**IMPACT:** State & Local

**Summary of Legislation:** (Amended) This bill requires an employment certificate to state the maximum number of hours that the child may be employed by the employer. It makes technical corrections.

**Effective Date:** June 1, 2006; July 1, 2006.

**Explanation of State Expenditures:** The requirement that an employment certificate must state the maximum number of hours that the child may be employed by the employer could have minor impact. The Online Work Permit System would have to be modified to include the maximum hours that can be worked.

The number of work permits issued by schools is between 87,000 and 127,000 each year.
