

SENATE BILL No. 506

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 35-47-2.

Synopsis: Handgun possession. Allows a person to carry a handgun on or about the person's body without being licensed to carry a handgun if: (1) the person is in or on property, or in a vehicle, that is owned, leased, rented, or otherwise legally controlled by the person; (2) the person is lawfully present in or on private property, or in a vehicle, that is owned, leased, rented, or otherwise legally controlled by another person; (3) the person is carrying the handgun at a shooting range, while attending a firearms instructional course, or while engaged in a legal hunting activity; or (4) the handgun is unloaded and securely wrapped. (Current law provides that a person who does not possess a valid handgun license may not carry a handgun in any vehicle or on or about the person's body unless the person: (1) is in the person's dwelling or fixed place of business or on the person's property; or (2) is carrying the handgun unloaded and in a secure wrapper from the place where the handgun was purchased to the person's dwelling or fixed place of business, between a handgun repair shop and the person's dwelling or fixed place of business, or from one dwelling or fixed place of business to another.) Specifies that a person who has been convicted of domestic battery may not possess or carry a handgun unless the person's right to possess a firearm has been restored by a court.

Effective: July 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

 13 restored under IC 35-47-4-7, a person who has been convicted of
 14 domestic battery under IC 35-42-2-1.3 may not possess or carry a

 16 ~~dwelling or on the person's property or fixed place of business.~~

17 (d) This section may be not construed:

- 18 (1) to prohibit a person who owns, leases, rents, or otherwise
 19 legally controls private property from regulating or
 20 prohibiting the possession of firearms on the private
 21 property; or
 22 (2) to allow a person to adopt or enforce an ordinance,
 23 resolution, policy, or rule that:
 24 (A) prohibits; or
 25 (B) has the effect of prohibiting;
 26 an employee of the person from possessing a firearm or
 27 ammunition that is locked in the trunk of the employee's
 28 vehicle, kept in the glove compartment of the employee's
 29 locked vehicle, or stored out of plain sight in the employee's
 30 locked vehicle, unless the person's adoption or enforcement of
 31 the ordinance, resolution, policy, or rule is allowed under
 32 IC 34-28-7-2(b).
