
SENATE BILL No. 333

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 20-19-3-6; IC 20-30; IC 20-34-3.

Synopsis: Physical education; vision screening. Requires each public school and charter school to conduct at least 30 minutes of physical education each day for students, which may be done as part of a class activity. Lengthens the minimum school day by 30 minutes. Requires each school corporation and charter school to: (1) report certain student health data for students in grades 1, 6, and 12 to the state department of health beginning in the 2013-2014 school year; and (2) inform the students' parents of the collection of the data and the right to obtain the data. Requires the state department of health to: (1) develop materials for the school corporation to distribute concerning body mass index; and (2) publish an annual report summarizing the data collected by the school corporations. Requires the state department of health and the state board of education to adopt joint rules to implement these provisions. Requires school corporations to conduct vision screenings of certain students instead of a battery of vision tests.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 20-19-3-6, AS ADDED BY P.L.1-2005, SECTION
- 2 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
- 3 2013]: Sec. 6. (a) The department shall:
- 4 (1) establish a program in health and physical education to
- 5 encourage children in kindergarten through grade 12 to develop:
- 6 (A) healthful living habits;
- 7 (B) an interest in lifetime health and physical fitness; and
- 8 (C) decision making skills in the areas of health and physical
- 9 fitness;
- 10 (2) establish the position of education consultant for health and
- 11 physical education; and
- 12 (3) hire an individual to perform the duties of education
- 13 consultant for health and physical education.
- 14 (b) The education consultant for health and physical education shall:
- 15 (1) plan and develop curricula for health and physical education
- 16 for grades kindergarten through 12;
- 17 (2) **provide assistance to school corporations in developing**



1 **and carrying out the requirements of IC 20-30-5-20; and**

2 ~~(2)~~ **(3)** perform other duties designated by the department.

3 (c) The program in health and physical education must include the
4 following:

5 (1) Local school program development.

6 (2) Technical and inservice training assistance for local schools.

7 (3) Local school initiatives in writing curricula in the areas of
8 health and physical education.

9 (4) Cardiopulmonary resuscitation training using a training
10 program approved by the American Heart Association or an
11 equivalent nationally recognized training program.

12 (d) The department may give grants to or enter into contracts with
13 individuals or school corporations to carry out the purposes of the
14 program in health and physical education.

15 SECTION 2. IC 20-30-2-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.242-2005,
16 SECTION 15, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
17 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 2. (a) A student instructional day in grades 1
18 through 6 consists of at least five (5) hours **and thirty (30) minutes** of
19 instructional time. Except as provided in subsection (b), a student
20 instructional day in grades 7 through 12 consists of at least six (6)
21 hours **and thirty (30) minutes** of instructional time.

22 (b) An instructional day for a school flex program under section 2.2
23 of this chapter consists of a minimum of three (3) hours of instructional
24 time.

25 SECTION 3. IC 20-30-5-20 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
26 AS A **NEW SECTION** TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
27 1, 2013]: **Sec. 20. (a) As used in this section, "school" refers to a**
28 **public school, including a charter school.**

29 **(b) Beginning with the 2013-2014 school year, a school shall**
30 **conduct not less than thirty (30) minutes of physical education each**
31 **regular school day for kindergarten through grade 12. The**
32 **physical education:**

33 **(1) may be divided into two (2) fifteen (15) minute periods;**

34 **(2) may be included as a part of a classroom activity; and**

35 **(3) shall consist of activities that:**

36 **(A) are appropriate to a participant's age and physical and**
37 **mental abilities;**

38 **(B) raise a participant's heart rate; and**

39 **(C) provide strength and endurance training.**

40 SECTION 4. IC 20-34-3-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.161-2009,
41 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
42 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 12. (a) For purposes of this section, ~~"modified~~

1 clinical technique" means a battery of vision tests that includes:

- 2 (1) a visual acuity test to determine an individual's ability to see
3 at various distances;
4 (2) a refractive error test to determine the focusing power of the
5 eye;
6 (3) an ocular health test to determine any external or internal
7 abnormalities of the eye; and
8 (4) a binocular coordination test to determine if the eyes are
9 working together properly. "vision screening" means the testing

10 of visual acuity.

