DIGEST OF SB 537 (Updated March 13, 2013 1:39 pm - DI 96)

Synopsis: Secretary of state, dealer services, and vehicles. Establishes a dealer services division (division) within the office of the secretary of state (secretary), and provides that the division administers and has jurisdiction over vehicle dealer (dealer) services (services). Establishes procedures: (1) for administration of the division; and (2) for judicial action concerning the division. Requires the secretary of state to adopt emergency rules before January 1, 2014, to carry out the secretary of state's duties. Requires the secretary of state to adopt rules before July 1, 2014, to replace the emergency rules. Provides that a person who violates statutes or rules pertaining to services or an order issued by the secretary pertaining to services is subject to a civil penalty of up to \$10,000 for each violation. Establishes the dealer enforcement account to be used to support the division. Provides for criminal penalties for certain violations pertaining to services. Provides for criminal penalties for certain actions relating to unfair practices committed by persons subject to licensing by the division. Establishes the motor vehicle sales

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advisory board. Includes a transfer dealer as a dealer. Repeals and relocates language concerning dealer services and adds language concerning the requirements for a license for a wholesale dealer. Adds a dealer-wholesale license plate and a fee for the license plate. Provides that an auto auctioneer is a person providing a place of business or facilities for the purchase and sale of more than three motor vehicles a year. (Under current law the threshold is one motor vehicle a year.) Provides that the 30 business day period for purposes of determining whether a reasonable number of attempts have been made to correct a nonconformity in the sale of certain motor vehicles is extended by any period during which repair services are unavailable due to civil unrest, fire, a natural disaster, a terrorist attack, an act of God, or war. (Current law extends the period only when repair services are unavailable due to a strike.) Provides that a dealer who fails to deliver a certificate of title within a certain time frame is subject to certain civil penalties for violations that occur within a calendar year. Requires a dealer to make payment to a third party to satisfy any obligation secured by the vehicle within 10 days after the date of sale. (Current law requires that the payment be made within five days of sale.) Makes it a Class D felony for a disposal facility, a scrap metal processor, or an agent of a disposal facility or scrap metal processor to knowingly, intentionally, or recklessly buy a motor vehicle that is less than 15 model years old without a certificate of title for the motor vehicle. Makes it a Class A misdemeanor for a dealer who sells, exchanges, or transfers a rebuilt vehicle without disclosing in writing to the purchaser, customer, or transferee, before consummating the sale, exchange, or transfer, the fact that the vehicle is a rebuilt vehicle, if the dealer knows or should reasonably know the vehicle is a rebuilt vehicle. Permits the secretary to commence a proceeding to administratively dissolve a corporation if the secretary receives credible evidence that the corporation is engaged in illegal activity or activity not authorized by the corporation's articles of incorporation. Repeals provisions superseded by this bill. Makes conforming amendments and technical corrections. Makes an appropriation.

 3 term includes an auctioneer who, as part of the business of the
 4 auctioneer, participates in providing a place of business or facilities

 6 persons acting for themselves or others. The term does not include
 7 a person acting only as an auctioneer under IC 25-6.1-1.

8 **Sec. 5. "Automotive salvage rebuilder" means a person, firm,**

- 17 **purpose of reducing the capitalized cost and does not include any**

- 20 **Sec. 9. "Charge back" means a manufacturer induced return of**
- 21 **incentive payments to a manufacturer by a dealer. The term**
- 22 **includes a manufacturer drawing funds from an account of a**

- 24 **Sec. 10. "Director" refers to the director of the dealer services**
- 25 **division within the office of the secretary of state who is appointed**
- 26 **under IC 4-5-1-12(b).**
- 27 **Sec. 11. "Division" refers to the dealer services division within**
- 28 **the office of the secretary of state established by IC 4-5-1-12(a).**
- 29 **Sec. 12. "Existing franchise" means the franchise in effect on the**
- 30 **date of a franchisee's death or incapacity.**
- 31 **Sec. 13. "Franchise" means an oral or a written agreement for**
- 32 **a definite or an indefinite period in which a manufacturer or**
- 33 **distributor grants to a dealer a right to use a trade name, trade or**
- 34 **service mark, or related characteristic, and in which there is a**
- 35 **community of interest in the marketing of motor vehicles or related**
- 36 **services at retail or otherwise.**
- 37 **Sec. 14. "Franchisee" means a dealer to whom a franchise is**
- 38 **granted.**
- 39 **Sec. 15. "Franchisor" means a manufacturer or distributor who**
- 40 **grants a franchise to a dealer.**
- 41 **Sec. 16. "Labor rate" means the hourly labor rate charged by**
- 42 **a franchisee for service, filed periodically with the division as the**

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1 division may require, and posted prominently in the franchisee's

4 into in Indiana for the transfer from a retail lessor to a retail lessee

- 14 **(c) A vehicle dealer who fails to deliver a certificate of title**
- 15 **within the time specified under this section is subject to the**
- 16 **following civil penalties:**
- 17 **(1) One hundred dollars (\$100) for the first violation in a**
- 18 **calendar year.**
- 19 **(2) Two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) for the second violation**
- 20 **in a calendar year.**
- 21 **(3) Five hundred dollars (\$500) for all subsequent violations**
- 22 **in a calendar year.**
- 23 **Payment shall be made to the secretary of state and deposited in**
- 24 **the dealer enforcement account established under IC 9-32-7-2.**
- 25 **(d) If a purchaser or transferee does not receive a valid**
- 26 **certificate of title within the time specified by this section, the**
- 27 **purchaser or transferee has the right to return the vehicle to the**
- 28 **vehicle dealer ten (10) days after giving the vehicle dealer written**
- 29 **notice demanding delivery of a valid certificate of title and the**
- 30 **dealer's failure to deliver a valid certificate of title within that ten**
- 31 **(10) day period. Upon return of the vehicle to the dealer in the**
- 32 **same or similar condition as delivered to the purchaser or**
- 33 **transferee under this section, the vehicle dealer shall pay to the**
- 34 **purchaser or transferee the purchase price plus sales taxes, finance**
- 35 **expenses, insurance expenses, and any other amount paid to the**
- 36 **dealer by the purchaser or transferee.**
- 37 **(e) For purposes of this subsection, "timely deliver", with**
- 38 **respect to a third party, means to deliver to the purchaser or**
- 39 **transferee with a postmark dated or hand delivered not more than**
- 40 **ten (10) business days after there is no obligation secured by the**
- 41 **vehicle. If the dealer's inability to timely deliver a valid certificate**
- 42 **of title results from the acts or omissions of a third party who has**

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1 failed to timely deliver a valid certificate of title to the dealer, the
2 dealer is entitled to claim against the third party one hundred
3 dollars (\$100). If:

4 (1) the dealer's inability to timely deliver a valid certificate of

10 the dealer is entitled to claim against the third party all damages
11 sustained by the dealer in rescinding the dealer's sale with the
12 purchaser or transferee, including the dealer's reasonable
13 attorney's fees.

14 (f) If a vehicle for which a certificate of title has been issued by
15 another state is sold or delivered, the person selling or delivering
16 the vehicle shall deliver to the purchaser or receiver of the vehicle
17 a proper certificate of title with an assignment of the certificate of
18 title in a form prescribed by the bureau.

19 (g) The original certificate of title and all assignments and
20 subsequent reissues of the certificate of title shall be retained by
21 the bureau and appropriately classified and indexed in the most
22 convenient manner to trace the title to the vehicle described in the
23 certificate of title.

24 (h) A dealer shall make payment to a third party to satisfy any
25 obligation secured by the vehicle within ten (10) days after the date
26 of sale.

27 Sec. 2. The affidavit required by section 1(a)(5)(C) of this

NOTICE TO THE CUSTOMER

If you do not receive a valid certificate of title within twenty-one (21) days after the date of sale, you have the right to return the vehicle to the vehicle dealer ten (10) days after giving the vehicle dealer written notice demanding delivery of a valid certificate of title and after the vehicle dealer's failure to deliver a valid certificate of title within that ten (10) day period. Upon return of the vehicle to the vehicle dealer in the same or similar condition as when it was delivered to you, the vehicle dealer shall pay you the purchase price plus sales taxes, finance expenses, insurance expenses, and any other amount that you paid to the vehicle dealer. If a lien is present on the previous owner's certificate of title, it is the responsibility of the third party lienholder to timely deliver the certificate of title in the third party's possession to the dealer not more than ten (10) business days after there is no obligation secured by the vehicle. If the dealer's inability to deliver a valid certificate of title to you within the above-described ten (10) day period results from the acts or omissions of a third party who has failed to timely deliver the certificate of title in the third party's possession to the dealer, the dealer may be entitled to claim against the third party the damages allowed by law.

Chapter 5. Manufacturers, Converter Manufacturers, and Dealers; Manufacturers' Certificates of Origin

Sec. 1. This chapter does not apply to an off-road vehicle.
Sec. 2. A manufacturer, a converter manufacturer, an automotive mobility dealer, a dealer, or other person may not sell or otherwise dispose of a new motor vehicle to another person, to be used by the other person for purposes of display or resale, without delivering to the other person a manufacturer's certificate of origin under this chapter that indicates the assignments of the certificate of origin necessary to show the ownership of the title to a person who purchases the motor vehicle.

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1 **Sec. 3. A person may not purchase or acquire a new motor**
 2 **vehicle without obtaining a valid manufacturer's certificate of**
 3 **origin from the seller of the motor vehicle.**

4 **Sec. 4. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b), certificates of**
 5 **origin and assignments of certificates of origin must be in a form:**

- 6 (1) prescribed by the bureau; or
 7 (2) approved by the bureau.

8 **(b) A manufacturer's certificate of origin for a low speed vehicle**
 9 **must indicate that the motor vehicle is a low speed vehicle.**

10 **Sec. 5. A manufacturer, a converter manufacturer, an**

- 12 (1) a certificate of title;
 13 (2) an assigned certificate of title;
 14 (3) a manufacturer's certificate of origin;
 15 (4) an assigned manufacturer's certificate of origin; or

 17 as determined by the secretary;

18 **for a motor vehicle, semitrailer, or recreational vehicle in the**
 19 **manufacturer's, converter manufacturer's, automotive mobility**
 20 **dealer's, or dealer's possession.**

21 **Sec. 6. (a) If a dealer purchases or acquires ownership of a:**

- 22 (1) motor vehicle;
 23 (2) semitrailer; or
 24 (3) recreational vehicle;

25 **in a state that does not have a certificate of title law, the dealer**
 26 **shall apply for an Indiana certificate of title for the motor vehicle,**
 27 **semitrailer, or recreational vehicle not more than thirty-one (31)**
 28 **days after the date of purchase or the date ownership of the motor**
 29 **vehicle, semitrailer, or recreational vehicle was acquired.**

30 **(b) The bureau shall collect a delinquent title fee as provided in**

 36 classification. The secretary shall establish the classifications of
 37 antique car museum dealer license plates and dealer promotional
 38 license plates.

39 **Sec. 3. (a)** The secretary shall:

40 (1) issue a research and development license plate under this
 41 chapter to a manufacturer of a vehicle subcomponent system;
 42 and

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1 (2) adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to prescribe the general
2 conditions for the:
3 (A) application;
4 (B) issuance; and
5 (C) use;
6 of research and development license plates for manufacturers of
7 vehicle component systems.
8 (b) The fee for a research and development license plate for a
9 manufacturer of a vehicle subcomponent system is the fee under
10 IC 9-29-17-2.
11 (c) A research and development license plate for a manufacturer
12 of a vehicle subcomponent system shall be displayed in accordance
13 with subsection (a)(2).
14 Sec. 4. The secretary shall determine the color, dimension, and
15 style of the letters and the information required on a dealer license
16 plate issued under this chapter.
17 Sec. 5. Upon payment of the fee under IC 9-29-17-1(b), an
18 applicant may obtain additional dealer license plates of the same
19 category. The applicant must demonstrate the applicant's need for
20 additional plates by stating the applicant's number of employees,
21 annual sales, and other supporting factors. The secretary shall
22 determine whether the applicant is entitled to additional plates.
23 Sec. 6. Dealer license plates issued to licensed dealers under this
24 chapter expire as follows:
25 (1) A person whose business name begins with the letters A
26 through B, inclusive, March 1 of each year.
27 (2) A person whose business name begins with the letters C
28 through D, inclusive, April 1 of each year.
29 (3) A person whose business name begins with the letters E
30 through G, inclusive, May 1 of each year.
31 (4) A person whose business name begins with the letters H
32 through I, inclusive, June 1 of each year.
33 (5) A person whose business name begins with the letters J
34 through L, inclusive, July 1 of each year.
35 (6) A person whose business name begins with the letters M

38 through R, inclusive, September 1 of each year.
39 (8) A person whose business name begins with the letters S

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1 Dealer license plates issued to a sole proprietor expire based upon

3 Sec. 7. (a) Except as provided in sections 8 and 9 of this chapter,
4 dealer-new, dealer-used, manufacturer, and wholesale license
5 plates may be used only on motor vehicles in the:

- 6 (1) dealer's inventory being held for sale;
7 (2) usual operation of the manufacturer's or dealer's business;
8 (3) movement of the manufacturer's or dealer's inventory; or
9 (4) inventory of a manufacturer or dealer that is unattended
10 by the manufacturer or dealer or the dealer's agent for a
11 maximum of ten (10) days by a prospective buyer or a service
12 customer.

