**IMPACT:** State

**Summary of Legislation:** This bill requires the Board of Pharmacy to establish procedures under which pharmacies may return expired prescription drugs to drug wholesalers and manufacturers. The bill also prohibits a pharmacist from dispensing a prescription drug unless the wholesaler or manufacturer of the drug has a procedure for the return of expired prescription drugs that complies with procedures established by the Board of Pharmacy.

**Effective Date:** July 1, 2005.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** The seven-member Board of Pharmacy currently conducts monthly meetings, in which the Board should be able to address the requirements of this bill. However, if an additional meeting is needed, the cost associated with mileage reimbursement and per diem would be about \$570 per meeting. As of October 2004, the mileage reimbursement rate is \$0.28 per mile and per diem for lay members is \$50.
