

COMMITTEE REPORT

Mr. Speaker: Pursuant to Joint Rule 20, your Committee on Rules and Legislative Procedures, to which was referred Engrossed Senate Bill 273 because it conflicts with SEA 558-2013, SEA 589-2013, SEA 590-2013, HEA 1135-2013, and HEA 1242-2013, without properly recognizing the existence of SEA 558-2013, SEA 589-2013, SEA 590-2013, HEA 1135-2013, and HEA 1242-2013, has had Engrossed Senate Bill 273 under consideration and begs leave to report back to the House with the recommendation that Engrossed Senate Bill 273 be corrected as follows:

 28 hospital under the supervision of the hospital's staff or in a
 29 program approved by the medical school.

- 32 acts, decisions, or judgment of the licensed physician. However, if the
- 33 direction or control is done by the entity under IC 34-30-15 (or
- 34 IC 34-4-12.6 before its repeal), the entity is excluded from the
- 35 application of this article as it relates to the unlawful practice of
- 36 medicine or osteopathic medicine.
- 37 (d) This subsection does not apply to a prescription or drug order for
- 38 a legend drug that is filled or refilled in a pharmacy owned or operated
- 39 by a hospital licensed under IC 16-21. A physician licensed in Indiana
- 40 who permits or authorizes a person to fill or refill a prescription or drug

1 order for a legend drug except as authorized in IC 16-42-19-11 through
 2 IC 16-42-19-19 is subject to disciplinary action under IC 25-1-9. A
 3 person who violates this subsection commits the unlawful practice of
 4 medicine under this chapter.

 6 to dispense contraceptives or birth control devices.

 10 intentionally violates this article by unlawfully practicing medicine or
 11 osteopathic medicine commits a Class C felony.

12 (b) A person who, before January 1, 2014, practices midwifery
 13 without the license required under this article commits a Class D
 14 felony.

15 (c) A person who knowingly or intentionally acts as a physician
 16 assistant without the license required under IC 25-27.5 commits a Class
 17 D felony.
