PRINTING CODE. Amendments: Whenever an existing statute (or a section of the Indiana Constitution) is being amended, the text of the existing provision will appear in this style type, additions will appear in **this style type**, and deletions will appear in ~~this style type~~.

Additions: Whenever a new statutory provision is being enacted (or a new constitutional provision adopted), the text of the new provision will appear in **this style type**. Also, the word **NEW** will appear in that style type in the introductory clause of each SECTION that adds a new provision to the Indiana Code or the Indiana Constitution.

Conflict reconciliation: Text in a statute in *this style type* or ~~this style type~~ reconciles conflicts between statutes enacted by the 2010 Regular Session of the General Assembly.

HOUSE BILL No. 1255

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning state offices and administration.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 4-1-12 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2 A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2011]:

4 **Chapter 12. English Language Requirement**
5 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "official document or**
6 **communication" means a written document or written**
7 **communication that:**

- 8 (1) binds or commits the state;
9 (2) is required by law; or
10 (3) gives the appearance of presenting the official views or
11 positions of the state.

12 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "state" means Indiana or any**
13 **agency of state government and includes a body corporate and**
14 **politic established as an instrumentality of the state. The term does**
15 **not include a political subdivision (as defined in IC 3-5-2-38).**

16 **Sec. 3. Except as provided in section 4 of this chapter, an official**
17 **document or communication issued:**

 3 (3) representing;
 4 **the state may be issued only in the English language.**
 5 **Sec. 4. A language other than English may be used when**
 6 **required:**
 7 (1) by the Constitution of the United States, federal law, or the
 8 Constitution of the State of Indiana;
 9 (2) by law enforcement or public health and safety needs;
 10 (3) to protect the rights of parties and witnesses in a civil or
 11 criminal action in a court or in an administrative proceeding;
 12 (4) to promote and encourage tourism and economic
 13 development;
 14 (5) to teach:
 15 (A) another language to students proficient in English; or
 16 (B) English to students of limited English proficiency; and
 17 (6) by libraries:
 18 (A) to collect and promote foreign language materials; and
 19 (B) to provide foreign language services and activities.
 20 **Sec. 5. This chapter may not be construed to affect the ability of**
 21 **a person to exercise the person's rights under:**
 22 (1) the First Amendment to the Constitution of the United
 23 States; or
 24 (2) Article 1, Section 9 of the Constitution of the State of
 25 Indiana.
