

SENATE BILL No. 83

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: None (noncode).

Synopsis: Motor vehicle violations report. Requires the prosecuting attorney of each county to transmit to the prosecuting attorneys council an abstract of each motor vehicle offense filed with the prosecuting attorney during the previous calendar year. Requires the prosecuting attorneys council to compile the reports transmitted by the prosecuting attorneys into a statewide report and transmit the compiled report to the legislative council. Provides that the reporting ends January 1, 2014. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the interim study committee on transportation matters.)

Effective: January 1, 2009.

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. [EFFECTIVE JANUARY 1, 2009] (a) As used in this
- 2 SECTION, "council" refers to the prosecuting attorneys council of
- 3 Indiana established by IC 33-39-8-2.
- 4 (b) As used in this SECTION, "motor vehicle offense" refers to
- 5 a felony, misdemeanor, or infraction relating to the operation of a
- 6 motor vehicle.
- 7 (c) Not later than April 1 of each year, the prosecuting attorney
- 8 of each county shall electronically transmit to the council an
- 9 abstract of each motor vehicle offense filed with the prosecuting
- 10 attorney during the previous calendar year, in a manner and
- 11 format designated by the council.
- 12 (d) The abstract of a motor vehicle offense reported under
- 13 subsection (c) must contain the following information:
- 14 (1) The date of the offense.
- 15 (2) The motor vehicle offense charged in the:
- 16 (A) information;
- 17 (B) indictment;
- 18 (C) information and summons; or



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(D) complaint and summons.
 A reference to the statute violated is sufficient if the reference clearly identifies the motor vehicle offense charged.
(3) The type of operator's license held by the person charged.
(4) The disposition of the case, including the following information:
(A) Whether the prosecuting attorney withheld prosecution against the accused person under IC 33-39-1.
(B) Whether action was deferred under IC 34-28-5.
(C) Whether the accused person was acquitted.
(D) Whether the accused person was convicted.
(E) Whether the accused person participated in a pre-conviction forensic diversion program under IC 11-12-3.7-11.
(F) Whether the operator's license of the accused person was suspended.
(e) The council shall compile the reports transmitted under subsection (c) into a report for the entire state. The compiled report must include data for each of the following:
(1) All motor vehicle offenses for the year covered by the report, broken out by each type of motor vehicle offense by disposition.
(2) All motor vehicle offenses committed by persons who hold a commercial driver's license or a commercial driver's license learner's permit for the year covered by the report, broken out by each type of motor vehicle offense by disposition.
The council shall transmit the compiled report to the legislative council in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 not later than November 1 of each year.
(f) This SECTION expires January 1, 2014.

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
