

# HOUSE BILL No. 1042

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 4-32.

**Synopsis:** Charity gaming proceeds. Provides that certain additional entities are eligible to receive mandated donations of charity gaming proceeds from a donor organization that derives more than 90% of its gross receipts from charity gaming. Allows certain veterans' homes to receive mandated donations from a bona fide veterans' organization.

**Effective:** July 1, 2004.

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January 13, 2004, read first time and referred to Committee on Public Policy, Ethics and Veterans Affairs.

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# HOUSE BILL No. 1042



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning gaming.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 4-32-6-20.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
3 1, 2004]: **Sec. 20.5. "Qualified recipient" means:**  
4 (1) a hospital or medical center operated by the federal  
5 government;  
6 (2) a hospital licensed under IC 16-21;  
7 (3) a hospital subject to IC 16-22;  
8 (4) a hospital subject to IC 16-23;  
9 (5) a health facility licensed under IC 16-28;  
10 (6) a psychiatric facility licensed under IC 12-25;  
11 (7) an organization described in section 20(a) of this chapter;  
12 (8) an activity or a program of a local law enforcement agency  
13 intended to reduce substance abuse;  
14 (9) a charitable activity of a local law enforcement agency; or  
15 (10) a veterans' home.  
16 SECTION 2. IC 4-32-6-23.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
17 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY



1, 2004]: **Sec. 23. 5. "Veterans' home" means any of the following:**  
 2           **(1) The Indiana Veterans' Home.**  
 3           **(2) The VFW National Home for Children.**  
 4           **(3) The Indiana Soldiers' and Sailors' Children's Home.**  
 5           SECTION 3. IC 4-32-9-16.5 IS AMENDED TO READ AS  
 6 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2004]: Sec. 16.5. **(a)** A qualified  
 7 organization that receives ninety percent (90%) or more of the  
 8 organization's total gross receipts from any events licensed under this  
 9 article is required to donate sixty percent (60%) of its gross charitable  
 10 gaming receipts less prize payout to ~~another qualified organization~~ a  
 11 **qualified recipient** that is not an affiliate, a parent, or a subsidiary  
 12 organization of the qualified organization.  
 13           **(b) For purposes of this section, a veterans' home is not**  
 14 **considered to be an affiliate, a parent, or a subsidiary organization**  
 15 **of a qualified organization that is a bona fide veterans'**  
 16 **organization.**

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
