established.
7 (c) The commission consists of sixteen (16) members **determined**
8 **as follows:**
9 (1) The speaker of the house of representatives and the president
10 pro tempore of the senate shall each appoint two (2) legislative
11 members, who may not be from the same political party, to serve
12 on the commission.
13 (2) The governor shall appoint twelve (12) lay members, not more
14 than six (6) of whom may be from the same political party, to
15 serve on the commission as follows:
16 (†) (A) Four (4) at-large members, not more than two (2) of
17 whom may be from the same political party.
18 (‡) (B) Two (2) consumers of mental health services.

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1 ~~(3)~~ (C) Two (2) representatives of different advocacy groups
2 for consumers of mental health services.

3 ~~(4)~~ (D) Two (2) members of families of consumers of mental
4 health services.

5 ~~(5)~~ (E) Two (2) members who represent mental health
6 providers. One (1) of the members appointed under this
7 ~~subdivision clause~~ must be a physician licensed under
8 IC 25-22.5.

9 (d) Except for the members appointed under subsection ~~(c)(5)~~,
10 (c)(2)(E), the members of the commission may not have a financial
11 interest in the subject matter to be studied by the commission.

12 (e) The chairman of the legislative council shall designate a
13 legislative member of the commission to serve as chairman of the
14 commission.

15 (f) Each legislative member and each lay member of the
16 commission is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage, and
17 travel allowances paid to individuals serving as legislative and lay
18 members, respectively, on interim study committees established by the
19 legislative council.

20 (g) The commission shall do the following:

21 (1) Study and evaluate the funding system for managed care
22 providers of mental health services.

23 (2) Review and make specific recommendations regarding the
24 provision of mental health services delivered by community
25 managed care providers and state operated hospitals.

26 (3) Review and make recommendations regarding any unmet need
27 for public supported mental health services in any specific
28 geographic area or throughout Indiana. In formulating these
29 recommendations, the commission shall consider the need,
30 feasibility, and desirability of including additional organizations
31 in the network of managed care providers.

32 (4) Review the results of the actuarial study which must be
33 submitted by the division of mental health **and addiction** to the
34 commission not later than thirty (30) days after completion of the
35 actuarial study.

36 (5) Make recommendations regarding the application of the
37 actuarial study by the division of mental health **and addiction** to
38 the determination of service needs, eligibility criteria, payment,
39 and prioritization of service.

40 ~~(h) The commission shall submit recommendations under~~
41 ~~subsection (g) to the secretary of the family and social services~~
42 ~~administration and to the legislative council before July 1, 1998.~~



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1 ⊕ (h) The commission shall:
2 (1) monitor the implementation of managed care programs for all
3 populations of the mentally ill that are eligible for care that is paid
4 for in part or in whole by the state; and
5 (2) make recommendations regarding the commission's findings
6 under subdivision (1) to the appropriate division or department.
7 ⊕ (i) This SECTION expires January 1, ~~2002~~ **2004**.
8 SECTION 2. **An emergency is declared for this act.**

Mr. Speaker: Your Committee on Public Health, to which was referred House Bill 1050, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill be amended as follows:

Page 1, delete lines 7 through 18, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"(c) The commission consists of ~~sixteen (16)~~ **twenty (20)** members **determined as follows:**

(1) The chairperson and ranking minority member of the house public health committee are members of the commission.

(2) The chairperson and ranking minority member of the senate health and provider services committee are members of the commission.

(3) The speaker of the house of representatives and the president pro tempore of the senate shall each appoint two (2) legislative members, who may not be from the same political party, to serve on the commission.

(4) The governor shall appoint twelve (12) lay members, not more than six (6) of whom may be from the same political party, to serve on the commission as follows:

~~(1)~~ **(A)** Four (4) at-large members, not more than two (2) of whom may be from the same political party.

~~(2)~~ **(B)** Two (2) consumers of mental health services.

~~(3)~~ **(C)** Two (2) representatives of different advocacy groups for consumers of mental health services.

~~(4)~~ **(D)** Two (2) members of families of consumers of mental health services.

~~(5)~~ **(E)** Two (2) members who represent mental health providers. One (1) of the members appointed under this ~~subdivision~~ **clause** must be a physician licensed under IC 25-22.5."

Page 2, delete lines 1 through 5.

Page 2, line 6, strike "(c)(5)," and insert "**(c)(4)(E)**,".

and when so amended that said bill do pass.