13 (b) The license plates referenced in subsection (a) must be:

- 14 (1) primarily used or stored at an address within Indiana; or
15 (2) displayed on a vehicle being transported for purposes of
16 sale by a licensed Indiana dealer.

17 Sec. 8. Dealer-new, dealer-used, manufacturer, and wholesale
18 license plates may be used without restriction by a manufacturer,
19 a dealer, or an employee of a manufacturer or a dealer in
20 compliance with rules adopted by the secretary to prohibit use of
21 the plates solely to avoid payment of applicable taxes.

22 Sec. 9. Dealer-new, dealer-used, manufacturer, and wholesale
23 license plates may be used without restriction by a designee of a
24 dealer or a designee of a manufacturer under rules adopted by the
25 secretary. The rules must provide the following:

- 26 (1) The dealer or manufacturer is to be assessed and pay the
27 motor vehicle excise tax under IC 6-6-5 attributable to that
28 part of the total year that the designee operates the motor
29 vehicle.
30 (2) The dealer or manufacturer shall report to the secretary
31 the date of assignment to a designee, the designee's name and
32 address, and the date of termination of the assignment within

35 thirty (30) days after the termination of the assignment to the
36 designee or at the time the dealer or manufacturer purchases
37 license plates under this chapter.

38 Sec. 10. Dealer-new, dealer-used, manufacturer, and wholesale
39 license plates may not be used on a vehicle that:

41 (2) has a fee charged by dealers to others for the use of the
42 vehicle.



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1 **Sec. 11. (a)** The secretary may issue an interim license plate to
 2 a dealer or manufacturer who is licensed and has been issued a
 3 license plate under section 2 of this chapter.

4 **(b)** The secretary shall prescribe the form of an interim license
 5 plate issued under this section. However, an interim license plate
 6 must bear the assigned registration number and provide sufficient
 7 space for the expiration date as provided in subsection (c).

24 **(2)** in a location on the left side of a window facing the rear of
 25 the motor vehicle that is clearly visible and unobstructed. The
 26 plate must be affixed to the window of the motor vehicle.

27 **(g)** The dealer must provide an ownership document to the
 28 purchaser at the time of issuance of the interim license plate that
 29 must be kept in the motor vehicle during the period an interim

31 **(h)** All interim license plates not issued by the dealer must be
 32 retained in the possession of the dealer at all times.

33 **Sec. 12.** A dealer may not knowingly or intentionally issue an
 34 altered interim license plate or an interim license plate with false
 35 or fictitious information.

36 **Sec. 13.** A person may not knowingly or intentionally operate a
 37 vehicle displaying an altered interim license plate issued under
 38 section 11 of this chapter.

39 **Sec. 14.** A record directly related to the use of interim license
 40 plates by a dealer must be made available to an investigating
 41 employee of the secretary upon demand at the place of business of
 42 the dealer.



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1 **Chapter 7. Accounts and Distribution of License and Permit**
 2 **Fees Under IC 9-32-11**

3 **Sec. 1. (a) The dealer compliance account is established as a**
 4 **separate account to be administered by the secretary. The funds in**
 5 **the account must be available, with the approval of the budget**
 6 **agency, for use in enforcing and administering this article.**

7 **(b) The expenses of administering this article shall be paid from**
 8 **money in the account.**

9 **(c) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the dealer**
 10 **compliance account not currently needed to meet the obligations**
 11 **of the account in the same manner as other public money may be**
 12 **invested. Interest that accrues from these investments shall be**
 13 **deposited in the account.**

14 **(d) The dealer compliance account consists of the following:**

15 **(1) Money deposited under:**

16 **(A) IC 9-29-17-14(b);**

17 **(B) IC 9-29-17-14(c); and**

18 **(C) section 3(1) of this chapter.**

19 **(2) Appropriations to the account from other sources.**

20 **(3) Grants, gifts, donations, or transfers intended for deposit**
 21 **in the account.**

22 **(4) Interest that accrues from money in the account.**

23 **(e) Money in the dealer compliance account at the end of a state**
 24 **fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund.**

25 **(f) Money in the dealer compliance account is continuously**
 26 **appropriated to the secretary for the purposes of the account.**

27 **Sec. 2. (a) The dealer enforcement account is established as a**
 28 **separate account to be administered by the secretary.**

29 **(b) The dealer enforcement account consists of money deposited**
 30 **pursuant to:**

31 **(1) IC 9-32-4-1(c);**

32 **(2) IC 9-32-16-1(f);**

33 **(3) IC 9-32-16-13(d);**

34 **(4) IC 9-32-17-7; and**

35 **(5) IC 9-32-17-9.**

36 **The funds in the account shall be available, with the approval of**
 37 **the budget agency, for use to augment and supplement the funds**
 38 **appropriated for the administration of this article.**

39 **(c) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the dealer**
 40 **enforcement account not currently needed to meet the obligations**
 41 **of the account in the same manner as other public money may be**
 42 **invested. Interest that accrues from these investments shall be**

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deposited into the account.

(d) Money in the dealer enforcement account at the end of the state fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund.

(e) Money in the dealer enforcement account is continuously appropriated to the secretary for the purposes of the account.

Sec. 3. All money collected by the secretary from manufacturers, factory branches, distributors, dealers, automobile auctioneers, factory representatives, distributor representatives, wholesale dealers, transfer dealers, converter manufacturers, or automotive mobility dealers for licenses and permit fees under IC 9-29-17-8 through IC 9-29-17-13 shall be deposited as follows:

- (1) Thirty percent (30%) to the dealer compliance account established by section 1 of this chapter.
- (2) Forty percent (40%) to the motor vehicle highway account under IC 8-14-1.
- (3) Twenty percent (20%) to the state police department, and this amount is continuously appropriated to the department for its use in enforcing odometer laws.
- (4) Ten percent (10%) to the attorney general, and this amount is continuously appropriated to the attorney general for use in enforcing odometer laws.

Chapter 8. Boat Dealers

Sec. 1. Boat dealers are classified for the purposes of this chapter and IC 9-29-17-5 into two (2) categories as follows:

- (1) Class A dealers having more than one (1) business location for the sale of boats.
- (2) Class B dealers having only one (1) business location for the sale of boats.

Sec. 2. A person must be licensed under this chapter before the person may engage in the business of selling boats.

Sec. 3. (a) An application for a boat dealer license must meet all the following conditions:

- (1) Be accompanied by the fee under IC 9-29-17-5.
- (2) Be on a form prescribed by the secretary.
- (3) Contain any information that the secretary reasonably needs to enable the secretary to determine fully the:
 - (A) qualifications and eligibility of the applicant to receive the license;
 - (B) location of each of the applicant's places of business in Indiana; and
 - (C) ability of the applicant to conduct properly the business for which the application is submitted.

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1 **(b) An application for a license as a boat dealer must show**
 2 **whether the applicant proposes to sell new or used boats or both**
 3 **new and used boats.**

4 **Sec. 4. A license issued to a boat dealer must specify the location**
 5 **of each place of business and shall be conspicuously displayed at**
 6 **each business location. If a business name or location is changed,**
 7 **the licensee shall notify the secretary within ten (10) days and**
 8 **remit the fee specified under IC 9-29-17-6(a). The secretary shall**
 9 **endorse that change on the boat dealer license if it is determined**
 10 **that the change is not subject to other provisions of this chapter.**

11 **Sec. 5. A boat dealer license issued under this chapter is valid**
 12 **for one (1) year after the date the boat dealer license is issued. All**
 13 **license fees shall be paid at the annual rate under IC 9-29-17-5.**

14 **Sec. 6. (a) A person licensed under this chapter shall furnish**
 15 **evidence that the person currently has liability insurance covering**
 16 **the person's place of business. The policy must have limits of not**
 17 **less than the following:**

18 **(1) One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for bodily injury**
 19 **to one (1) person.**

20 **(2) Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) per accident.**

21 **(3) Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for property damage.**

22 **(b) The minimum amounts must be maintained during the time**
 23 **the license is valid.**

24 **Chapter 9. Licensing of Vehicle Salvaging**

25 **Sec. 1. A disposal facility, a used parts dealer, or an automotive**
 26 **salvage rebuilder must be licensed by the secretary under this**
 27 **chapter before the facility, dealer, or rebuilder may do any of the**
 28 **following:**

29 **(1) Sell a used major component part of a vehicle.**

30 **(2) Wreck or dismantle a vehicle for resale of the major**
 31 **component parts of the vehicle.**

32 **(3) Rebuild a wrecked or dismantled vehicle.**

33 **(4) Possess more than two (2) inoperable vehicles subject to**
 34 **registration for more than thirty (30) days unless the facility,**
 35 **dealer, or rebuilder holds a mechanic's lien on each vehicle**
 36 **over the quantity of two (2).**

37 **(5) Engage in the business of storing, disposing, salvaging, or**
 38 **recycling of vehicles, vehicle hulks, or parts of vehicles.**

39 **Sec. 2. A disposal facility, a used parts dealer, or an automotive**
 40 **salvage rebuilder licensed in Indiana must have a principal place**
 41 **of business in Indiana conducting the business that is the basis for**
 42 **the license. A place of business that performs only ministerial tasks**



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1 is not considered to be conducting business.
 2 **Sec. 3. To apply for a license under this chapter, a disposal**
 3 **facility, a used parts dealer, or an automotive salvage rebuilder**
 4 **must submit the following to the secretary:**
 5 (1) A completed application, which must be verified by the
 6 secretary.
 7 (2) The licensing fee under IC 9-29-17-7.
 8 **Sec. 4. The secretary shall prescribe an application form to be**
 9 **used by persons applying for a license under this chapter. The**
 10 **application must include the following information:**
 11 (1) The applicant's name.
 12 (2) The applicant's type of business organization and the
 13 following as appropriate:
 14 (A) If the applicant is a corporation, the name and address
 15 of each officer and director of the corporation.
 16 (B) If the applicant is a sole proprietorship, the name and
 17 address of the sole proprietor.
 18 (C) If the applicant is a partnership, the name and address
 19 of each partner.
 20 (D) If the applicant is an unincorporated association or
 21 similar form of business organization, the name and
 22 address of each member, trustee, or manager.
 23 (3) The applicant's principal place of business.
 24 (4) The types of activities specified in section 1 of this chapter
 25 that the applicant proposes to conduct.
 26 **Sec. 5. Each license under this chapter, except an initial license,**
 27 **shall be issued for a twelve (12) month period beginning March 1**
 28 **and expiring the last day of February of each year. An initial**
 29 **license may be issued for a period of less than twelve (12) months,**
 30 **but the license must expire on the last day of February immediately**
 31 **following the date the license is issued.**
 32 **Sec. 6. Within a reasonable time, the secretary shall do the**
 33 **following:**
 34 (1) Review all license applications submitted under this
 35 chapter.
 36 (2) Approve a submitted license application unless any of the
 37 following apply:
 38 (A) The application does not conform with this chapter.
 39 (B) The applicant has made a material fact
 40 misrepresentation on the application.
 41 (C) The applicant has been convicted of committing a
 42 fraudulent act in connection with one (1) of the activities

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specified in section 1 of this chapter.

Sec. 7. A person denied a license under section 6 of this chapter is entitled to a hearing under IC 9-32-16.

Sec. 8. If the secretary approves a license application under this chapter, the secretary shall grant the applicant:

- (1) an initial license for the applicant's principal place of business; and
- (2) a supplemental license for each other place of business listed on the application.

