SENATE BILL No. 245

DIGEST OF SB 245 (Updated January 24, 2011 2:24 pm - DI 14)

Citations Affected: IC 16-19; IC 16-41.

Synopsis: Prenatal substance abuse commission and office of women's health.. Creates the prenatal substance abuse commission and requires the commission to develop and recommend a coordinated plan to improve early intervention and treatment for pregnant women who abuse alcohol or drugs or use tobacco. (The commission was originally created in 2007 and expired December 31, 2009.) Provides that the office of women's health may seek funding and accept gifts from individuals.

Effective: Upon passage; July 1, 2011.

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SENATE BILL No. 245

A BILL FOR AN ACT concerning health.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 16-19-13-3 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2011]: Sec. 3. The office is
3 established for the following purposes:
- 4 (1) To educate and advocate for women's health by requesting that
5 the state department, either on its own or in partnership with other
6 entities, establish appropriate forums, programs, or initiatives
7 designed to educate the public regarding women's health, with an
8 emphasis on preventive health and healthy lifestyles.
- 9 (2) To assist the state health commissioner in identifying,
10 coordinating, and establishing priorities for programs, services,
11 and resources the state should provide for women's health issues
12 and concerns relating to the reproductive, menopausal, and
13 postmenopausal phases of a woman's life, with an emphasis on
14 postmenopausal health.
- 15 (3) To serve as a clearinghouse and resource for information
16 regarding women's health data, strategies, services, and programs
17 that address women's health issues, including the following:
- 18 (A) Diseases that significantly impact women, including heart

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- 1 disease, cancer, and osteoporosis.
- 2 (B) Menopause.
- 3 (C) Mental health.
- 4 (D) Substance abuse.
- 5 (E) Sexually transmitted diseases.
- 6 (F) Sexual assault and domestic violence.
- 7 (4) To collect, classify, and analyze relevant research information
- 8 and data conducted or compiled by:
- 9 (A) the state department; or
- 10 (B) other entities in collaboration with the state department;
- 11 and to provide interested persons with information regarding the
- 12 research results, except as prohibited by law.
- 13 (5) To develop and recommend funding and program activities for
- 14 educating the public on women's health initiatives, including the
- 15 following:
- 16 (A) Health needs throughout a woman's life.
- 17 (B) Diseases that significantly affect women, including heart
- 18 disease, cancer, and osteoporosis.
- 19 (C) Access to health care for women.
- 20 (D) Poverty and women's health.
- 21 (E) The leading causes of morbidity and mortality for women.
- 22 (F) Special health concerns of minority women.
- 23 (6) To make recommendations to the state health commissioner
- 24 regarding programs that address women's health issues for
- 25 inclusion in the state department's biennial budget and strategic
- 26 planning.
- 27 (7) To seek funding from private or governmental entities, **and to**
- 28 **seek funding and accept gifts from individuals** to carry out the
- 29 purposes of this chapter.
- 30 (8) To prepare materials for publication and dissemination to the
- 31 public on women's health.
- 32 (9) To conduct public educational forums in Indiana to raise
- 33 public awareness and to educate citizens about women's health
- 34 programs, issues, and services.
- 35 (10) To coordinate the activities and programs of the office with
- 36 other entities that focus on women's health or women's issues,
- 37 including the Indiana commission for women (IC 4-23-25-3).
- 38 (11) To represent the state health commissioner, upon request,
- 39 before the general assembly and the Indiana commission for
- 40 women established by IC 4-23-25-3.
- 41 (12) To provide an annual report to the governor, the legislative
- 42 council, and the Indiana commission for women regarding the

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1 successes of the programs of the office, priorities and services
2 needed for women's health in Indiana, and areas for improvement.
3 A report provided under this subdivision to the legislative council
4 must be in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.

5 This section does not allow the director or any employees of the office
6 to advocate, promote, refer to, or otherwise advance abortion or
7 abortifacients.

8 SECTION 2. IC 16-41-16.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
9 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
10 UPON PASSAGE]:

11 **Chapter 16.5. Prevention and Treatment Programs: Prenatal**
12 **Substance Abuse Commission**

13 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "commission" refers to the**
14 **prenatal substance abuse commission established by section 2 of**
15 **this chapter.**

16 **Sec. 2. The prenatal substance abuse commission is established**
17 **to develop and recommend a coordinated plan to improve early**
18 **intervention and treatment for pregnant women who:**

- 19 (1) abuse alcohol or drugs; or
- 20 (2) use tobacco.

