HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION concerning the terrorist attacks launched against the United States on September 11, 2001. (This resolution was prepared by the commission on military and veterans affairs.)

Whereas, On September 11, 2001, terrorists hijacked and destroyed four civilian aircraft, crashing two of them into the towers of the World Trade Center in New York City, and a third into the Pentagon outside Washington, D.C.;

Whereas, Thousands of innocent Americans were killed and injured as a result of these attacks, including the passengers and crew of the four aircraft, workers in the World Trade Center and in the Pentagon, rescue workers, and bystanders;

Whereas, These attacks destroyed both towers of the World Trade Center, as well as adjacent buildings, and seriously damaged the Pentagon; and

Whereas, These attacks were by far the deadliest terrorist attacks ever launched against the United States, and by targeting symbols of American strength and success, clearly were intended to intimidate our nation and weaken its resolve: Therefore,

*Be it resolved by the House of Representatives
of the General Assembly of the State of Indiana,
the Senate concurring:*



1 SECTION 1. That the Indiana General Assembly condemns in the
2 strongest possible terms the terrorists who planned and carried out the
3 September 11, 2001, attacks against the United States.

4 SECTION 2. That the Indiana General Assembly extends its deepest
5 condolences to the victims of these heinous and cowardly attacks,
6 especially to those victims from Indiana, as well as to their families,
7 friends, and loved ones.

8 SECTION 3. That the Indiana General Assembly commends the
9 citizens of Indiana, along with all of the people of the United States, for
10 standing united as our nation recovers and rebuilds in the aftermath of
11 these tragic acts.

12 SECTION 4. That the Indiana General Assembly commends the
13 heroic actions of the rescue workers, volunteers, and state and local
14 officials, especially those from Indiana, who responded to these tragic
15 events with courage, determination, and skill.

16 SECTION 5. That the Indiana General Assembly declares that these
17 premeditated attacks struck not only at the people of Indiana and of the
18 United States, but also at the symbols and structures of our economic
19 and military strength, and that the Indiana General Assembly supports
20 the President of the United States and the United States Congress in
21 their response under international law.

22 SECTION 6. That the Indiana General Assembly thanks those
23 foreign leaders and individuals who have expressed solidarity with the
24 United States in the aftermath of the attacks, and supports the President
25 of the United States and the United States Congress in asking those
26 foreign leaders and individuals to continue to stand with the United
27 States in the war against international terrorism.

28 SECTION 7. That the Indiana General Assembly supports increased
29 use of resources in the war to eradicate terrorism.

30 SECTION 8. That the Indiana General Assembly supports the
31 determination of the President, in close consultation with the United
32 States Congress, to bring to justice and punish the perpetrators of these
33 attacks as well as their sponsors.

34 SECTION 9. That the Principal Clerk of the House of
35 Representatives transmit a copy of this resolution to members of the
36 Indiana congressional delegation and to the President of the United
37 States.