Sec. 9. The secretary shall prescribe the form of the licenses granted under section 8 of this chapter. A license granted under section 8 of this chapter must include the following information:

- (1) The licensee's name.
- (2) The licensee's type of business organization and the following as appropriate:
 - (A) If a corporation, the name and address of each officer.
 - (B) If a sole proprietorship, the name and address of the proprietor.
 - (C) If a partnership, the name and address of each managing partner.
 - (D) If an unincorporated association or similar form of business organization, the name and address of the manager or other chief administrative official.
- (3) The licensee's principal place of business.
- (4) A listing of the types of business activities specified in section 1 of this chapter that the licensee may conduct.
- (5) The date the license expires.

Sec. 10. A licensee shall post a license granted to the licensee under this chapter in a conspicuous place at the licensed place of business.

Sec. 11. If the secretary receives a written complaint from a local zoning body that a disposal facility or automotive salvage rebuilder, subject to this chapter, is operating in violation of a local zoning ordinance, the secretary shall delay the issuance or renewal of the facility's or rebuilder's license under this chapter until the local zoning complaints have been satisfied.

Chapter 10. Motor Vehicle Sales Advisory Board

Sec. 1. The motor vehicle sales advisory board is established to advise the secretary in the administration of this article.

Sec. 2. (a) The advisory board is composed of the secretary and eleven (11) persons appointed by the governor upon the recommendation of the secretary as follows:

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- 1 **(1) Two (2) of the appointed members must be franchised new**
- 2 **motor vehicle dealers as follows:**
- 3 **(A) One (1) member must have sold fewer than seven**
- 4 **hundred fifty (750) new motor vehicles in the year before**
- 5 **the member's appointment.**
- 6 **(B) One (1) member must have sold more than seven**
- 7 **hundred forty-nine (749) new motor vehicles in the year**
- 8 **before the member's appointment.**
- 9 **(2) Two (2) of the appointed members must represent the**
- 10 **automobile manufacturing industry, and each must have been**
- 11 **an Indiana resident for at least two (2) years immediately**
- 12 **preceding the member's appointment.**
- 13 **(3) Two (2) of the appointed members must represent the**
- 14 **general public and may not have any direct interest in the**
- 15 **manufacture or sale of motor vehicles.**
- 16 **(4) One (1) member must represent used motor vehicle**
- 17 **dealers that are not franchised new motor vehicle dealers.**
- 18 **(5) One (1) member must represent used motor vehicle**
- 19 **auctioneers.**
- 20 **(6) One (1) member must represent the automobile salvage**
- 21 **and recycling industry.**
- 22 **(7) One (1) member must represent boat dealers.**
- 23 **(8) One (1) member must represent the recreational vehicle**
- 24 **industry.**
- 25 **(b) Not more than six (6) members of the advisory board may be**
- 26 **of the same political party.**
- 27 **Sec. 3. (a) A member appointed to the advisory board under**
- 28 **section 2 of this chapter serves a three (3) year term. A person may**
- 29 **not serve more than two (2) consecutive full terms. Each appointed**
- 30 **member serves until the member's successor is appointed and**
- 31 **qualified.**
- 32 **(b) A member may be removed for good cause.**
- 33 **(c) A vacancy shall be filled by appointment of the governor for**
- 34 **the unexpired term.**
- 35 **Sec. 4. Members of the advisory board are entitled to receive the**
- 36 **expenses and per diem allowed by law. Membership on the**
- 37 **advisory board does not constitute the holding of a public office.**
- 38 **Sec. 5. The secretary shall serve as chairperson of the advisory**
- 39 **board. The advisory board shall elect a vice chairperson and**
- 40 **secretary from the appointed members during the first month of**
- 41 **each year. The vice chairperson and secretary serve until their**
- 42 **successors are appointed and qualified and may be removed for**

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good cause.

Sec. 6. The advisory board shall meet at least one (1) time during a calendar year. Additional meetings may be convened at the call of the secretary or the written request of any three (3) members.

Sec. 7. Seven (7) members of the advisory board constitute a quorum for doing business. The majority vote of the members of the quorum, present and voting, is required for the passage of a matter put to a vote of the advisory board.

Sec. 8. The advisory board is vested with the following powers:

- (1) To consult with and advise the secretary.**
- (2) To suggest rules, including the following:**
 - (A) The contents of forms.**
 - (B) Methods and procedures for the investigation and evaluation of the qualifications of applicants for licenses.**
 - (C) The criteria upon which to issue, deny, suspend, and revoke licenses.**
 - (D) Procedures for the investigation into and conduct of hearings on unfair practices.**

Chapter 11. Regulation of Vehicle Merchandising

Sec. 1. (a) The following persons must be licensed under this article to engage in the business of buying or selling motor vehicles or semitrailers:

- (1) An automobile auctioneer.**
- (2) A converter manufacturer.**
- (3) A dealer.**
- (4) A distributor.**
- (5) A distributor representative.**
- (6) A factory branch.**
- (7) A factory representative.**
- (8) A manufacturer.**
- (9) A transfer dealer.**
- (10) A wholesale dealer.**
- (11) An automotive mobility dealer.**

(b) An automotive mobility dealer who engages in the business of:

- (1) selling, installing, or servicing;**
- (2) offering to sell, install, or service; or**
- (3) soliciting or advertising the sale, installation, or servicing of;**

equipment or modifications specifically designed to facilitate use or operation of a vehicle by an individual who is disabled or aged

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1 must be licensed under this article.

2 **Sec. 2. (a) An application for a license under this chapter must:**

3 **(1) be accompanied by payment of the applicable fee required**
4 **under IC 9-29-17;**

5 **(2) be on a form prescribed by the secretary;**

6 **(3) contain the information the secretary considers necessary**
7 **to enable the secretary to determine fully:**

8 **(A) the qualifications and eligibility of the applicant to**
9 **receive the license;**

10 **(B) the location of each of the applicant's places of business**
11 **in Indiana; and**

12 **(C) the ability of the applicant to conduct properly the**
13 **business for which the application is submitted; and**

14 **(4) contain evidence of a bond required in subsection (e).**

15 **An application for a wholesale dealer license must contain the**
16 **additional information required in section 3 of this chapter.**

17 **(b) An application for a license as a dealer must show whether**
18 **the applicant proposes to sell new or used motor vehicles, or both.**

19 **(c) An applicant who proposes to use the Internet or another**
20 **computer network to facilitate the sale of motor vehicles to**
21 **consumers in Indiana shall, if the applicant's activities may result**
22 **in the creation of business records outside Indiana, provide the**
23 **division with the name, address, and telephone number of the**
24 **person who has control of those business records. The secretary**
25 **may not issue a license to a dealer who transacts business in this**
26 **manner and does not have an established place of business in**
27 **Indiana, except as proved under section 11(h) of this chapter.**

28 **(d) The application must include an affidavit from:**

29 **(1) the person charged with enforcing a zoning ordinance, if**
30 **one exists; or**

31 **(2) the zoning enforcement officer under IC 36-7-4, if one**
32 **exists;**

33 **who has jurisdiction over the real property where the applicant**
34 **wants to operate as a dealer. The affidavit must state that the**
35 **proposed location is zoned for the operation of a dealer's**
36 **establishment. The applicant may file the affidavit at any time after**
37 **the filing of the application. However, the secretary may not issue**
38 **a license until the applicant files the affidavit.**

39 **(e) Except as provided in subsection (g), a licensee shall**
40 **maintain a bond satisfactory to the secretary in the amount of**
41 **twenty-five thousand dollars (\$25,000). The bond must:**

42 **(1) be in favor of the state; and**

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- 1 (2) secure payment of fines, penalties, costs, and fees assessed
- 2 by the secretary after:
- 3 (A) notice;
- 4 (B) opportunity for a hearing; and
- 5 (C) opportunity for judicial review;
- 6 in addition to securing the payment of damages to a person
- 7 aggrieved by a violation of this chapter by the licensee after
- 8 a judgment has been issued.
- 9 (f) Service under this chapter shall be made in accordance with
- 10 the Indiana Rules of Trial Procedure.
- 11 (g) Instead of meeting the requirement in subsection (e), a
- 12 licensee may submit to the secretary evidence that the licensee is a
- 13 member of a risk retention group that is regulated by the Indiana
- 14 department of insurance.
- 15 Sec. 3. In addition to the requirements of section 2 of this
- 16 chapter, a license application for a wholesale dealer must contain
- 17 the following:
- 18 (1) A copy of a written lease that has a term of not less than
- 19 one (1) year, if the established place of business is not owned
- 20 by the applicant.
- 21 (2) If the application is the initial application, photographs of
- 22 the established place of business. The photographs must
- 23 include but are not limited to the:
- 24 (A) major exterior advertising sign; and
- 25 (B) display and office building.
- 26 Sec. 4. A wholesale dealer that has been issued a license under
- 27 this chapter must maintain the following standards for the license
- 28 to remain valid:
- 29 (1) A conspicuous permanent sign with letters at least six (6)
- 30 inches high bearing:
- 31 (A) the business name of the wholesale dealer; and
- 32 (B) the hours of operation of the wholesale dealer;
- 33 must be located on the exterior of the established place of
- 34 business of the wholesale dealer.
- 35 (2) The office of the wholesale dealer must be:
- 36 (A) housed at the established place of business of the
- 37 wholesale dealer;
- 38 (B) at least one hundred (100) square feet; and
- 39 (C) served with utilities such as electricity, lighting, heat,
- 40 and a business telephone exclusively for the use of the
- 41 wholesale dealer.
- 42 (3) The wholesale dealer or an employee of the wholesale

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1 dealer must be present for the purposes of inspection of
2 records at the established place of business of the wholesale
3 dealer during the posted hours of operation of the business of
4 the wholesale dealer.

5 (4) All business records of the wholesale dealer must be kept
6 at the licensed place of business of the wholesale dealer.

7 Sec. 5. A manufacturer, distributor, factory branch, or dealer
8 proposing to sell new motor vehicles shall file and maintain with
9 the secretary:

10 (1) a current copy of each franchise to which the person is a
11 party; or

12 (2) if the person is a party to multiple franchises that are
13 identical except for stated items, a copy of the franchise form
14 with supplemental schedules of variations from the form.

15 Sec. 6. (a) The license issued to a factory branch, an automobile
16 auctioneer, a transfer dealer, or a dealer under this chapter:

17 (1) must specify the location of each place of business; and
18 (2) shall be conspicuously displayed at each business location.

19 (b) If a licensee's business name or location is changed, the
20 licensee shall notify the secretary not later than ten (10) days after
21 the change and remit the fee required under IC 9-29-17. The
22 secretary shall endorse the change on the license if the secretary
23 determines that the change is not subject to other provisions of this
24 article.

25 (c) A dealer who uses the Internet or another computer network
26 to facilitate the sale of motor vehicles as set forth in section 2(c) of
27 this chapter shall notify the secretary not later than ten (10) days
28 after any change in a name, address, or telephone number
29 documented in business records located outside Indiana that have
30 been created in transactions made in Indiana by the dealer. A
31 report made under this subsection is not subject to the fee required
32 under IC 9-29-17.

33 (d) A dealer who wants to change a location must submit to the
34 secretary an application for approval of the change. The
35 application must be accompanied by an affidavit from:

36 (1) the person charged with enforcing a zoning ordinance
37 described in this subsection; or

38 (2) the zoning enforcement officer under IC 36-7-4, if one
39 exists;

40 who has jurisdiction over the real property where the applicant
41 wants to operate as a dealer. The affidavit must state that the
42 proposed location is zoned for the operation of a dealer's

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1 establishment. The secretary may not approve a change of location
 2 or endorse a change of location on the dealer's license until the
 3 dealer provides the affidavit.

4 (e) For the purpose of this section, an offsite license issued under
 5 section 11 of this chapter does not constitute a change of location.

6 Sec. 7. A license issued to a factory representative or distributor
 7 representative must state the name of the representative's
 8 employer. Within ten (10) days after a change of employer, the
 9 licensee shall mail the license to the secretary and indicate the
 10 name and address of the licensee's new employer. The secretary
 11 shall endorse the change on the license and return the license to the
 12 licensee in care of the new employer of the licensee. A factory
 13 representative, distributor representative, or wholesale dealer
 14 must have a license when engaged in business and shall display the
 15 license upon request. A temporary license for a factory
 16 representative or distributor representative may be issued for a
 17 period of not more than one hundred twenty (120) days pending
 18 investigation by the secretary of the representative's qualification
 19 for a license.