21 **Sec. 3. The commission consists of the following members:**

- 22 (1) The state health commissioner or the commissioner's
23 designee.
- 24 (2) The director of the division of mental health and addiction
25 or the director's designee.
- 26 (3) The director of the office of Medicaid policy and planning
27 or the director's designee.
- 28 (4) The director of the department of child services or the
29 director's designee.
- 30 (5) One (1) physician specializing in addiction treatment of
31 pregnant women.
- 32 (6) One (1) physician specializing in the care of pregnant
33 women.
- 34 (7) One (1) social worker certified in the treatment of alcohol,
35 tobacco, and other drug abuse.
- 36 (8) One (1) woman who has received treatment for alcohol,
37 tobacco, or other drug abuse during pregnancy.
- 38 (9) One (1) advocate recommended by the March of Dimes,
39 Indiana Chapter.
- 40 (10) One (1) prosecuting attorney or a deputy prosecuting
41 attorney who practices in a problem solving court established
42 under IC 33-23-16.

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1 (11) One (1) judge of a problem solving court established
2 under IC 33-23-16.

3 (12) Two (2) members of the house of representatives, who are
4 nonvoting members. The members appointed under this
5 subdivision may not be members of the same political party.

6 (13) Two (2) members of the senate, who are nonvoting
7 members. The members appointed under this subdivision may
8 not be members of the same political party.

9 (14) An advanced practice nurse who has a collaborative
10 agreement with a physician who specializes in addiction
11 treatment for pregnant women or the care of pregnant
12 women.

13 The speaker of the house of representatives shall appoint the
14 members under subdivisions (5), (7), (9), (10), and (12) not later
15 than July 1, 2011. The president pro tempore of the senate shall
16 appoint the members under subdivisions (6), (8), (11), (13), and (14)
17 not later than July 1, 2011. Vacancies shall be filled by the
18 appointing authority for the remainder of an unexpired term.

19 Sec. 4. A majority of the voting members of the commission
20 constitutes a quorum.

21 Sec. 5. The state department shall provide staff and
22 administrative support for the commission.

23 Sec. 6. The state health commissioner or the commissioner's
24 designee shall convene the first meeting of the commission before
25 September 1, 2011. The commission shall elect a member of the
26 commission to serve as chairperson of the commission. The
27 commission shall meet at the call of the chairperson and shall meet
28 as often as necessary to carry out the purpose of this chapter.
29 However, the commission shall meet at least quarterly.

30 Sec. 7. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), members of the
31 commission are not entitled to a salary per diem or reimbursement
32 of expenses for service on the commission.

33 (b) Each legislative member of the commission is entitled to
34 receive the same per diem, mileage, and travel allowances paid to
35 individuals serving as legislative members on interim study
36 committees established by the legislative council.

37 Sec. 8. The affirmative votes of a majority of the commission's
38 voting members are required for the commission to take action on
39 any measure.

40 Sec. 9. The commission shall submit reports to the governor and
41 the legislative council as follows:

42 (1) Not later than December 15, 2012, an interim report that

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1 contains any interim findings and recommendations of the
2 commission.
3 (2) Not later than December 15, 2013, a final report that
4 contains the findings and recommendations of the commission
5 and an implementation plan to improve early intervention
6 and treatment for pregnant women who abuse alcohol or
7 drugs or use tobacco.
8 The reports required under this section must be submitted in an
9 electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
10 Sec. 10. This chapter expires June 30, 2014.
11 SECTION 3. An emergency is declared for this act.

Page 3, line 5, delete "Members" and insert **"(a) Except as provided in subsection (b), members"**.

Page 3, between lines 7 and 8, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"(b) Each legislative member of the commission is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage, and travel allowances paid to individuals serving as legislative members on interim study committees established by the legislative council."

(10) To coordinate the activities and programs of the office with other entities that focus on women's health or women's issues, including the Indiana commission for women (IC 4-23-25-3).

(11) To represent the state health commissioner, upon request, before the general assembly and the Indiana commission for women established by IC 4-23-25-3.

(12) To provide an annual report to the governor, the legislative council, and the Indiana commission for women regarding the successes of the programs of the office, priorities and services needed for women's health in Indiana, and areas for improvement. A report provided under this subdivision to the legislative council must be in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.

This section does not allow the director or any employees of the office to advocate, promote, refer to, or otherwise advance abortion or abortifacients."
