MR. SPEAKER:

*Your Committee on Courts and Criminal Code, to which was referred Senate Bill 496, has had the same under consideration and begs leave to report the same back to the House with the recommendation that said bill **be amended** as follows:*

- 1 Page 1, between the enacting clause and line 1, begin a new
- 2 paragraph and insert:
- 3 "SECTION 1. IC 34-30-2-152.3, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2006,
- 4 SECTION 525, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
- 5 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 152.3. IC 35-48-4-14.7 (Concerning
- 6 a **pharmacy or NPLeX** retailer who discloses information concerning
- 7 the sale of a product containing ephedrine or pseudoephedrine)."
- 8 Page 4, delete lines 26 through 42, begin a new paragraph and
- 9 insert:
- 10 "(b) A person who possesses more than ten (10) grams of ephedrine,
- 11 pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine, pure or adulterated,
- 12 commits a Class D felony. However, the offense is a Class C felony if
- 13 the person possessed:
- 14 (1) a firearm while possessing more than ten (10) grams of
- 15 ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or phenylpropanolamine, pure or
- 16 adulterated; or

- 1 (2) more than ten (10) grams of ephedrine, pseudoephedrine, or
- 2 phenylpropanolamine, pure or adulterated, in, on, or within one
- 3 thousand (1,000) feet of:
- 4 (A) school property;
- 5 (B) a public park;
- 6 (C) a family housing complex; or
- 7 (D) a youth program center."
- 8 Page 5, delete lines 1 through 15.
- 9 Page 6, line 37, delete "(IC 35-48-4-14.5(b));" and insert
- 10 **"(subsection (b));"**.
- 11 Page 6, line 40, delete "(IC 35-48-4-14.5(c));" and insert
- 12 **"(subsection (c));"**.
- 13 Page 7, line 1, delete "(IC 35-48-4-14.5(e));" and insert
- 14 **"(subsection (e));"**.
- 15 Page 7, line 2, delete "(IC 35-48-4-14.5(g));" and insert
- 16 **"(subsection (g));"**.
- 17 Page 11, line 12, reset in roman "retailer".
- 18 Renumber all SECTIONS consecutively.

Correction.)
