DIGEST OF SB 375 (Updated February 7, 2011 12:37 pm - DI 116)

Citations Affected: IC 2-5.

Synopsis: Sustainable natural resource task force. Establishes the sustainable natural resource task force to: (1) collect programmatic and funding data on current natural resource protection programs in Indiana; (2) perform a needs assessment concerning natural resource programs; and (3) collect information concerning the natural resource protection programs of other states, including information about funding and funding mechanisms for those programs. Establishes reporting requirements. Provides that the task force expires May 1, 2013.

Effective: Upon passage.

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SENATE BILL No. 375



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 2-5-31 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
- 2 A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON
- 3 PASSAGE]:
- 4 **Chapter 31. Sustainable Natural Resource Task Force**
- 5 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "task force" refers to the**
- 6 **sustainable natural resource task force established by section 3 of**
- 7 **this chapter.**
- 8 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "committee" refers to the**
- 9 **natural resources study committee established by IC 2-5-5-1.**
- 10 **Sec. 3. The sustainable natural resource task force is**
- 11 **established.**
- 12 **Sec. 4. (a) The task force consists of ten (10) members appointed**
- 13 **as follows:**
- 14 **(1) Two (2) members of the senate appointed by the president**
- 15 **pro tempore of the senate, who may not be affiliated with the**
- 16 **same political party.**
- 17 **(2) Two (2) members of the house of representatives**

1 appointed by the the speaker of the house, who may not be
 2 affiliated with the same political party.
 3 (3) Three (3) members appointed by the speaker of the house
 4 of representatives, each of whom is recommended by one (1)
 5 of the following organizations:
 6 (A) The Indiana Association of Soil and Water
 7 Conservation Districts.
 8 (B) The Indiana Wildlife Federation.
 9 (C) The Indiana Land Protection Alliance.
 10 (4) Three (3) members appointed by the president pro
 11 tempore of the senate, each of whom is recommended by one
 12 (1) of the following organizations:
 13 (A) The Indiana Farm Bureau.
 14 (B) The Indiana Forestry and Woodland Owners
 15 Association.
 16 (C) The Nature Conservancy.
 17 (b) The appointing authority who appointed a member of the
 18 task force may remove the member for cause.
 19 Sec. 5. (a) The term of a member of the task force expires May
 20 1, 2013.
 21 (b) In the case of a vacancy on the task force:
 22 (1) the appointing authority who appointed the member
 23 whose position is vacant shall appoint an individual to fill the
 24 vacancy not more than thirty (30) days after the vacancy
 25 occurs; and
 26 (2) the member appointed under this subsection shall fill the
 27 vacancy for the remainder of the term.
 28 Sec. 6. (a) A member of the task force appointed under section
 29 4(3) or 4(4) of this chapter shall serve without compensation.
 30 (b) A member of the task force who is a member of the general
 31 assembly is entitled to receive the same per diem, mileage, and
 32 travel allowances paid to legislative members of interim study
 33 committees established by the legislative council. Per diem,
 34 mileage, and travel allowances paid under this subsection shall be
 35 paid from appropriations made to the legislative council.
 36 Sec. 7. Six (6) members of the task force constitute a quorum for
 37 the transaction of business.
 38 Sec. 8. (a) The task force shall do the following:
 39 (1) Collect programmatic and funding information
 40 concerning current natural resource protection programs in
 41 Indiana.
 42 (2) Perform a needs assessment concerning the natural

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resource programs in Indiana, including current programs and associated costs.

(3) Collect information concerning:

- (A) natural resource protection programs in other states, particularly states bordering Indiana; and**
- (B) funding and funding mechanisms for the programs referred to in clause (A).**

(b) The task force shall do the following:

- (1) Present a progress report to the committee at the committee's first meeting of the 2012 interim.**
- (2) Present a progress report to the committee at the committee's final meeting of the 2012 interim.**
- (3) Provide to the governor copies of the reports presented under subdivisions (1) and (2).**

(c) Beginning November 1, 2012, the task force, at the direction of the legislative council and the committee, shall do the following:

- (1) Conduct any needed follow-up research and policy analysis.**
- (2) Prepare a final report setting forth the findings and recommendations of the task force, including a report card on the health of natural resources in Indiana.**

(d) The final report required under subsection (b)(2) must be:

- (1) completed by January 1, 2013; and**
- (2) submitted to the general assembly in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 and to the governor.**

Sec. 9. (a) The task force shall hold regular meetings.

(b) The task force shall hold its initial meeting not later than May 30, 2011.

(c) A chairperson shall be elected by the members of the task force at the first meeting of the task force. The chairperson elected at the first meeting shall serve until June 30, 2012, when the members of the task force may elect a new chairperson. If a task force member is elected chairperson under this subsection on or after June 30, 2012, that task force member shall serve as chairperson until May 1, 2013. If a new chairperson is not elected under this subsection on or after June 30, 2012, the chairperson elected at the first meeting shall serve as chairperson until May 1, 2013.

Sec. 10. The task force may establish work groups to:

- (1) assist in research and information gathering concerning various topics studied by the task force; and**
- (2) report back to the task force at regular task force**

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1 meetings.

2 Sec. 11. (a) The department of natural resources shall provide

3 administrative assistance to the task force. However, the

4 chairperson of the task force may, with the approval of the task

5 force, appoint staff from one (1) or more of the organizations

6 referred to in section 4(3) and 4(4) of this chapter to provide

7 administrative assistance.

8 (b) The task force shall seek technical assistance from the

9 following:

10 (1) The department of natural resources.

11 (2) The department of agriculture.

12 (3) The department of environmental management.

13 (c) The task force may seek and accept assistance from public

14 universities willing to provide research, scientific expertise, and

15 policy analysis as needed by the task force.

16 Sec. 12. This chapter expires May 1, 2013.

17 SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.