20 Sec. 8. The secretary shall, by rules adopted under IC 4-22-2,
 21 establish requirements for an initial application for and renewal of
 22 an automotive mobility dealer's license. The rules must include a
 23 requirement that each initial or renewal application for an
 24 automotive mobility dealer's license include proof that the
 25 applicant is accredited through the Quality Assurance Program of
 26 the National Mobility Equipment Dealers Association.

27 Sec. 9. An automotive mobility dealer licensed under this
 28 chapter is entitled to:

- 29 (1) display;
 30 (2) inventory;
 31 (3) advertise;
 32 (4) offer for sale; or
 33 (5) do any combination of subdivisions (1) through (4)
 34 concerning;
 35 any adapted vehicle.

36 Sec. 10. This section does not apply to sales made at a motor
 37 vehicle industry sponsored trade show. A dealer may not sell or
 38 offer to sell a vehicle at a location away from the dealer's
 39 established place of business without obtaining an offsite sales
 40 license under section 11 of this chapter.

41 Sec. 11. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b) through (g),
 42 the secretary shall issue an offsite sales license to a dealer licensed

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1 under this chapter who submits an application for the license not
2 later than ten (10) business days or two (2) calendar weeks before
3 the offsite sale date. License applications under this section shall be
4 made public upon the request of any person.

5 (b) The secretary may not issue an offsite sales license to a
6 dealer who does not have an established place of business within
7 Indiana.

8 (c) This subsection does not apply to:
9 (1) new manufactured housing dealers;
10 (2) recreational vehicle dealers;
11 (3) a rental company that is a dealer conducting a sale at a site
12 within twenty (20) miles of any of its company owned
13 affiliates;
14 (4) off-road vehicle dealers; or
15 (5) dealers of vehicles classified as classic, collector, or antique
16 under rules adopted under section 18(a)(2)(B) of this chapter.

17 The secretary may not issue an offsite sales license to a licensed
18 dealer proposing to conduct a sale outside a radius of twenty (20)
19 miles from the established place of business of the licensed dealer.

20 (d) A vehicle display is not considered an offsite sale if it is
21 conducted by a new vehicle franchised dealer in an open area
22 where no sales personnel and no sales material are present.

23 (e) The secretary may not issue an offsite sales license to a
24 licensed dealer proposing to conduct an offsite sale for more than
25 ten (10) calendar days.

26 (f) As used in this subsection, "executive" has the meaning set
27 forth in IC 36-1-2-5. The secretary may not issue an offsite sales
28 license to a licensed dealer if the dealer does not have certification
29 that the offsite sale would be in compliance with local zoning
30 ordinances or other local ordinances. Authorization under this
31 subsection may be obtained only from the following:

- 32 (1) If the offsite sale would be located within the corporate
33 boundaries of a city or town, the executive of the city or town.
- 34 (2) If the offsite sale would be located outside the corporate
35 boundaries of a city or town:
 - 36 (A) except as provided in clause (B), the executive of the
37 county; or
 - 38 (B) if the city or town exercises zoning jurisdiction under
39 IC 36-7-4-205(b) over the area where the offsite sale would
40 be located, the executive of the city or town.

41 (g) The secretary may not issue an offsite sales license to a
42 licensed dealer who has held more than three (3) nonconsecutive

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1 offsite sales in the year ending on the date of the offsite sale for
2 which the license application is being submitted.

3 (h) Section 2(c) of this chapter does not apply to the application
4 or issuance of an offsite sales license under this section.

5 Sec. 12. A license issued under this chapter is valid for a one (1)
6 year period in accordance with the following schedule:

7 (1) A person whose business name begins with the letters A
8 through B, inclusive, shall register before March 1 of each
9 year.

10 (2) A person whose business name begins with the letters C
11 through D, inclusive, shall register before April 1 of each year.

12 (3) A person whose business name begins with the letters E
13 through G, inclusive, shall register before May 1 of each year.

14 (4) A person whose business name begins with the letters H
15 through I, inclusive, shall register before June 1 of each year.

16 (5) A person whose business name begins with the letters J
17 through L, inclusive, shall register before July 1 of each year.

18 (6) A person whose business name begins with the letters M
19 through O, inclusive, shall register before August 1 of each
20 year.

21 (7) A person whose business name begins with the letters P
22 through R, inclusive, shall register before September 1 of each
23 year.

24 (8) A person whose business name begins with the letters S
25 through T, inclusive, shall register before October 1 of each
26 year.

27 (9) A person whose business name begins with the letters U
28 through Z, inclusive, shall register before November 1 of each
29 year.

30 A sole proprietor shall register based upon the name of the sole
31 proprietorship.

32 Sec. 13. A person licensed under this article may transfer or
33 assign a title for a motor vehicle.

34 Sec. 14. (a) A person licensed under this article shall furnish
35 evidence that the person has liability insurance or garage liability
36 insurance covering the person's place of business. The policy must
37 have limits of at least the following:

38 (1) One hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000) for bodily injury
39 to one (1) person.

40 (2) Three hundred thousand dollars (\$300,000) for bodily
41 injury for each accident.

42 (3) Fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) for property damage.

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1 (b) The minimum amounts required by subsection (a) must be
2 maintained during the time the license is valid.

3 Sec. 15. (a) A person who ceases a business activity for which a
4 license was issued under this chapter shall do the following:

5 (1) Notify the secretary of the date that the business activity
6 will cease.

7 (2) Deliver to the secretary all permanent dealer license plates
8 and interim license plates issued to the person not later than
9 ten (10) days after the date the business activity will cease.

10 (b) A dealer may not transfer or sell the:

11 (1) dealer's license; or

12 (2) use of the dealer's license.

13 (c) A dealer that changes its form of organization or state of
14 incorporation may continue the dealer's licensure by filing an
15 amendment to the registration if the change does not involve a
16 material fact in the financial condition or management of the
17 dealer. The amendment becomes effective when filed or on the date
18 designated by the registrant in its filing. The new organization is a
19 successor to the original registrant for the purposes of this article.

20 (d) If there is a change in the dealer's ownership, the successive
21 owner shall file a new application for a license under this chapter.

22 Sec. 16. Except as provided in IC 9-29-17, all revenues accruing
23 to the secretary under this chapter shall be deposited in the motor
24 vehicle highway account under IC 8-14-1.

25 Sec. 17. A dealer who sells a motor vehicle through the use of
26 the Internet or another computer network shall deliver the motor
27 vehicle to the customer, or the customer's representative, at the
28 place of business of the dealer in Indiana.

29 Sec. 18. (a) A person licensed under this article shall be issued
30 a special event permit from the secretary for a special event that
31 meets the following conditions:

32 (1) The event is a vehicle auction conducted by auctioneers
33 licensed under IC 25-6.1-3.

34 (2) The vehicles to be auctioned are:

35 (A) at least fifteen (15) years old; or

36 (B) classified as classic, collector, or antique vehicles under
37 rules adopted by the secretary.

38 (3) At least one hundred (100) vehicles will be auctioned
39 during the special event.

40 (4) The licensee submits to the secretary an application for a
41 special event permit not later than thirty (30) days before the
42 beginning date of the special event.

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- 1 (5) The application under subdivision (4) is accompanied by
- 2 the permit fee required under IC 9-29-17-13.
- 3 (b) Not more than two (2) special event permits may be issued
- 4 by the secretary to the same applicant within a twelve (12) month
- 5 period.

6 **Chapter 12. Disclosures Required in Motor Vehicle Leases**

7 **Sec. 1. A retail lessor shall do the following:**

- 8 (1) Comply with the requirements of Regulation M (12 CFR
- 9 213) for disclosure of gross capitalized cost, capitalized cost
- 10 reduction, and adjusted capitalized cost adopted under the
- 11 federal Truth in Lending Act (15 U.S.C. 1601 et seq.).

- 12 (2) Disclose to a retail lessee in a separate blocked section in
- 13 a lease agreement, in capital letters in at least 10 point bold
- 14 type the following:

15 **THIS IS A LEASE AGREEMENT.**
 16 **THIS IS NOT A PURCHASE AGREEMENT.**
 17 **PLEASE REVIEW THESE MATTERS CAREFULLY AND**
 18 **SEEK INDEPENDENT PROFESSIONAL ADVICE IF YOU**
 19 **HAVE ANY QUESTIONS CONCERNING THIS**
 20 **TRANSACTION. YOU ARE ENTITLED TO AN EXACT**
 21 **COPY OF THE AGREEMENT YOU SIGN.**

- 22 (3) Provide the retail lessee with a copy of each document
- 23 signed by the retail lessee during the course of the lease
- 24 transaction.

25 **Sec. 2. A trade-in vehicle used, in whole or in part, to pay**
26 **amounts due at lease signing or delivery of a leased vehicle must be**
27 **identified:**

- 28 (1) as a trade-in vehicle in the lease agreement; and
- 29 (2) by year, make, and model.

30 The lease agreement must state the net credit of the trade-in
31 vehicle used to pay amounts due at lease signing or delivery of the
32 leased vehicle.

33 **Sec. 3. A bona fide printing error identified on the face of the**
34 **lease agreement does not constitute a violation of this chapter.**

35 **Sec. 4. (a) A retail lessor who fails to comply with the**
36 **requirements of this chapter is liable to the retail lessee for:**

- 37 (1) actual damages sustained;
- 38 (2) a civil penalty of not more than one thousand dollars
- 39 (\$1,000) per lease transaction; and
- 40 (3) reasonable attorney's fees and costs.

41 **(b) In addition to any other remedies provided by law, a retail**
42 **lessee may bring an action in circuit court to recover the damages,**

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1 penalties, and fees described in subsection (a).

2 (c) The total recovery of damages, penalties, and fees in a class
3 action civil suit brought under this section may not exceed one
4 hundred thousand dollars (\$100,000).

5 Sec. 5. A civil suit described under section 4 of this chapter may
6 be brought on behalf of a consumer by the attorney general.

7 Sec. 6. An action authorized by sections 4 and 5 of this chapter
8 must be brought not later than three (3) years after the date the
9 lease agreement is signed.

10 Chapter 13. Unfair Practices

11 Sec. 1. It is an unfair practice for a dealer to require a
12 purchaser of a motor vehicle, as a condition of sale and delivery of
13 the motor vehicle, to purchase any equipment, part, or accessory
14 not ordered by the purchaser unless the equipment, part, or
15 accessory is:

- 16 (1) already installed on the motor vehicle when the motor
17 vehicle is received by or offered for sale by the dealer; or
18 (2) required by law.

19 Sec. 2. It is an unfair practice for a dealer to willingly fail to
20 perform the obligations imposed on the dealer in connection with
21 the delivery and preparation of a new motor vehicle for retail sale
22 as provided in the preparation and delivery agreement of the
23 manufacturer or distributor applicable to the motor vehicle.

24 Sec. 3. It is an unfair practice for a dealer to willingly fail to
25 perform the obligations imposed on the dealer in connection with
26 the warranty agreement of the manufacturer or distributor
27 applicable to any motor vehicle sold by the dealer.

28 Sec. 4. It is an unfair practice for a dealer to sell a new motor
29 vehicle having a trade name, trade or service mark, or related
30 characteristic for which the dealer does not have a franchise in
31 effect at the time of the sale. However, a vehicle having more than
32 one (1) trade name, trade or service mark, or related characteristic
33 as a result of modification or further manufacture by a
34 manufacturer, converter manufacturer, or an automotive mobility
35 dealer licensed under this article may be sold by a franchisee
36 appointed by that manufacturer, converter manufacturer, or
37 automotive mobility dealer.

38 Sec. 5. It is an unfair practice for a dealer to willingly fail to
39 perform the fiduciary duty imposed on the dealer by IC 6-2.5-2-1
40 with regard to the collection and remittance of the state gross retail
41 tax. Willful violation of the fiduciary duty includes written or oral
42 agreements between a dealer and a prospective purchaser that

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1 would give the appearance that a bona fide trade-in has taken
2 place, when in fact the purpose of the agreement is to reduce the
3 prospective purchaser's state gross retail tax and thereby deprive
4 the state of revenue.

5 **Sec. 6.** It is an unfair practice for a dealer to sell, exchange, or
6 transfer a rebuilt vehicle without disclosing in writing to the
7 purchaser, customer, or transferee the fact that the vehicle is a
8 rebuilt vehicle if the dealer knows or should reasonably know
9 before consummating the sale, exchange, or transfer that the
10 vehicle is a rebuilt vehicle.

