## SENATE BILL No. 429



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 9-21-7-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.34-2010,  
2 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 2. (a) Except as provided in subsection (b) and  
4 section 8 of this chapter, each vehicle upon an Indiana highway:  
5 (1) between the time from sunset to sunrise; and  
6 (2) at any other time when, due to insufficient light or unfavorable  
7 atmospheric conditions, **including fog and rainfall that requires**  
8 **the use of windshield wipers**, persons and vehicles on the  
9 highway are not clearly discernible at a distance of five hundred  
10 (500) feet ahead;  
11 must display lighted head lamps and other illuminating devices as  
12 required for different classes of vehicles under this chapter.  
13 (b) All lamp equipment required for vehicles described in IC 9-19-6,  
14 including each tail lamp required by law, shall be lighted at the times  
15 mentioned in subsection (a), except that clearance and sidemarker  
16 lamps are not required to be lighted on a vehicle when the vehicle is  
17 operated within a municipality if there is sufficient light to render



1 clearly discernible persons and vehicles on the highway at a distance  
2 of five hundred (500) feet.
