SENATE BILL No. 128**

DIGEST OF SB 128 (Updated February 21, 2012 1:52 pm - DI 113)

Citations Affected: IC 5-11; noncode.

Synopsis: Administration of public retirement plans. Requires the Indiana public retirement system (system) to pay the direct and indirect costs of the state board of accounts' examination of the public pension and retirement funds administered by the system. (Currently, only the teachers' retirement fund is required to pay these costs.) Urges the assignment to the pension management oversight commission the study of a reporting system for retirement plans of the state or a political subdivision not administered by the system. (Currently, these plans must report to the public employees' retirement fund (PERF) information necessary for the PERF actuary to perform an actuarial valuation of the plan.)

Effective: July 1, 2012.

ENGROSSED SENATE BILL No. 128

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning pensions.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 5-11-4-3.6 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012]: Sec. 3.6. As provided in
3 section 3 of this chapter, each of the following units of state
4 government and eligible federal projects shall bear the direct and
5 indirect costs of its own examination from the following designated
6 funds:
7 (1) Indiana department of transportation (except toll project costs
8 and expenses), bureau of motor vehicles (including branch
9 offices), motor fuel tax division, state police department, and
10 traffic safety functions under IC 9-27-2 from the motor vehicle
11 account fund.
12 (2) Indiana ~~state teachers'~~ **public** retirement ~~fund system~~ from the
13 **public pension and retirement** funds ~~accruing to that fund~~
14 **administered by the system in accordance with IC 5-10.5-6-5.**
15 (3) Alcohol and tobacco commission from the funds accruing to
16 the alcoholic beverage enforcement and administration fund.
17 (4) Indiana department of transportation, for the costs and

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1 expenses related to a particular toll project, from any special fund
2 established for revenues from that project.

3 (5) State fair commission from the state fair fund.

4 (6) State colleges and universities from state appropriations.
5 However, colleges and universities shall not be charged at a rate
6 higher than that charged to local taxing units under section 3 of
7 this chapter.

8 (7) Eligible federal grants and projects from funds provided by
9 the federal government or as are properly chargeable to the grant
10 or project or recoverable through an indirect cost allocation
11 recovery approved by the federal government.

12 SECTION 2. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012] **(a) This SECTION**
13 **does not apply to public pension or retirement funds managed and**
14 **administered by the Indiana public retirement system established**
15 **by IC 5-10.5-2-1.**

16 **(b) As used in this SECTION, "commission" refers to the**
17 **pension management oversight commission established by**
18 **IC 2-5-12-1.**

19 **(c) As used in this SECTION, "retirement plan of the state or a**
20 **political subdivision" refers to a retirement plan of the state or a**
21 **political subdivision listed in IC 5-10-1.5-1.**

22 **(d) The general assembly urges the legislative council to assign**
23 **the commission the task of studying the following:**

24 **(1) The system under which a retirement plan of the state or**
25 **a political subdivision shall periodically report its operating**
26 **and financial condition to the state and the general assembly.**

27 **(2) The information to be included in the reporting system**
28 **described in subdivision (1).**

29 **(3) The entity or entities to receive and analyze the**
30 **information submitted under the reporting system described**
31 **in subdivision (1).**

32 **(4) The anticipated costs of administering the reporting**
33 **system described in subdivision (1), including a funding**
34 **mechanism to pay the system's administrative costs.**

35 **(e) If the commission is assigned the topic described in**
36 **subsection (d), the commission shall issue to the legislative council**
37 **a final report containing the commission's findings and**
38 **recommendations, including any recommended legislation**
39 **concerning the topic, in an electronic format under IC 5-14-6 not**
40 **later than November 1, 2012.**

41 **(f) This SECTION expires December 31, 2012.**
