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# HOUSE BILL No. 1215

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 4-22-2-37.1; IC 10-11-2-33; IC 35-41-1-26.3; IC 35-48-2-4.

**Synopsis:** Synthetic drugs. Permits the superintendent of the Indiana state police department, in consultation with the state board of pharmacy, to adopt an emergency rule declaring a substance to be a dangerous analogue substance if the superintendent finds that the substance: (1) is likely to have a similar effect on a user as a synthetic cannabinoid; and (2) is likely to be at least as dangerous as a synthetic cannabinoid. Provides that a rule declaring a substance to be a dangerous analogue substance becomes effective 30 days after the rule is filed, and that the rule expires on June 30 of the calendar year following the calendar year in which the rule was adopted. Adds a substance determined to be a dangerous analogue substance to the definition of "synthetic cannabinoid".

**Effective:** July 1, 2012.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning criminal law and procedure.

 24 determine the format of the rule and other documents to be submitted

9 expires not later than ninety (90) days after the rule is accepted for

11 (a)(13), (a)(24), (a)(25), or (a)(27), the rule may be extended by  
12 adopting another rule under this section, but only for one (1) extension  
13 period. The extension period for a rule adopted under subsection  
14 (a)(28) may not exceed the period for which the original rule was in  
15 effect. A rule adopted under subsection (a)(13) may be extended for  
16 two (2) extension periods. Subject to subsection (j), a rule adopted  
17 under subsection (a)(24), (a)(25), or (a)(27) may be extended for an  
18 unlimited number of extension periods. Except for a rule adopted under  
19 subsection (a)(13), for a rule adopted under this section to be effective  
20 after one (1) extension period, the rule must be adopted under:
