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# HOUSE BILL No. 1226

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 4-21.5-2-6; IC 12-7-2-149.1; IC 12-17.2.

**Synopsis:** Child care regulation. Makes various statutory changes making certain health and safety requirements applying to child care providers consistent, including criminal history checks, drug testing, caregiver education and supervision, nutrition, immunizations, fire and hazardous materials safety, and administrative procedures for noncompliance. Makes technical changes. (The introduced version of this bill was prepared by the committee on child care.)

**Effective:** July 1, 2011.

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# HOUSE BILL No. 1226



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 4-21.5-2-6, AS AMENDED BY P.L.219-2007,  
2 SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2011]: Sec. 6. This article does not apply to the formulation,  
4 issuance, or administrative review (but does apply to the judicial  
5 review and civil enforcement) of any of the following:

- 6 (1) Except as provided in IC 12-17.2-4-18.7, ~~and~~
- 7 IC 12-17.2-5-18.7, **and IC 12-17.2-6-22**, determinations by the
- 8 division of family resources and the department of child services.

 29 child care centers and child care homes after consultation with the  
 30 following:

 32 (2) Fire prevention and building safety commission.

 35 (b) The rules adopted under subsection (a) shall be applied by the  
 36 division and state fire marshal in the licensing and inspection of  
 37 applicants for a license and licensees under this article.

 18          affected by this article.

- 21           (1) Submits to the division a written request for the variance in  
 22           the form and manner specified by the division.
- 23           (2) Documents that compliance with an alternative method of

 26           applicant for the variance, as determined by the division.

27          (c) A variance granted under subsection (b) must be conditioned

 30          may be the basis for revoking the variance.

 32          ~~license or a licensee under this chapter~~ **provider** does the following:

- 33           (1) Submits to the division a written request for the waiver in the  
 34           form and manner specified by the division.
- 35           (2) Documents that compliance with the rule specified in the  
 36           application for the waiver will create an undue hardship on the  
 37           applicant for the waiver, as determined by the division.
- 38           (3) Documents that the applicant for the waiver will be in  
 39           substantial compliance with the rules adopted by the division after  
 40           the waiver is granted, as determined by the division.
- 41           (4) Documents that noncompliance with the rule specified in the  
 42           application for a waiver will not be adverse to the health, safety,

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1 or welfare of a child receiving services from the applicant for the  
2 waiver, as determined by the division.

3 (e) Except for a variance or waiver of a rule governing child care  
4 homes, a variance or waiver of a rule under this section that conflicts  
5 with a building rule or fire safety rule adopted by the fire prevention  
6 and building safety commission is not effective until the variance or  
7 waiver is approved by the fire prevention and building safety  
8 commission.

9 SECTION 6. IC 12-17.2-3.5-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.124-2007,

  - 25 (A) employs the individual; or
  - 26 (B) allows the individual to volunteer;
 as a caregiver at the facility where the provider operates a child  
27 care program.

11 ministry is substantiated, the department shall send a copy of its  
12 report to the appropriate office of the division.**

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