11 **Sec. 7.** It is an unfair practice for a dealer to require a
12 purchaser of a motor vehicle as a condition of the sale and delivery
13 of the motor vehicle to pay a document preparation fee, unless the
14 fee:

- 15 (1) reflects expenses actually incurred for the preparation of
- 16 documents;
- 17 (2) was affirmatively disclosed by the dealer;
- 18 (3) was negotiated by the dealer and the purchaser;
- 19 (4) is not for the preparation, handling, or service of
- 20 documents that are incidental to the extension of credit; and
- 21 (5) is set forth on a buyer's order or similar agreement by a
- 22 means other than preprinting.

23 **Sec. 8. (a)** It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
24 distributor to violate IC 23-2-2.7.

25 **(b)** It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or distributor to
26 enter into an agreement in which a dealer is required to waive the
27 provisions of:

- 28 (1) this chapter; or
- 29 (2) IC 23-2-2.7.

30 However, this subsection does not apply to a voluntary agreement
31 in which separate consideration is offered and accepted.

32 **Sec. 9.** It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or distributor
33 to coerce a dealer to order parts, accessories, equipment,
34 machinery, tools, appliances, or any other commodity from a
35 person.

36 **Sec. 10.** It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
37 distributor to prevent or require, or attempt to prevent or require,
38 by contract or otherwise, a change in the capital structure of a
39 dealer or the means by or through which the dealer finances the
40 dealer's operation, if the dealer at all times meets reasonable
41 capital standards agreed to by the dealer and the manufacturer or
42 distributor. A change in capital structure does not cause a change

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1 in the principal management or have the effect of a sale of the
2 franchise without the consent of the manufacturer or distributor.

3 Sec. 11. It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
4 distributor to prevent or require, or attempt to prevent or require,
5 a dealer to change the dealer's executive management, other than
6 the principal dealer operator or operators, if the franchise was
7 granted in reliance upon the personal qualifications of the
8 principal dealer operator or operators.

9 Sec. 12. It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
10 distributor to prevent or require, or attempt to prevent or require,
11 by contract or otherwise, a dealer or an officer, a partner, or a
12 stockholder of a dealer to sell or transfer a part of the interest of
13 the officer, partner, or stockholder to any other person. A dealer,
14 an officer, a partner, or a stockholder may not sell, transfer, or
15 assign the franchise or a right under the franchise without the
16 consent of the manufacturer or distributor. This consent may not
17 be withheld unreasonably.

18 Sec. 13. It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
19 distributor to prevent or attempt to prevent a dealer from
20 receiving fair and reasonable compensation for the value of the
21 franchised business as a going concern. The dealer may not
22 transfer or assign the dealer's franchise without the consent of the
23 manufacturer or distributor, and the manufacturer or distributor
24 may not unreasonably withhold consent.

25 Sec. 14. It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
26 distributor to employ a person as a representative who has not
27 been licensed under this article.

28 Sec. 15. (a) It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
29 distributor to fail to compensate a dealer the posted labor rate for
30 the work and services the dealer is required to perform in
31 connection with the dealer's delivery and preparation obligations
32 under any franchise, or fail to compensate a dealer the posted
33 hourly labor rate for labor and other expenses incurred by the
34 dealer under the manufacturer's warranty agreements as long as
35 the posted rate is reasonable. Judgment of the reasonableness
36 includes consideration of charges for similar repairs by
37 comparable repair facilities in the local area as well as mechanic's
38 wages and fringe benefits.

39 (b) This section does not authorize a manufacturer or
40 distributor and its franchisees in Indiana to establish a uniform
41 hourly labor reimbursement rate effective for the entire state.

42 Sec. 16. (a) A manufacturer or distributor and at least thirty

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1 percent (30%) of its franchisees in Indiana of the same line make
 2 may agree in an express written contract citing this section to a
 3 uniform warranty reimbursement policy to be used by franchisees
 4 for the performance of warranty repairs. The contract must
 5 include reimbursement for parts used in warranty repairs or the
 6 use of a uniform time standards manual, or both. The allowance
 7 for diagnosis within the uniform time standards manual must be
 8 reasonable and adequate for the work and service to be performed.

9 **The manufacturer or distributor:**

10 (1) may have only one (1) contract with regard to each line
 11 make; and

12 (2) must have a reasonable and fair procedure for franchisees
 13 to request a modification or adjustment of a standard
 14 included in the uniform time standards manual.

15 (b) A contract described in subsection (a) must meet the
 16 following criteria:

17 (1) Establish a uniform parts reimbursement rate that must
 18 be greater than the manufacturer's or distributor's nationally
 19 established parts reimbursement rate in effect at the time the
 20 contract becomes effective. A subsequent contract must
 21 include a uniform reimbursement rate that is equal to or
 22 greater than the rate in the immediately prior contract.

23 (2) Apply to all warranty repair orders written while the
 24 agreement is in effect.

25 (3) At any time during the period the contract is in effect:

26 (A) be available to any franchisee of the same line make as
 27 the franchisees that entered into the contract with the
 28 manufacturer or distributor; and

29 (B) be available to a franchisee of the same line make on
 30 the same terms as apply to the franchisees that entered into
 31 the contract with the manufacturer or distributor.

32 (4) Be for a term not to exceed three (3) years.

33 (5) Allow any party to the uniform warranty reimbursement
 34 policy to terminate the policy with thirty (30) days prior
 35 written notice to all parties upon the annual anniversary of
 36 the policy, if the policy is for at least one (1) year.

37 (6) Remain in effect for the entire original period if the
 38 manufacturer and at least one (1) franchisee remain parties
 39 to the policy.

40 (c) A manufacturer or distributor that enters into a contract
 41 with its franchisees under subsection (a) may seek to recover only
 42 its costs from a franchisee that receives a higher reimbursement

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1 rate, if authorized by law, subject to the following:

2 (1) Costs may be recovered only by increasing invoice prices
3 on new vehicles received by the franchisee.

4 (2) A manufacturer or distributor may make an exception for
5 vehicles that are titled in the name of a purchaser in another
6 state. However, price increases imposed for the purpose of
7 recovering costs imposed by this section may vary from time
8 to time and from model to model and must apply uniformly to
9 all franchisees of the same line make that have requested
10 reimbursement for warranty repairs at a level higher than
11 provided for in the contract.

12 (d) A manufacturer or distributor that enters into a contract
13 with its franchisees under subsection (a) shall do the following:

14 (1) Certify to the secretary under oath, in a writing signed by
15 a representative of the manufacturer or distributor, that at
16 the time the contract was entered into at least thirty percent
17 (30%) of the franchisees of the line make were parties to the
18 contract.

19 (2) File a copy of the contract with the bureau at the time of
20 the certification.

21 (3) Maintain a file that contains the information upon which
22 the certification required under subdivision (1) is based for
23 three (3) years after the certification is made.

24 Sec. 17. (a) It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or
25 distributor to:

26 (1) fail to pay a claim made by a dealer for compensation for:

27 (A) delivery and preparation work;

28 (B) warranty work; and

29 (C) incentive payments;

30 not later than thirty (30) days after the claim is approved;

31 (2) fail to approve or disapprove a claim not later than thirty

32 (30) days after receipt of the claim; or

33 (3) disapprove a claim without notice to the dealer in writing
34 of the grounds for disapproval.

35 (b) A manufacturer or distributor may:

36 (1) audit a claim made by a dealer; or

37 (2) charge back to a dealer any amounts paid on a false or
38 unsubstantiated claim;

39 for up to one (1) year after the date on which the claim is paid.
40 However, the limitations of this subsection do not apply if the
41 manufacturer or distributor can prove fraud on a claim. A
42 manufacturer or distributor shall not discriminate among dealers

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1 with regard to auditing or charging back claims.

2 **Sec. 18. It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or**
 3 **distributor to sell a motor vehicle for resale to a person not**
 4 **licensed under this article.**

5 **Sec. 19. It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer or**
 6 **distributor to refuse or fail to indemnify and hold harmless a**
 7 **dealer, upon written notification from the dealer, from all losses,**
 8 **costs, and expenses that result or arise from or are related to a**
 9 **complaint, claim, defense, or suit against the dealer that concerns**
 10 **defects in a motor vehicle or other goods or services that are the**
 11 **responsibility of the manufacturer or distributor.**

12 **Sec. 20. It is an unfair practice for an automobile auctioneer, a**
 13 **wholesale dealer, or a transfer dealer, in connection with the**
 14 **auctioneer's or dealer's business, to use false, deceptive, or**
 15 **misleading advertising or to engage in deceptive acts or practices.**

16 **Sec. 21. It is an unfair practice for an employee, an agent, an**
 17 **officer, a partner, or a representative of a licensee to engage in a**
 18 **practice prohibited by this chapter.**

19 **Sec. 22. (a) It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer to**
 20 **terminate a franchise in violation of IC 23-2-2.7-3. A dealer may**
 21 **not transfer, assign, or sell the business and assets of a dealership**
 22 **or an interest in the dealership to another person under an**
 23 **agreement that contemplates or is conditioned on a continuation of**
 24 **the franchise relationship with the manufacturer or distributor**
 25 **unless the dealer first:**

26 (1) notifies the manufacturer or distributor of the dealer's
 27 decision to make the transfer, assignment, or sale by written
 28 notice; and

29 (2) obtains the approval of the manufacturer or distributor.

30 **The dealer must provide the manufacturer or distributor with**
 31 **completed application forms and related information generally**
 32 **used by the manufacturer or distributor to conduct a review of**
 33 **such a proposal and a copy of all agreements regarding the**
 34 **proposed transfer, assignment, or sale.**

35 (b) **The manufacturer or distributor shall send a letter by**
 36 **certified mail to the dealer not later than sixty (60) days after the**
 37 **manufacturer or distributor receives the information specified in**
 38 **subsection (a). The letter must indicate any disapproval of the**
 39 **transfer, assignment, or sale and must set forth the material**
 40 **reasons for the disapproval. If the manufacturer or distributor**
 41 **does not respond by letter within sixty (60) days after the**
 42 **manufacturer or distributor receives the information under**



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1 subsection (a), the manufacturer's or distributor's consent to the
 2 proposed transfer, assignment, or sale is considered to have been
 3 granted. A manufacturer or distributor may not unreasonably
 4 withhold approval of a transfer, assignment, or sale under this
 5 section.

6 (c) A manufacturer or distributor has a right of first refusal as
 7 specified in the franchise agreement to acquire the new vehicle
 8 dealer's assets or ownership if there is a proposed change of more
 9 than fifty percent (50%) of the dealer's ownership or proposed
 10 transfer of more than fifty percent (50%) of the new vehicle
 11 dealer's assets, and all the following are met:

12 (1) The manufacturer or distributor notifies the dealer in
 13 writing of the intent of the manufacturer or distributor to
 14 exercise the right of first refusal within the sixty (60) day
 15 notice period under subsection (b).

16 (2) The exercise of the right of first refusal will result in the
 17 dealer and the dealer's owners receiving consideration, terms,
 18 and conditions that are either the same as or better than those
 19 they have contracted to receive under the proposed change of
 20 more than fifty percent (50%) of the dealer's ownership or
 21 transfer of more than fifty percent (50%) of the new vehicle
 22 dealer's assets.

23 (3) The proposed change of the dealership's ownership or
 24 transfer of the new vehicle dealer's assets does not involve the
 25 transfer of assets or the transfer or issuance of stock by the
 26 dealer or one (1) or more of the dealer's owners to any of the
 27 following:

28 (A) A designated family member or members, including
 29 any of the following members of one (1) or more dealer
 30 owners:

31 (i) The spouse.

32 (ii) A child.

33 (iii) A grandchild.

34 (iv) The spouse of a child or a grandchild.

35 (v) A sibling.

36 (vi) A parent.

37 (B) A manager:

38 (i) employed by the dealer in the dealership during the
 39 previous four (4) years; and

40 (ii) who is otherwise qualified as a dealer operator.

41 (C) A partnership or corporation controlled by any of the
 42 family members described in clause (A).

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(D) A trust arrangement established or to be established:
(i) for the purpose of allowing the new vehicle dealer to continue to qualify as such under the manufacturer's or distributor's standards; or
(ii) to provide for the succession of the franchise agreement to designated family members or qualified management in the event of the death or incapacity of the dealer or the principal owner or owners.

