

SENATE BILL No. 487

DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 14-22-12.

Synopsis: Nonresident shooting preserve hunting fees. Provides that a nonresident who hunts an animal on a shooting preserve shall pay a fee for the hunting license that is equal to the license fee charged to a resident. Provides that fees from nonresident licenses to hunt on a shooting preserve are not required to be used by the department of natural resources to increase the upland game bird population.

Effective: July 1, 2013.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning natural and cultural resources.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 14-22-12-2 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 2. **Except for a license**
3 **sold under section 2.5 of this chapter**, the department shall use the
4 following to increase the upland game bird population in Indiana:
5 (1) Four dollars (\$4) from the cost of every nonresident license to
6 hunt any game for any period in any manner.
7 (2) Forty dollars (\$40) from the cost of every nonresident license
8 to hunt deer for any period in any manner.
9 SECTION 2. IC 14-22-12-2.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
10 CODE AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
11 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: **Sec. 2.5. Notwithstanding section 1 of**
12 **this chapter, if a nonresident:**
13 (1) **hunts an animal that is identified under IC 14-22-31-7 and**
14 **for which a hunting license is required; and**
15 (2) **hunts the animal on a shooting preserve licensed under**
16 **IC 14-22-31;**
17 **the nonresident shall pay a fee for the hunting license that is equal**



1 to the license fee charged to a resident.
