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# SENATE BILL No. 320

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 3-11-10-26.

**Synopsis:** Early voting locations. Provides that a circuit court clerk (clerk) designates a single location of the clerk's office as a location at which a voter is entitled to cast an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board. Provides that in a county having a population of more than 400,000 but less than 700,000, the director of the board of elections and registration (board) designates a single location of the clerk's office or board's office as a location at which a voter is entitled to cast an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board. Provides that all other locations at which the clerk or the board has an office must be established as satellite offices in order to be used as locations at which a voter is entitled to cast an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board.

**Effective:** July 1, 2011.

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## SENATE BILL No. 320

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning elections.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 3-11-10-26, AS AMENDED BY P.L.66-2010,  
2 SECTION 24, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2011]: Sec. 26. (a) **This subsection applies to all counties,**  
4 **except for a county to which IC 3-6-5.2 applies.** As an alternative to  
5 voting by mail, a voter is entitled to cast an absentee ballot before an  
6 absentee voter board **at any of the following:**

7 (1) ~~in the A single location of the~~ office of the circuit court clerk  
8 ~~(or board of elections and registration in a county subject to~~  
9 ~~IC 3-6-5.2); or designated by the circuit court clerk.~~

12 (b) **This subsection applies to a county to which IC 3-6-5.2**  
13 **applies. As an alternative to voting by mail, a voter is entitled to**  
14 **cast an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board at any of the**

17 (A) **the office of the circuit court clerk; or**



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**(B) the office of the board of elections and registration; designated by the director of the board of elections and registration.**

**(2) A satellite office established under section 26.3 of this chapter.**

**(c) Except for the location designated under subsection (a)(1) or (b)(1), a location of the office of the circuit court clerk or the board of elections and registration must be established as a satellite office under section 26.3 of this chapter in order to be used as a location at which a voter is entitled to cast an absentee ballot before an absentee voter board under this section.**

~~(d)~~ **(d)** The voter must:

(1) sign an application on the form prescribed by the commission under IC 3-11-4-5.1; and

(2) provide proof of identification;

before being permitted to vote. The application must be received by the circuit court clerk not later than the time prescribed by IC 3-11-4-3.

~~(e)~~ **(e)** The voter may vote before the board not more than twenty-nine (29) days nor later than noon on the day before election day.

~~(f)~~ **(f)** An absent uniformed services voter who is eligible to vote by absentee ballot in the circuit court clerk's office under IC 3-7-36-14 may vote before the board not earlier than twenty-nine (29) days before the election and not later than noon on election day. If a voter described by this subsection wishes to cast an absentee ballot during the period beginning at noon on the day before election day and ending at noon on election day, the county election board or absentee voter board may receive and process the ballot at a location designated by resolution of the county election board.

~~(g)~~ **(g)** The absentee voter board in the office of the circuit court clerk must permit voters to cast absentee ballots under this section for at least seven (7) hours on each of the two (2) Saturdays preceding election day.

~~(h)~~ **(h)** Notwithstanding subsection ~~(e)~~, **(g)**, in a county with a population of less than twenty thousand (20,000), the absentee voter board in the office of the circuit court clerk, with the approval of the county election board, may reduce the number of hours available to cast absentee ballots under this section to a minimum of four (4) hours on each of the two (2) Saturdays preceding election day.

~~(i)~~ **(i)** As provided by 42 U.S.C. 15481, a voter casting an absentee ballot under this section must be:

(1) permitted to verify in a private and independent manner the

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1 votes selected by the voter before the ballot is cast and counted;  
 2 (2) provided with the opportunity to change the ballot or correct  
 3 any error in a private and independent manner before the ballot is  
 4 cast and counted, including the opportunity to receive a  
 5 replacement ballot if the voter is otherwise unable to change or  
 6 correct the ballot; and  
 7 (3) notified before the ballot is cast regarding the effect of casting  
 8 multiple votes for the office and provided an opportunity to  
 9 correct the ballot before the ballot is cast and counted.  
 10 ~~(h)~~ (j) As provided by 42 U.S.C. 15481, when an absentee ballot is  
 11 provided under this section, the board must also provide the voter with:  
 12 (1) information concerning the effect of casting multiple votes for  
 13 an office; and  
 14 (2) instructions on how to correct the ballot before the ballot is  
 15 cast and counted, including the issuance of replacement ballots.  
 16 ~~(i)~~ (k) If:  
 17 (1) the voter is unable or declines to present the proof of  
 18 identification; or  
 19 (2) a member of the board determines that the proof of  
 20 identification provided by the voter does not qualify as proof of  
 21 identification under IC 3-5-2-40.5;  
 22 the voter shall be permitted to cast an absentee ballot and the voter's  
 23 absentee ballot shall be treated as a provisional ballot.

 25 to cast the voter's ballot in accordance with IC 3-11-9.

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