(4) Except as otherwise provided in this subsection, the manufacturer or distributor agrees to pay the reasonable expenses, including reasonable attorney's fees, that do not exceed the usual, customary, and reasonable fees charged for similar work done for other clients, and that are incurred by the proposed owner or transferee before the manufacturer's or distributor's exercise of the right of first refusal in negotiating and implementing the contract for the proposed change of the dealer ownership or the transfer of the new vehicle dealer's assets. Payment of expenses and attorney's fees is not required if the dealer has failed to submit an accounting of those expenses not later than twenty (20) days after the dealer receives the manufacturer's or distributor's written request for such an accounting. An expense accounting may be requested by a manufacturer or distributor before exercising the right of first refusal.

(d) Violation of this section by a manufacturer or distributor is an unfair practice by the manufacturer or distributor.

Sec. 23. It is an unfair practice for a manufacturer, distributor, officer, or agent to do any of the following:

(1) Require, coerce, or attempt to coerce a new motor vehicle dealer in Indiana to:

- (A) change the location of the dealership;**
- (B) make any substantial alterations to the use of franchises; or**
- (C) make any substantial alterations to the dealership premises or facilities;**

if to do so would be unreasonable or would not be justified by current economic conditions or reasonable business considerations. This subdivision does not prevent a manufacturer or distributor from establishing and enforcing reasonable facility requirements.

(2) Require, coerce, or attempt to coerce a new motor vehicle dealer in Indiana to divest ownership of or management in

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1 another line or make of motor vehicles that the dealer has
 2 established in its dealership facilities with the prior written
 3 approval of the manufacturer or distributor.
 4 (3) Establish or acquire wholly or partially a franchisor
 5 owned outlet engaged wholly or partially in a substantially
 6 identical business to that of the franchisee within the exclusive
 7 territory granted the franchisee by the franchise agreement
 8 or, if no exclusive territory is designated, competing unfairly
 9 with the franchisee within a reasonable market area. A
 10 franchisor is not considered to be competing unfairly if
 11 operating:

- 12 (A) a business for less than two (2) years;
- 13 (B) in a bona fide retail operation that is for sale to any
 14 qualified independent person at a fair and reasonable
 15 price; or
- 16 (C) in a bona fide relationship in which an independent
 17 person has made a significant investment subject to loss in
 18 the business operation and can reasonably expect to
 19 acquire majority ownership or managerial control of the
 20 business on reasonable terms and conditions.

21 This subdivision does not apply to recreational vehicle
 22 manufacturer franchisors.

23 Sec. 24. (a) This section does not apply to the relocation of a new
 24 motor vehicle dealer to a location that is not more than two (2)
 25 miles from its established place of business.

26 (b) This section does not apply to the reopening or replacement
 27 in a relevant market area of a closed dealership that was closed
 28 within the preceding three hundred and sixty five (365) days, if the
 29 established place of business of the reopened or replacement dealer
 30 is within two (2) miles of the established place of business of the
 31 closed dealership.

32 (c) This section does not apply to a new motor vehicle dealer
 33 located in a county having a population of more than one hundred
 34 thousand (100,000) if:

- 35 (1) the new motor vehicle dealer relocates to a site that is
 36 located at a distance greater than the existing distance of
 37 another new motor vehicle dealer of the same line make
 38 before the relocation; and
- 39 (2) the site of the relocation is outside an area that is within a
 40 radius of four (4) miles from another new motor vehicle
 41 dealer of the same line make;

42 but does apply to a new motor vehicle dealer that, before January

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1 1, 2013, had been engaged in the process of relocating but had not
2 physically relocated to the new intended site by January 1, 2013,
3 and to a new motor vehicle dealer that began engaging in the
4 process of relocating on or after January 1, 2013.

5 (d) Before a franchisor enters into a franchise establishing or
6 relocating a new motor vehicle dealer within a relevant market
7 area where the same line make is represented, the franchisor shall
8 give written notice to each new motor vehicle dealer of the same
9 line make in the relevant market area of the franchisor's intention
10 to establish an additional dealer or to relocate an existing dealer
11 within that relevant market area.

12 (e) Not later than thirty (30) days after:
13 (1) receiving the notice provided for in subsection (d); or
14 (2) the end of any appeal procedure provided by the
15 franchisor;

16 a new motor vehicle dealer may bring a declaratory judgment
17 action before the division to determine whether good cause exists
18 for the establishing or relocating of a proposed new motor vehicle
19 dealer. If an action is filed under this section, the franchisor may
20 not establish or relocate the proposed new motor vehicle dealer
21 until the division has rendered a decision on the matter. An action
22 brought under this section shall be given precedence over all other
23 matters pending before the division.

24 (f) In determining whether good cause exists for establishing or
25 relocating an additional new motor vehicle dealer for the same line
26 make, the division shall take into consideration the existing
27 circumstances, including the following:

- 28 (1) Permanency of the investment.
- 29 (2) Effect on the retail new motor vehicle business and the
30 consuming public in the relevant market area.
- 31 (3) Whether it is injurious or beneficial to the public welfare.
- 32 (4) Whether the new motor vehicle dealers of the same line
33 make in that relevant market area are providing adequate
34 competition and convenient consumer care for the motor
35 vehicles of that line make in that market area, including the
36 adequacy of motor vehicle sales and qualified service
37 personnel.
- 38 (5) Whether the establishment or relocation of the new motor
39 vehicle dealer would promote competition.
- 40 (6) Growth or decline of the population and the number of
41 new motor vehicle registrations in the relevant market area.
- 42 (7) The effect on the relocating dealer of a denial of its

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1 relocation into the relevant market area.
 2 **Sec. 25. It is an unfair practice for a person to:**
 3 (1) act as;
 4 (2) offer to act as; or
 5 (3) profess to be;
 6 a broker in the advertising, buying, or selling of at least five (5)
 7 new or used vehicles per year.
 8 **Sec. 26. It is an unfair practice for a dealer to, in connection**
 9 **with the offer, sale, or purchase of a vehicle, directly or indirectly:**
 10 (1) employ a device, scheme, or artifice to defraud;
 11 (2) make an untrue statement of a material fact or omit to
 12 state a material fact necessary to make the statement made,
 13 in light of the circumstances under which the statement was
 14 made, not misleading; or
 15 (3) engage in an act, practice, or course of business that
 16 operates or would operate as a fraud or deceit upon another
 17 person.
 18 **Chapter 14. Damage to New Motor Vehicles**
 19 **Sec. 1. Notwithstanding the terms, provisions, or conditions of**
 20 **an agreement or franchise, a motor vehicle dealer is solely liable**
 21 **for damage to a new motor vehicle:**
 22 (1) after acceptance from the carrier or transporter; and
 23 (2) before delivery to the ultimate purchaser.
 24 **Sec. 2. Notwithstanding the terms, provisions, or conditions of**
 25 **any agreement or franchise, a manufacturer, converter**
 26 **manufacturer, or automotive mobility dealer is liable for all**
 27 **damage to a new motor vehicle before delivery of the motor vehicle**
 28 **to a carrier or transporter.**
 29 **Sec. 3. A motor vehicle dealer is liable for damage to a new**
 30 **motor vehicle after the motor vehicle is delivered to the carrier or**
 31 **transporter only if the dealer selects the method of transportation,**
 32 **mode of transportation, and the carrier or transporter. In all other**
 33 **instances, the manufacturer is liable for carrier related damage to**
 34 **a new motor vehicle.**
 35 **Sec. 4. (a) This section does not apply to damage to:**
 36 (1) glass;
 37 (2) radios;
 38 (3) tires; and
 39 (4) bumpers;
 40 when replaced by identical manufacturer's original equipment.
 41 (b) Any uncorrected or corrected damage to a new motor
 42 vehicle that exceeds four percent (4%) of the manufacturer's

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1 suggested retail price (as defined in 26 U.S.C. 4216), as measured
 2 by retail repair costs, must be disclosed in writing before delivery
 3 of the motor vehicle to an ultimate purchaser.

4 **Sec. 5. Repaired damage to a new motor vehicle ordered by a**
 5 **customer not exceeding four percent (4%) of the manufacturer's**
 6 **suggested retail price (as defined in 26 U.S.C. 4216) does not need**
 7 **to be disclosed at the time of sale.**

8 **Chapter 15. Succession to Franchise by Designated Family**
 9 **Members**

10 **Sec. 1. This chapter does not apply to a franchise if:**

- 11 (1) the franchise is granted to a dealer other than a new motor
 12 vehicle dealer; and
 13 (2) the franchise or other written document filed with the
 14 franchisor includes the franchisee's designation of a successor
 15 to the franchise who is not the:
 16 (A) spouse of the franchisee;
 17 (B) child of the franchisee;
 18 (C) grandchild of the franchisee;
 19 (D) spouse of a:
 20 (i) child; or
 21 (ii) grandchild;
 22 of the franchisee;
 23 (E) parent of the franchisee; or
 24 (F) sibling of the franchisee.

25 **Sec. 2. A designated family member of a deceased or**
 26 **incapacitated franchisee may succeed the franchisee under the**
 27 **existing franchise if:**

- 28 (1) the manufacturer or distributor determines, subject to
 29 section 3 of this chapter, that the existing franchise should be
 30 honored; and
 31 (2) the designated family member complies with section 4 of
 32 this chapter.

33 **Sec. 3. A manufacturer or distributor may refuse to honor the**
 34 **succession of an existing franchise under section 2 of this chapter**
 35 **only for good cause.**

36 **Sec. 4. To qualify under section 2 of this chapter to succeed a**
 37 **franchisee under the existing franchise, a designated family**
 38 **member must do all the following:**

- 39 (1) Not later than one hundred twenty (120) days after the
 40 franchisee's death or disability, give the manufacturer or
 41 distributor written notice of the designated family member's
 42 intention to succeed to the franchise.



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- 1 (2) Agree to be bound by all terms and conditions of the
- 2 existing franchise.
- 3 (3) Meet the criteria generally applied at the time of the death
- 4 or incapacity of the franchisee by the manufacturer or
- 5 distributor in qualifying new motor vehicle dealers as
- 6 franchisees.
- 7 (4) If requested by the manufacturer or distributor, promptly
- 8 supply personal and financial data that is reasonably
- 9 necessary for the manufacturer or distributor to determine if
- 10 the existing franchise should be honored.
- 11 Sec. 5. (a) Not later than sixty (60) days after receipt of:
- 12 (1) notice from a designated family member under section 4(1)
- 13 of this chapter; or
- 14 (2) requested personal or financial data under section 4(4) of
- 15 this chapter;
- 16 a manufacturer or distributor that determines that good cause
- 17 exists for refusing to honor an existing franchise shall serve notice
- 18 of the determination on the designated family member.
- 19 (b) The notice required under subsection (a) must state the
- 20 following:
- 21 (1) The specific grounds for the manufacturer's or
- 22 distributor's determination.
- 23 (2) The date on which the existing franchise will be
- 24 discontinued, which must be at least ninety (90) days after the
- 25 date the notice is served.
- 26 (c) If notice of the manufacturer's determination is not served
- 27 within the time specified in subsection (a) and does not comply with
- 28 subsection (b), the franchise must be honored and is not subject to
- 29 discontinuance under this chapter.
- 30 Chapter 16. Administration and Legal Proceedings
- 31 Sec. 1. (a) This chapter shall be administered by the secretary.
- 32 (b) The secretary:
- 33 (1) shall employ employees, including a director, investigators,
- 34 or attorneys, necessary for the administration of this article;
- 35 and
- 36 (2) shall fix the compensation of the employees with the
- 37 approval of the budget agency.
- 38 (c) It is unlawful for the director or an officer, employee, or
- 39 designee of the secretary to use for personal benefit or the benefit
- 40 of others records or other information obtained by or filed with the
- 41 dealer services division under this article that are confidential. This
- 42 article does not authorize the director or an officer, employee, or

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1 designee of the secretary to disclose the record or information,
2 except in accordance with this chapter.

3 (d) This article does not create or diminish a privilege or
4 exemption that exists at common law, by statute or rule, or
5 otherwise.

6 (e) The secretary may develop and implement dealer's and
7 vehicle purchaser's education initiatives to inform dealers and the
8 public about the offer or sale of vehicles, with particular emphasis
9 on the prevention and detection of fraud involving vehicle sales. In
10 developing and implementing these initiatives, the secretary may
11 collaborate with public and nonprofit organizations with an
12 interest in consumer education. The secretary may accept a grant
13 or donation from a person that is not affiliated with the dealer
14 industry or from a nonprofit organization, regardless of whether
15 the organization is affiliated with the dealer industry, to develop
16 and implement consumer education initiatives. This subsection
17 does not authorize the secretary to require participation or
18 monetary contributions of a registrant in an education program.

