Synopsis: Attorney's fees in Medicaid lien collection cases. Increases the amount of attorney's fees required to be paid by the office of Medicaid policy and planning in Medicaid lien collection cases.

Effective: July 1, 2005.

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HOUSE BILL No. 1028

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning Medicaid.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 12-15-8-8 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2005]: Sec. 8. The office shall pay
3 attorney's fees in the amount of one (1) of the following:
4 (1) ~~Seven and five-tenths~~ **Twenty-five** percent (~~7.5%~~) (**25%**) of
5 the office's recovery under the lien if the claim was collected
6 without initiating legal proceedings.
7 (2) ~~Ten~~ **Thirty-three and one-third** percent (~~10%~~) (**33 1/3%**) of
8 the office's recovery under the lien if the claim was collected by
9 initiating legal proceedings.
