

# HOUSE BILL No. 1046

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 10-17.

**Synopsis:** Military family relief fund. Removes the provision under which an Indiana qualified service member is eligible to receive assistance from the military family relief fund for no more than three years.

**Effective:** July 1, 2013.

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## HOUSE BILL No. 1046



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning military and veterans.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 10-17-12-8, AS AMENDED BY P.L.54-2012,  
2 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
3 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 8. (a) The military family relief fund is established  
4 to provide assistance with food, housing, utilities, medical services,  
5 basic transportation, child care, education, employment or workforce,  
6 and other essential family support expenses that have become difficult  
7 to afford for qualified service members or dependents of qualified  
8 service members.

9 (b) Except as provided in section 9 of this chapter, the commission  
10 shall expend the money in the fund exclusively to provide grants for  
11 assistance as described in subsection (a). The director shall each year  
12 provide a report to the budget committee concerning the grant program  
13 under this chapter.

14 (c) A qualified service member or the qualified service member's  
15 dependent may be eligible to receive assistance from the fund. ~~for up~~  
16 ~~to three (3) years after the earlier of the following:~~

17 (†) The date the qualified service member's active duty service

 2 (2) The date, as established by presidential proclamation or by  
 3 law, of the cessation of the national conflict or war with respect  
 4 to which the qualified service member is eligible to receive  
 5 assistance under section 7-5(3)(B) of this chapter.  
 6 (d) The commission shall administer the fund.  
 7 SECTION 2. IC 10-17-13-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.113-2010,  
 8 SECTION 88, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
 9 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 10. (a) The commission shall manage and develop  
 10 the fund and the assets of the fund.  
 11 (b) The commission shall do the following:  
 12 (1) Carry out the duties of the commission set forth in IC 10-17-1.  
 13 (2) Establish a policy for the investment of the assets of the fund.  
 14 In establishing a policy under this subdivision, the commission  
 15 shall:  
 16 (A) establish adequate long term financial goals for the fund;  
 17 and  
 18 (B) provide adequate funding for the military family relief  
 19 fund established by IC 10-17-12-8. ~~during a time of war or~~  
 20 ~~national conflict.~~  
 21 (3) Acquire money for the fund through the solicitation of private  
 22 or public donations and other revenue producing activities.  
 23 (4) Perform other tasks consistent with prudent management and  
 24 development of the fund.

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