19 (f) Fees and funds accruing from the administration of this
20 article:

21 (1) described in IC 9-32-7-1(d) shall be accounted for by the
22 secretary and shall be deposited with the treasurer of state to
23 be deposited in the dealer compliance account established by
24 IC 9-32-7-1(a);

25 (2) described in IC 9-32-7-2(b) shall be accounted for by the
26 secretary and shall be deposited with the treasurer of state to
27 be deposited in the dealer enforcement account established by
28 IC 9-32-7-2(a);

29 (3) described in IC 9-29-17-14(b)(2), IC 9-29-17-14(c)(2),
30 IC 9-29-17-15, and IC 9-32-7-3(2) shall be accounted for by
31 the secretary and shall be deposited with the treasurer of state
32 to be deposited in the motor vehicle highway account under
33 IC 8-14-1;

34 (4) described in IC 9-32-7-3(3) shall be accounted for by the
35 secretary and shall be deposited with the treasurer of state to
36 be deposited with the state police department, and these fees
37 and funds are continuously appropriated to the department
38 for its use in enforcing odometer laws;

39 (5) described in IC 9-32-7-3(4) shall be accounted for by the
40 secretary and shall be deposited with the treasurer of state to
41 be deposited with the attorney general, and these fees and
42 funds are continuously appropriated to the attorney general

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1 for use in enforcing odometer laws; and
 2 (6) described in IC 9-29-1-4(a) shall be accounted for by the
 3 secretary and shall be deposited with the treasurer of state to
 4 be deposited in the state police building account.

5 Expenses incurred in the administration of this article shall be paid
 6 from the state general fund upon appropriation being made for the
 7 expenses in the manner provided by law for the making of those
 8 appropriations. However, grants and donations under subsection
 9 (e), costs of investigations, and civil penalties recovered under this
 10 chapter shall be deposited by the treasurer of state in the dealer
 11 enforcement account established by IC 9-32-7-2. The funds in the
 12 dealer compliance account established by IC 9-32-7-1 must be
 13 available, with the approval of the budget agency, to augment and
 14 supplement the funds appropriated for the administration of this
 15 article.

16 (g) In connection with the administration and enforcement of
 17 this article, the attorney general shall render all necessary
 18 assistance to the director upon the request of the director. To that
 19 end, the attorney general shall employ legal and other professional
 20 services as are necessary to adequately and fully perform the
 21 service under the direction of the director as the demands of the
 22 division require. Expenses incurred by the attorney general for the
 23 purposes stated under this subsection are chargeable against and
 24 shall be paid out of funds appropriated to the attorney general for
 25 the administration of the attorney general's office. The attorney
 26 general may authorize the director and the director's designee to
 27 represent the director and the division in any proceeding involving
 28 enforcement or defense of this article.

29 (h) The secretary, director, and employees of the division are
 30 not liable in an individual capacity, except to the state, for an act
 31 done or omitted in connection with the performance of their duties
 32 under this article.

33 (i) The director and each attorney or investigator designated by
 34 the secretary:

- 35 (1) are police officers of the state;
- 36 (2) have all the powers and duties of police officers in
 37 conducting investigations for violations of this article, or in
 38 serving any process, notice, or order issued by an officer,
 39 authority, or court in connection with the enforcement of this
 40 article; and
- 41 (3) comprise the enforcement department of the division.

42 The division is a criminal justice agency for purposes of

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IC 5-2-4-1(3) and IC 10-13-3-6.

(j) The provisions of this article delegating and granting power to the secretary, division, and director shall be liberally construed to the end that:

- (1) the practice or commission of fraud may be prohibited and prevented; and**
- (2) disclosure of sufficient and reliable information in order to afford reasonable opportunity for the exercise of independent judgment of the persons involved may be assured.**

(k) Copies of any statements and documents filed in the office of the secretary and of any records of the secretary certified by the director are admissible in any prosecution, action, suit, or proceeding based on, arising out of, or under this article to the same effect as the original of the statement, document, or record would be if actually produced.

Sec. 2. (a) An order issued under this article may deny a dealer license application for registration if the secretary finds that the order is in the public interest and subsection (c) authorizes the action. An order may condition or limit the license of an applicant to be a dealer and, if the applicant for a dealer license is a partner, officer, director, or person having similar status or performing similar functions, or a person directly or indirectly in control of the dealership, the order may condition or limit the license.

(b) If the secretary finds that an order is in the public interest and subsection (c) authorizes the action, an order issued under this article may deny, revoke, suspend, condition, limit, or permanently bar the granting of a license to or an application for a license from a dealer, or a partner, an officer, a director, or a person having a similar status or performing similar functions as a dealer, or a person directly or indirectly in control of the dealer. However, the secretary may not:

- (1) institute a revocation or suspension proceeding under this subsection based on an order issued under the law of another state that is reported to the secretary or a designee of the secretary more than one (1) year after the date of the order on which it is based; or**
- (2) issue an order on the basis of an order issued under the dealer services laws of another state unless the other order was based on conduct for which subsection (c) would authorize the action had the conduct occurred in Indiana.**

(c) A person may be disciplined under subsections (a) and (b) if

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the person:

- (1) has filed an application for a dealer license in Indiana under this article, or its predecessor, within the previous ten (10) years, which, as of the effective date of license or registration or as of any date after filing in the case of an order denying effectiveness, was incomplete as to a material fact or contained a statement that, in light of the circumstances under which it was made, was false or misleading with respect to a material fact;
- (2) knowingly violated or knowingly failed to comply with this article, or its predecessor, within the previous ten (10) years;
- (3) has been convicted of a felony within the previous ten (10) years or has been convicted of a misdemeanor involving theft, fraud, or an aspect of business involving the offer, sale, financing, repair, or manufacture of a vehicle;
- (4) is enjoined or restrained by a court with jurisdiction in an action instituted by a state or the United States from engaging in or continuing an act, practice, or course of business involving an aspect of a business involving the offer, barter, sale, purchase, transfer, financing, repair, or manufacture of a vehicle;
- (5) refuses to allow or otherwise impedes the secretary from conducting an audit or inspection;
- (6) has engaged in dishonest or unethical practices in a business involving the offer, barter, sale, purchase, transfer, financing, repair, or manufacture of a vehicle within the previous ten (10) years;
- (7) is engaging in unfair practices as set forth in this article;
- (8) is on the most recent tax warrant list supplied to the secretary by the department of state revenue;
- (9) violates IC 23-2-2.7; or
- (10) violates IC 9-19-9.

(d) The secretary may suspend or deny an application, impose fines and costs, restrict, condition, limit, bar, suspend, or rescind a dealer license, or order restitution, or do any combination of these actions before final determination of an administrative proceeding. Upon the issuance of an order, the secretary shall promptly notify each person subject to the order:

- (1) that the order has been issued;
- (2) the reasons for the action; and
- (3) that within fifteen (15) days after the receipt of a request in a record from the person the matter will be scheduled for

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a hearing.
If a hearing is not requested and no hearing is ordered by the secretary within thirty (30) days after the date of service of the order, the order becomes final by operation of law. If a hearing is requested or ordered, the secretary, after notice of and opportunity for hearing to each person subject to the order, may modify or vacate the order or extend the order until final determination.

(e) Revocation or suspension of a license of a manufacturer, a distributor, a factory branch, a dealer, or an automobile auctioneer may be limited to one (1) or more locations, to one (1) or more defined areas, or only to certain aspects of the business.

(f) Except as provided in subsection (d), an order may not be issued under this section without:

- (1) appropriate notice to the applicant or registrant;
- (2) an opportunity for a hearing; and
- (3) findings of fact and conclusion of law in a record.

(g) A person that controls, directly or indirectly, a person not in compliance with this section may be disciplined by order of the secretary under subsections (a) and (b) to the same extent as the noncomplying person, unless the controlling person did not know, and in the exercise of reasonable care could not have known, of the existence of conduct that is a ground for discipline under this section.

(h) A person subject to this chapter that has not been issued a license is subject to the same disciplinary fines, costs, and penalties as if a license had been issued.

Sec. 3. Information or documents obtained by the division in the course of an investigation, including an audit conducted under IC 9-32-16-6(c), are law enforcement records for the purposes IC 5-14-3-4(b)(1).

Sec. 4. A person complying with any request, order, or subpoena issued by the division for the production of documentary evidence shall retain the originals and shall provide the division with clearly legible, true, and complete copies of the documents requested, along with a signed cover letter, which must identify those documents with a reasonable degree of specificity.

Sec. 5. All dealers licensed with the division shall, upon request, provide members of the staff of the division prompt access, during reasonable business hours, to that part of the premises at the dealer's place of business where:

- (1) documents are stored; or
- (2) vehicle sales are offered, made, or processed.

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1 **Sec. 6. (a) A dealer licensed or required to be licensed under this**
2 **article shall make and maintain the records, accounts,**
3 **correspondence, memoranda, papers, books, and other records**
4 **required under this article.**

5 **(b) Dealer records required to be maintained under**
6 **IC 9-32-6-14 and other records required under this article may be**
7 **maintained in any form of data storage acceptable to the secretary**
8 **if the records are readily accessible and available to copy by an**
9 **investigating or auditing employee of the secretary upon demand**
10 **at the place of business of the dealer.**

11 **(c) The records of a dealer licensed or required to be licensed**
12 **under this article are subject to such reasonable periodic, special,**
13 **or other audits or inspections by a representative of the secretary,**
14 **within or outside Indiana, as the secretary considers necessary or**
15 **appropriate in the public interest and for the protection of**
16 **investors. An audit or inspection may be made at any time and**
17 **without prior notice. The representative of the secretary may copy,**
18 **and remove for audit or inspection copies of, the records the**
19 **secretary reasonably considers necessary or appropriate to**
20 **conduct the audit or inspection.**

21 **(d) Dealer records required to be maintained under**
22 **IC 9-32-6-14 and other records required under this article must be**
23 **maintained at the place of business of a dealer for a period of two**
24 **(2) years. Following the two (2) year period, records may be moved**
25 **offsite but must be maintained for a period of five (5) years.**

26 **Sec. 7. At the request of the division or equivalent regulator of**
27 **another state or foreign jurisdiction, the secretary may provide**
28 **assistance if the requesting regulator states that the requesting**
29 **regulator is conducting an investigation to determine whether a**
30 **person has violated, is violating, or is about to violate a law or rule**
31 **of the other state or foreign jurisdiction relating to dealer matters**
32 **that the requesting regulator administers or enforces. The**
33 **secretary may provide assistance by using the authority to**
34 **investigate and the powers conferred by this article as the**
35 **secretary determines are necessary or appropriate. The assistance**
36 **may be provided without regard to whether the conduct described**
37 **in the request would also constitute a violation of this article or**
38 **other law of Indiana if occurring in Indiana. In deciding whether**
39 **to provide the assistance, the secretary may consider:**

40 **(1) whether the requesting regulator is permitted and has**
41 **agreed to provide assistance reciprocally within the state or**
42 **foreign jurisdiction of the requesting regulator to the**

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1 secretary on dealer matters when requested;
 2 (2) whether compliance with the request would violate or
 3 prejudice the public policy of Indiana; and
 4 (3) the availability of resources and employees of the division
 5 to carry out the request for assistance.
 6 **Sec. 8. (a)** A person shall cooperate in an inquiry, investigation,
 7 or inspection conducted by, or on behalf of, the division for
 8 purposes of determining whether or not a person has violated or is
 9 about to violate any provision under this article. The willful failure
 10 of a person to cooperate, absent a bona fide claim of privilege,
 11 may:
 12 (1) be considered by the division a violation of statute; and
 13 (2) thus subject the person to denial, suspension, or revocation
 14 of licensing or registration or a bar from licensing or
 15 registration.
 16 **(b)** The following are examples of, but are not the only, conduct
 17 by a person that may be considered a failure to cooperate:
 18 (1) The failure to timely respond by way of appearance or
 19 production of documents to a subpoena or order issued by the
 20 division.
 21 (2) The failure to answer any question pertinent to inquiry
 22 unless the response to the question is subject to a bona fide
 23 claim of privilege.
 24 (3) The failure to grant division personnel access to:
 25 (A) the business premises of a dealer or a person required
 26 to be licensed as a dealer; or
 27 (B) the records and documents that the dealer or person
 28 required to be licensed as a dealer is required, by statute or
 29 rule, to make available for inspection.
 30 (4) The failure to attend a scheduled proceeding at which the
 31 appearance of the person is required. If a person elects to
 32 retain counsel for the purpose of representation in any such
 33 proceeding, it is the responsibility of the person to do so in a
 34 timely fashion. The failure of a person to retain counsel,
 35 absent a showing of good cause, does not require an
 36 adjournment of the proceeding.
 37 (5) The failure to timely respond to or to provide information
 38 requested under a demand under this chapter.
 39 (6) Aiding or abetting the failure of another person to
 40 cooperate.
 41 **Sec. 9. (a)** The division may copy records or require a dealer to
 42 copy records and provide the copies to the division to the extent

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1 and in the manner reasonable under the circumstances.

