
HOUSE BILL No. 1535

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 12-13-14-13.

Synopsis: Food stamps at farmers' markets. Requires that before January 1, 2010, the division of family resources (division) must provide retailers who sell food at a farmers' market with wireless point of sale terminals that are connected to the electronic benefits transfer (EBT) system. Provides that before July 1, 2010, the director of the division may set a limit of not less than 20 wireless point of sale terminals that are issued.

Effective: July 1, 2009.

HOUSE BILL No. 1535

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 12-13-14-13 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
2 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
3 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2009]: **Sec. 13. (a) Before January 1, 2010,**
4 **the division shall implement a program that provides a retailer**
5 **who sells food at a farmers' market with a wireless point of sale**
6 **terminal that is connected to the EBT system.**

7 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), the director of the division
8 of family resources may limit, to a number not less than twenty
9 (20), the number of wireless point of sale terminals that are:

10 (1) connected to the EBT system; and

11 (2) issued to a retailer who sells food at a farmers' market.

12 **This subsection expires July 1, 2010.**
