Summary of Legislation: (Amended) This bill requires the Area Agencies on Aging (AAA) to study and report certain information concerning self-directed in-home care to the Division of Aging (DOA) and requires DOA to report any recommendations needed to improve the delivery of consumer-directed care to the Legislative Council not later than July 1, 2010.

(The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the Health Finance Commission.)

Effective Date: (Amended) Upon passage.

Explanation of State Expenditures: (Revised) The bill requires local AAAs to study and report specified information regarding self-directed in-home care to the Legislative Council by July 1, 2010. The Family and Social Services Administration (FSSA) may provide some oversight and coordination between AAAs in order to meet the reporting requirement. This may increase FSSA workload; however, FSSA reports that any increase can be absorbed by existing staff in the Division of Aging.

Explanation of State Revenues:

Explanation of Local Expenditures: (Revised) The Indiana Association of Area Agencies on Aging reports that the provisions of this bill will increase workload of AAAs to aid in the reporting requirement; however, no fiscal impact is expected.
