
HOUSE BILL No. 1114

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-26-14-8.

Synopsis: Athletic eligibility of home schooled children. Allows a student who attends a nonaccredited nonpublic school to participate in high school athletics at the public high school located within the legal settlement of the student if certain conditions are met.

Effective: July 1, 2011.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 20-26-14-8 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
3 1, 2011]: **Sec. 8. (a) A high school student who attends a**
4 **nonaccredited nonpublic school that is not a member of an**
5 **association may participate in high school athletics at a public high**
6 **school that is a member of an association if the public high school**
7 **is located within the legal settlement of the student and the criteria**
8 **set forth in subsection (b) are met.**

9 (b) For a high school student described in subsection (a) to be
10 eligible to participate in high school athletics at a public high
11 school that is located within the legal settlement of the student and
12 is a member of an association, the student must take a nationally
13 recognized test that assesses basic skills and achievement for each
14 year of high school and achieve at least the minimum standard
15 score commensurate with the student's grade level.
