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## SENATE BILL No. 107

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DIGEST OF SB 107 (Updated January 25, 2012 3:26 pm - DI 87)

**Citations Affected:** IC 36-3; IC 36-4; IC 36-8.

**Synopsis:** Deadline for adoption of salary ordinances. Requires a second or third class city to adopt a salary ordinance not later than November 1 (instead of September 30) for the ensuing budget year. Allows a member of a city fiscal body to waive compensation received for performing duties as a member of the city fiscal body. (Under current law, elected town officers may waive compensation received for performing duties as an elected town officer.)

**Effective:** July 1, 2012.

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## SENATE BILL No. 107

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning local government.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 36-3-6-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
2 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
3 1, 2012]: **Sec. 10. (a) As used in this section, "compensation" means**  
4 **the total of all money paid to a member of the city fiscal body for**  
5 **performing duties as a member of the city fiscal body, regardless**  
6 **of the source of funds from which the money is paid. The term**  
7 **includes all employee benefits paid to a member, including life**  
8 **insurance, health insurance, disability insurance, retirement**  
9 **benefits, and pension benefits.**  
10 (b) A member of the city fiscal body may waive the officer's  
11 compensation for any year by filing a notice that satisfies the  
12 following:  
13 (1) The notice is in writing.  
14 (2) The notice states in substance all of the following:  
15 (A) That the individual is a member of the city fiscal body.  
16 (B) The calendar year covered by the notice.  
17 (C) That the member waives compensation under this

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**section.**

**(D) That the member understands that the notice is irrevocable beginning January 1 of the year covered by the notice.**

**(3) The notice is signed by the member of the city fiscal body who wants to waive compensation.**

**(c) A member of the city fiscal body who wants to waive compensation under this section must file the notice with the city fiscal officer before January 1 of the year covered by the notice.**

**(d) A notice filed under this section is irrevocable beginning January 1 of the year covered by the notice.**

**(e) A member of the city fiscal body who files a notice under this section:**

**(1) is not entitled to compensation for duties performed in the year covered by the notice; and**

**(2) may not be paid compensation for duties performed in the year covered by the notice.**

SECTION 2. IC 36-4-7-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.169-2006, SECTION 54, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012]: Sec. 3. (a) This section does not apply to compensation paid by a city to members of its police and fire departments.

(b) Subject to the approval of the city legislative body, the city executive shall fix the compensation of each appointive officer, deputy, and other employee of the city. The legislative body may reduce but may not increase any compensation fixed by the executive. Compensation must be fixed under this section not later than ~~September 30~~ **November 1** of each year for the ensuing budget year.

(c) Compensation fixed under this section may be increased or decreased by the executive during the budget year for which it is fixed.

(d) Notwithstanding subsection (b), the city clerk may, with the approval of the legislative body, fix the salaries of deputies and employees appointed under IC 36-4-11-4.

SECTION 3. IC 36-4-7-12 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A **NEW SECTION** TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012]: **Sec. 12. (a) As used in this section, "compensation" means the total of all money paid to a member of the city fiscal body for performing duties as a member of the city fiscal body, regardless of the source of funds from which the money is paid. The term includes all employee benefits paid to a member, including life insurance, health insurance, disability insurance, retirement benefits, and pension benefits.**

**(b) A member of the city fiscal body may waive the officer's**

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1 compensation for any year by filing a notice that satisfies the  
2 following:

- 3 (1) The notice is in writing.

14 (c) A member of the city fiscal body who wants to waive

16 fiscal officer before January 1 of the year covered by the notice.

17 (d) A notice filed under this section is irrevocable beginning  
18 January 1 of the year covered by the notice.

19 (e) A member of the city fiscal body who files a notice under this  
20 section:

- 21 (1) is not entitled to compensation for duties performed in the
- 22 year covered by the notice; and
- 23 (2) may not be paid compensation for duties performed in the
- 24 year covered by the notice.

25 SECTION 4. IC 36-8-3-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.33-2010,  
26 SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
27 JULY 1, 2012]: Sec. 3. (a) A majority of the members of the safety  
28 board constitutes a quorum. The board shall adopt rules concerning the  
29 time of holding regular and special meetings and of giving notice of  
30 them. The board shall elect one (1) of its members chairman, who  
31 holds the position as long as prescribed by the rules of the board. The  
32 board shall record all of its proceedings.

33 (b) The members of the safety board may act only as a board. No  
34 member may bind the board or the city except by resolution entered in  
35 the records of the board authorizing the member to act in its behalf as  
36 its authorized agent.

- 37 (c) The safety board shall appoint:
  - 38 (1) the members and other employees of the police department
  - 39 other than those in an upper level policymaking position;
  - 40 (2) the members and other employees of the fire department other
  - 41 than those in an upper level policymaking position;
  - 42 (3) a market master; and

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1           (4) other officials that are necessary for public safety purposes.  
2           (d) The annual compensation of all members of the police and fire  
3 departments and other appointees shall be fixed by ordinance of the  
4 legislative body not later than ~~September 30~~ **November 1** of each year  
5 for the ensuing budget year. The ordinance may grade the members of  
6 the departments and regulate their pay by rank as well as by length of  
7 service. If the legislative body fails to adopt an ordinance fixing the  
8 compensation of members of the police or fire department, the safety  
9 board may fix their compensation, subject to change by ordinance.  
10          (e) The safety board, subject to ordinance, may also fix the number  
11 of members of the police and fire departments and the number of  
12 appointees for other purposes and may, subject to law, adopt rules for  
13 the appointment of members of the departments and for their  
14 government.  
15          (f) The safety board shall divide the city into police precincts and  
16 fire districts.  
17          (g) The police chief has exclusive control of the police department,  
18 and the fire chief has exclusive control of the fire department, subject  
19 to the rules and orders of the safety board. In time of emergency, the  
20 police chief and the fire chief are, for the time being, subordinate to the  
21 city executive and shall obey the city executive's orders and directions,  
22 notwithstanding any law or rule to the contrary.

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## COMMITTEE REPORT

Madam President: The Senate Committee on Local Government, to which was referred Senate Bill No. 107, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the Senate with the recommendation that said bill be AMENDED as follows:

Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new paragraph and insert:

"SECTION 1. IC 36-3-6-10 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012]: **Sec. 10. (a) As used in this section, "compensation" means the total of all money paid to a member of the city fiscal body for performing duties as a member of the city fiscal body, regardless of the source of funds from which the money is paid. Page 1, between lines 15 and 16, begin a new paragraph and insert:

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"SECTION 3. IC 36-4-7-12 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2012]: **Sec. 12. (a) As used in this section, "compensation" means the total of all money paid to a member of the city fiscal body for performing duties as a member of the city fiscal body, regardless of the source of funds from which the money is paid. The term includes all employee benefits paid to a member, including life insurance, health insurance, disability insurance, retirement benefits, and pension benefits.**

**(b) A member of the city fiscal body may waive the officer's compensation for any year by filing a notice that satisfies the following:**

- (1) The notice is in writing.**
- (2) The notice states in substance all of the following:**
  - (A) That the individual is a member of the city fiscal body.**
  - (B) The calendar year covered by the notice.**
  - (C) That the member waives compensation under this section.**
  - (D) That the member understands that the notice is irrevocable beginning January 1 of the year covered by the notice.**
- (3) The notice is signed by the member of the city fiscal body who wants to waive compensation.**
