HOUSE BILL No. 1112

DIGEST OF HB 1112 (Updated January 23, 2008 2:54 pm - DI 96)

Citations Affected: Noncode.

Synopsis: Learner's permits and graduated driver's licenses. Establishes the interim study committee on learners' permits and graduated drivers' licenses to study: (1) the minimum age at which learner's permits and probationary driver's licenses can be issued by the bureau of motor vehicles; (2) requirements for practice driving before a probationary driver's license can be issued; (3) the use of handheld devices by probationary drivers; (4) conditions to which the probationary driver is subject while driving; (5) whether a penalty should be given to a minor who accompanies a probationary driver without an accompanying adult driver of a certain age; and (6) the adoption of rules concerning driver education instruction.

Effective: July 1, 2008.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2008] (a) As used in this
2 SECTION, "committee" refers to the interim study committee on

5 (b) As used in this SECTION, "driver's license" has the
6 meaning set forth in IC 9-13-2-48.
7 (c) There is established the interim study committee on learner's
8 permits and graduated driver's licenses. The committee shall
9 study:
10 (1) the minimum age at which learner's permits and
11 probationary driver's licenses can be issued by the bureau of
12 motor vehicles;
13 (2) requirements for practice driving before a probationary
14 driver's license can be issued;
15 (3) the use of handheld devices by probationary drivers;
16 (4) conditions to which the probationary driver is subject
17 while driving;
18 (5) whether a penalty should be given to a minor who

- 2 **adult driver of a certain age; and**
- 3 **(6) the adoption of rules concerning driver education**
- 4 **instruction.**
- 5 **(d) The committee shall operate under the policies governing**
- 6 **study committees adopted by the legislative council.**
- 7 **(e) The affirmative votes of a majority of the voting members**
- 8 **appointed to the committee are required for the committee to take**
- 9 **action on any measure, including final reports.**
- 10 **(f) This SECTION expires December 1, 2008.**