11 (b) The governing body of each school corporation shall conduct a
12 vision screening of:

- 13 (1) an annual vision test, using the modified clinical technique, of
14 each student upon the student's enrollment in either kindergarten
15 or grade 1; and
16 (2) an annual screening test of the visual acuity of each student
17 enrolled in or transferred to grade 3 and grade 8 a student who
18 has transferred into the school corporation; and of all other
19 students
20 (3) a student suspected of having a visual defect.

21 (c) Records of all tests screenings shall be made and continuously
22 maintained by the school corporation to provide information useful in
23 protecting, promoting, and maintaining the health of students. The state
24 department of health and the state board shall adopt joint rules
25 concerning vision testing screening equipment, qualifications of vision
26 testing screening personnel, visual screening procedures, and criteria
27 for failure and referral in the screening tests based on accepted medical
28 practice and standards.

29 (d) The school corporation's governing body and the superintendent
30 shall receive the following information concerning the tests screenings
31 conducted under this section:

- 32 (1) The number of students tested: screened.
33 (2) The number of students who passed a test: screening.
34 (3) The number of students who failed a test screening or were
35 referred for further testing.

36 (e) Each school corporation shall annually provide to the
37 department, for each school within the school corporation, the
38 following information concerning the tests screenings conducted under
39 this section:

- 40 (1) Whether the tests screenings were conducted at the school.
41 (2) If the tests screenings were not conducted at the school, the
42 reason for not performing the tests: screenings.

- 3 (f) Not later than October 1, ~~2010~~, the department shall report the
 4 information received from school corporations under subsection (e) to
 5 the legislative council in electronic format under IC 5-14-6.
- 6 SECTION 5. IC 20-34-3-21 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
 7 AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY
 8 1, 2013]: **Sec. 21. (a) Beginning in the 2013-2014 school year, each
 9 school corporation and charter school shall collect and record the
 10 height, weight, ethnicity, age, and sex of students in the following
 11 grades:**
- 12 (1) Grade 1.
 13 (2) Grade 6.
 14 (3) Grade 12.
- 15 **The school corporation or charter school shall annually report the
 16 information collected under this subsection to the state department
 17 of health.**
- 18 (b) The school corporation or charter school shall inform in
 19 writing the parent or guardian of a student described in subsection
 20 (a) that the information concerning the student was collected and
 21 that the parent or guardian may obtain the information from the
 22 school the student attends upon request.
- 23 (c) A school corporation or charter school shall report data
 24 collected under subsection (a) according to rules adopted under
 25 this section.
- 26 (d) Data may not be reported under this section in a way that
 27 makes students personally identifiable.
- 28 (e) The data collected under this section may not be recorded
 29 on:
- 30 (1) a child's report card;
 31 (2) a child's transcript; or
 32 (3) another document from which an individual other than the
 33 child's family or school personnel could determine the identity
 34 of the child.
- 35 (f) The state department of health shall publish and make
 36 available to the public an annual report summarizing data
 37 collected under this section.
- 38 (g) The state department of health shall develop materials for
 39 school corporations and charter schools to distribute that include
 40 the following:
- 41 (1) An explanation of body mass index.
 42 (2) The limitations of body mass index as a measure.

- 3 **(h) The state department of health and the state board shall**
- 4 **adopt joint rules under IC 4-22-2 to implement this section. The**
- 5 **rules must include the following:**
- 6 **(1) Information regarding the importance of accurate**
- 7 **measurements and the collection of measurements for**
- 8 **improving children's health.**
- 9 **(2) Procedures for the measurement of children in a respectful**
- 10 **and dignified manner in a private location where other**
- 11 **students will not see or hear the data being collected.**
