MR. SPEAKER:

I move that House Bill 1325 be amended to read as follows:

- 1 Page 4, between lines 16 and 17, begin a new paragraph and insert:
- 2 "SECTION 3. IC 6-2.5-5-45 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
- 3 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
- 4 UPON PASSAGE]: **Sec. 45. (a) This section applies to transactions**
- 5 **occurring during the period:**
- 6 (1) beginning at 12:01 a.m. on the Friday immediately
- 7 preceding the first Saturday in August; and
- 8 (2) ending at 11:59 p.m. on the Sunday immediately following
- 9 the first Saturday in August.
- 10 (b) As used in this section, "clothing" means all human wearing
- 11 apparel for general use, including the following:
- 12 (1) Bathing caps.
- 13 (2) Belts and suspenders.
- 14 (3) Coats and jackets.
- 15 (4) Diapers.
- 16 (5) Dresses.
- 17 (6) Footwear.
- 18 (7) Gloves or mittens.
- 19 (8) Hats or caps.
- 20 (9) Neckties.
- 21 (10) Pants.
- 22 (11) Scarves.
- 23 (12) Shirts.
- 24 (13) Skirts.

- 1 (14) Socks or hosiery.
 2 (15) Undergarments.
 3 (16) Uniforms.
 4 (c) As used in this section, "clothing accessories or equipment"
 5 means incidental items worn on the person or in conjunction with
 6 clothing, including the following:
 7 (1) Briefcases.
 8 (2) Cosmetics.
 9 (3) Hair notions, including the following:
 10 (A) Barrettes.
 11 (B) Hair bows.
 12 (C) Hair nets.
 13 (4) Handbags.
 14 (5) Handkerchiefs.
 15 (6) Jewelry.
 16 (7) Nonprescription sunglasses.
 17 (8) Umbrellas.
 18 (9) Wallets.
 19 (10) Watches.
 20 (11) Wigs and hair pieces.
 21 (d) As used in this section, "school instructional materials"
 22 means written materials commonly used by a student in a course
 23 of study as a reference and to learn the subject being taught. The
 24 term is limited to the following:
 25 (1) Reference books.
 26 (2) Reference maps and globes.
 27 (3) Textbooks.
 28 (4) Workbooks.
 29 (e) As used in this section, "school supplies" means an item
 30 commonly used by a student in a course of study. The term is
 31 limited to the following:
 32 (1) Binders.
 33 (2) Book bags.
 34 (3) Calculators.
 35 (4) Cellophane tape.
 36 (5) Blackboard chalk.
 37 (6) Compasses.
 38 (7) Composition books.
 39 (8) Crayons.
 40 (9) Erasers.
 41 (10) Folders, limited to the following:
 42 (A) Expandable folders.
 43 (B) Pocket folders.
 44 (C) Plastic folders.
 45 (D) Manila folders.
 46 (11) Glue, paste, and paste sticks.
 47 (12) Highlighters.

 23 **(27) Writing tablets.**
 24 **(f) Sales of:**
 25 **(1) clothing;**
 26 **(2) clothing accessories or equipment;**
 27 **(3) school instructional materials; and**
 28 **(4) school supplies;**
 29 **are exempt from the state gross retail tax during the period**
 30 **described in subsection (a), if the sales price of the item purchased**
 31 **does not exceed one hundred dollars (\$100).**
 32 **(g) The department may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to**
 33 **implement this section."**
 34 Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.
