

SENATE BILL No. 335

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 5-10-8-16; IC 27-8-34; IC 27-13-7-21.

Synopsis: Prescription drug costs. Specifies limitations on certain out of pocket costs for prescription drugs under coverage provided by a state employee health plan, a policy of accident and sickness insurance, and a health maintenance organization contract.

Effective: July 1, 2012.

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SENATE BILL No. 335



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning insurance.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 5-10-8-16 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
- 2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
- 3 1, 2012]: **Sec. 16. (a) As used in this section, "covered individual"**
- 4 **means an individual who is covered under a state employee health**
- 5 **plan.**
- 6 **(b) As used in this section, "state employee health plan" means:**
- 7 **(1) a self-insurance program established under section 7(b) of**
- 8 **this chapter; or**
- 9 **(2) a contract with a prepaid health care delivery plan entered**
- 10 **into under section 7(c) of this chapter.**
- 11 **(c) A copayment or coinsurance amount that applies to coverage**
- 12 **of prescription drugs under a state employee health plan may not**
- 13 **exceed the following:**
- 14 **(1) Two hundred dollars (\$200) for a one (1) month supply of**
- 15 **a single prescription drug.**
- 16 **(2) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for a one (1) month supply of**
- 17 **more than one (1) prescription drug.**



1 (d) Out of pocket costs paid by a covered individual for
2 prescription drugs under a state employee health plan must be
3 included in any annual limitation that applies to out of pocket costs
4 generally under the state employee health plan.

5 (e) This section does not require that a state employee health
6 plan must provide coverage for prescription drugs. This section
7 does not apply to a state employee health plan that is a qualified
8 health plan offered through a health insurance exchange under the
9 federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148).

10 (f) This section expires July 1, 2014.

11 SECTION 2. IC 27-8-34 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
12 A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
13 1, 2012]:

14 **Chapter 34. Prescription Drug Costs**

15 **Sec. 1. As used in this chapter, "policy of accident and sickness
16 insurance" has the meaning set forth in IC 27-8-5-1.**

17 **Sec. 2. A copayment or coinsurance amount that applies to
18 coverage of prescription drugs under a policy of accident and
19 sickness insurance may not exceed the following:**

- 20 (1) Two hundred dollars (\$200) for a one (1) month supply of
21 a single prescription drug.
- 22 (2) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for a one (1) month supply of
23 more than one (1) prescription drug.

24 **Sec. 3. Out of pocket costs paid by an insured for prescription
25 drugs under a policy of accident and sickness insurance must be
26 included in any annual limitation that applies to out of pocket costs
27 generally under the policy of accident and sickness insurance.**

28 **Sec. 4. This section does not require that a policy of accident and
29 sickness insurance must provide coverage for prescription drugs.
30 This section does not apply to a policy of accident and sickness
31 insurance that is a qualified health plan offered through a health
32 insurance exchange under the federal Patient Protection and
33 Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148).**

34 **Sec. 5. This chapter expires July 1, 2014.**

35 SECTION 3. IC 27-13-7-21 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
36 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
37 1, 2012]: **Sec. 21. (a) A copayment or coinsurance amount that
38 applies to coverage of prescription drugs under an individual
39 contract or a group contract may not exceed the following:**

- 40 (1) Two hundred dollars (\$200) for a one (1) month supply of
41 a single prescription drug.
- 42 (2) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for a one (1) month supply of

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more than one (1) prescription drug.

(b) Out of pocket costs paid by an enrollee for prescription drugs under an individual contract or a group contract must be included in any annual limitation that applies to out of pocket costs generally under the individual contract or group contract.

(c) This section does not require that an individual contract or a group contract must provide coverage for prescription drugs. This section does not apply to an individual contract or a group contract that is a qualified health plan offered through a health insurance exchange under the federal Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (P.L. 111-148).

(d) This section expires July 1, 2014.

SECTION 4. [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012] (a) IC 5-10-8-16, as added by this act, applies to a state employee health plan that is established, entered into, amended, or renewed after June 30, 2012.

(b) IC 27-8-34, as added by this act, applies to a policy of accident and sickness insurance that is issued, delivered, amended, or renewed after June 30, 2012.

(c) IC 27-13-7-21, as added by this act, applies to an individual contract or a group contract that is entered into, delivered, amended, or renewed after June 30, 2012.

(d) This SECTION expires June 30, 2015.

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