2 (b) The division may impose a reasonable fee for the expense of
3 making copies under subsection (a).

4 Sec. 10. (a) The secretary or a designee of the secretary may
5 refer the facts drawn from an investigation to the prosecuting
6 attorney of the county in which a crime is alleged to have been
7 committed.

8 (b) The secretary may assist the prosecuting attorney in
9 prosecuting an action brought subsequent to a referral made under
10 subsection (a), which may include a division attorney serving as a
11 special deputy prosecutor appointed by the prosecuting attorney.

12 Sec. 11. (a) All dealers operating as a:

- 13 (1) corporation;
14 (2) limited liability company;
15 (3) limited partnership; or
16 (4) limited liability partnership;

17 shall file and maintain all filings required to remain in good
18 standing with the secretary of state business services division.

19 (b) The dealer shall provide the secretary:

- 20 (1) the federal tax identification number; and
21 (2) the registered retail merchant's certificate number issued
22 under IC 6-2.5-8;

23 issued to the dealer.

24 (c) The dealer must, for the entire licensing period, have an
25 established place of business with a physical Indiana address. The
26 dealer may not have a mailing address that differs from the actual
27 location of the business.

28 (d) The applicant and all corporate officers, partners, and
29 owners must submit to a national criminal history background
30 check (as defined in IC 10-13-3-12) administered by the state police
31 at the expense of the applicant and the corporate officers, partners,
32 and owners. The secretary may deny an application based upon
33 felony or misdemeanor convictions related to dealing in motor
34 vehicles.

35 (e) The dealer and the corporation, company, or partnership
36 must be in good standing with the bureau, the department of state
37 revenue, and the state police department.

38 Sec. 12. It is a violation of this article for a person to:

- 39 (1) make or cause to be made, in a record that is used in an
40 action or proceeding or filed under this chapter, a statement
41 that, at the time and in the light of the circumstances under
42 which it is made, is false or misleading with respect to a

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- 1 material fact; or
- 2 (2) in connection with a statement to the division or to a
- 3 consumer, omit to state a material fact necessary to make the
- 4 statement made, in light of the circumstances under which it
- 5 was made, not false or misleading.

6 Sec. 13. (a) If the secretary believes that a person has engaged,
 7 is engaging, or is about to engage in an act, practice, or course of
 8 business:

- 9 (1) that constitutes a violation of this article or a rule adopted
- 10 or order issued under this article; or
- 11 (2) that materially aids a violation of this article or a rule
- 12 adopted or order issued under this article;

13 the secretary or a designee of the secretary, in addition to any
 14 administrative remedies, may maintain an action in the circuit or
 15 superior court in the county where the investigation or inquiry in
 16 question is being conducted to enjoin the act, practice, or course of
 17 business and to enforce compliance with this article or a rule
 18 adopted or order issued under this article.

19 (b) In an action under this section and on a proper showing, a
 20 court may:

- 21 (1) issue a permanent or temporary injunction, restraining
- 22 order, or declaratory judgment;
- 23 (2) order other appropriate or ancillary relief, which may
- 24 include:
 - 25 (A) an asset freeze, accounting, writ of attachment, writ of
 - 26 general or specific execution, and appointment of a
 - 27 receiver or conservator;
 - 28 (B) ordering a receiver or conservator appointed under
 - 29 clause (A) to:
 - 30 (i) take charge and control of the property of the
 - 31 respondent, including investment accounts and accounts
 - 32 in a depository institution, rents, and profits;
 - 33 (ii) collect debts; and
 - 34 (iii) acquire and dispose of property;
 - 35 (C) imposing a civil penalty of up to ten thousand dollars
 - 36 (\$10,000) per violation and an order of rescission,
 - 37 restitution, or disgorgement directed to a person that has
 - 38 engaged in an act, practice, or course of business
 - 39 constituting a violation of this article or a rule adopted or
 - 40 order issued under this article; and
 - 41 (D) ordering the payment of prejudgment and
 - 42 postjudgment interest; or

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- 1 (3) order other relief that the court considers appropriate.
- 2 (c) The director may not be required to post a bond in an action
- 3 or proceeding under this article.
- 4 (d) Penalties collected under this section shall be deposited in
- 5 the dealer enforcement account established by IC 9-32-7-2.
- 6 Sec. 14. (a) The secretary may:
- 7 (1) conduct public or private investigations within or outside
- 8 Indiana that the secretary considers necessary or appropriate
- 9 to determine whether a person has violated, is violating, or is
- 10 about to violate this article or a rule adopted or order issued
- 11 under this article, or aid in the enforcement of this article or
- 12 in the adoption of rules and forms under this article;
- 13 (2) require or permit a person to testify, file a statement, or
- 14 produce a record, under oath or otherwise as the secretary
- 15 determines, as to all the facts and circumstances concerning
- 16 a matter to be investigated or about which an action or
- 17 proceeding is to be instituted; and
- 18 (3) publish a record concerning an action, proceeding, or
- 19 investigation under, or a violation of, this article or a rule
- 20 adopted or order issued under this article if the secretary
- 21 determines it is necessary or appropriate and in the public
- 22 interest and for the protection of dealers or consumers.
- 23 (b) For purposes of an investigation under this article, the
- 24 secretary or a designated employee of the secretary may
- 25 administer oaths and affirmations, subpoena witnesses, seek
- 26 compulsion of attendance, take attendance, take evidence, require
- 27 the filing of statements, and require the production of any records
- 28 that the secretary considers relevant or material to the
- 29 investigation. Upon order of the secretary or a hearing officer
- 30 appointed by the secretary in a hearing, depositions may be taken
- 31 in the manner prescribed by law for depositions in civil actions and
- 32 made returnable to the secretary or a hearing officer appointed by
- 33 the secretary.
- 34 (c) If a person does not appear or refuses to testify, file a
- 35 statement, or produce records, or otherwise does not obey a
- 36 subpoena as required by this article, the secretary or hearing
- 37 officer appointed by the secretary may apply to the circuit or
- 38 superior court in the county where the hearing, investigation, or
- 39 inquiry in question is being conducted to enforce compliance. The
- 40 court may:
- 41 (1) hold the person in contempt;
- 42 (2) order the person to appear before the secretary or hearing

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1 officer appointed by the secretary;

2 (3) order the person to testify about the matter under
3 investigation or in question;

4 (4) order the production of records;

5 (5) grant injunctive relief, including restricting or prohibiting
6 the offer or sale of vehicles;

7 (6) impose a civil penalty of not more than twenty thousand
8 dollars (\$20,000) for each violation; and

9 (7) grant any other necessary or appropriate relief.

10 (d) This section does not preclude a person from applying to the
11 circuit or superior court in the county where the hearing,
12 investigation, or inquiry in question is being conducted for relief
13 from a request to appear, testify, file a statement, produce records,
14 or obey a subpoena.

15 (e) If a witness, in any hearing, inquiry, or investigation
16 conducted under this article, refuses to answer any question or
17 produce any item, the secretary may file a written petition with the
18 circuit or superior court in the county where the hearing,
19 investigation, or inquiry in question is being conducted requesting
20 a hearing on the refusal. The court shall hold a hearing to
21 determine if the witness may refuse to answer the question or
22 produce the item. If the court determines that the witness, based
23 upon the witness's privilege against self-incrimination, may
24 properly refuse to answer or produce an item, the secretary may
25 make a written request that the court grant use immunity to the
26 witness. Upon written request of the secretary, the court shall
27 grant use immunity to a witness. The court shall instruct the
28 witness, by written order or in open court, that:

29 (1) any evidence the witness gives, or evidence derived from
30 that evidence, may not be used in any criminal proceedings
31 against that witness, unless the evidence is volunteered by the
32 witness or is not responsive to a question; and

33 (2) the witness must answer the questions asked and produce
34 the items requested.

35 A grant of use immunity does not prohibit the use of evidence that
36 the witness gives in a hearing, investigation, or inquiry from being
37 used in a prosecution for perjury under IC 35-44.1-2-1. If a witness
38 refuses to give the evidence after the witness has been granted use
39 immunity, the court may find the witness in contempt.

40 (f) In any prosecution, action, suit, or proceeding based upon or
41 arising out of or under this article, a certificate signed by the
42 secretary showing compliance or noncompliance with this article

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1 by a dealer constitutes prima facie evidence of compliance or
 2 noncompliance with this article and is admissible in evidence in any
 3 action at law or in equity to enforce this article.

4 (g) Each witness who appears before the secretary or a hearing
 5 officer appointed by the secretary by order is entitled to receive for
 6 the witness's attendance the fees and mileage provided for
 7 witnesses in civil cases, which must be audited and paid by the state
 8 in the same manner as other expenses of the division are audited
 9 and paid when proper vouchers sworn to by the witnesses and
 10 approved by the secretary are presented. However, a witness
 11 subpoenaed at the instance of parties other than the secretary or
 12 a hearing officer appointed by the secretary is not entitled to any
 13 fee or compensation from the state.

14 Sec. 15. (a) A dealer who is injured by an unfair practice set
 15 forth in IC 9-32-13 or IC 9-32-15 may file a complaint or petition
 16 with the division.

17 (b) A dealer may not file a complaint or petition with the
 18 division under subsection (a) based on an alleged violation of
 19 IC 9-32-13 or IC 9-32-15 by a manufacturer or distributor unless
 20 the dealer serves a demand for mediation upon the manufacturer
 21 or distributor:

22 (1) before; or

23 (2) at the same time as;

24 filing the complaint or petition. A demand for mediation must be
 25 in writing and served upon the manufacturer or distributor by
 26 certified mail at an address designated for the manufacturer or
 27 distributor in the licensor's records. The demand for mediation
 28 must contain a brief statement of the dispute and the relief sought
 29 by the dealer serving the demand.

30 (c) Not later than twenty (20) days after the date the demand for
 31 mediation is served under subsection (b), the parties shall mutually
 32 select an independent mediator and meet with the mediator for the
 33 purpose of attempting to resolve the dispute. The meeting place
 34 must be within Indiana at a location selected by the mediator. The
 35 mediator may extend the period in which the meeting must occur
 36 for good cause shown by either party or upon stipulation of the
 37 parties.

38 Chapter 17. Penalties and Disciplinary Action

39 Sec. 1. Except as provided in section 8 of this chapter, a person
 40 who violates this article, a rule established under this article, or an
 41 order issued by the secretary under this article is subject to a civil
 42 penalty of up to ten thousand dollars (\$10,000) for each act of

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1 violation. Civil penalties recovered under this section shall be paid
 2 to the state and deposited into the dealer enforcement account
 3 established by IC 9-32-7-2.

4 Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsections (b) and (c), a person
 5 who violates IC 9-32-4 commits a Class C infraction.

6 (b) A person who knowingly or intentionally violates
 7 IC 9-32-4-1(a)(1), IC 9-32-4-1(a)(2), IC 9-32-4-1(a)(4),
 8 IC 9-32-4-1(a)(5), or IC 9-32-4-1(d) commits a Class B
 9 misdemeanor.

"SECTION 3. IC 8-14-10-9, AS AMENDED BY P.L.246-2005, SECTION 78, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 9. (a) The crossroads 2000 fund is established for the purpose of constructing or reconstructing state highways. The crossroads 2000 fund consists of distributions received under IC 9-29-1-2, IC 9-29-15-1, IC 9-29-15-3, ~~and~~ IC 9-29-15-4, ~~and~~ **IC 9-29-17-14.**

(b) The crossroads 2000 fund shall be administered by the department. The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the crossroads 2000 fund not currently needed to meet the obligations of the crossroads 2000 fund in the same manner as other public funds may be invested.

(c) Money in the crossroads 2000 fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund.

(4) Engineering and legal expenses and the costs of plans, specifications, surveys, estimates, and any necessary feasibility studies.

(5) Payment of rentals and performance of other obligations under contracts or leases securing bonds issued under IC 8-14.5-6."
