DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 25-23.9; IC 35-51-25-1.

Synopsis: Credentialing of music therapists. Provides that an individual may not profess to be a certified music therapist unless the individual holds and maintains the credentialing administered by the Certification Board for Music Therapists (CBMT). Provides that an individual who practices music therapy without the CBMT credentialing commits a Class B misdemeanor. Makes a technical correction.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning professions and occupations.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 25-23.9 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS
2 A **NEW** ARTICLE TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1,
3 2013]:

4 **ARTICLE 23.9. MUSIC THERAPISTS**

5 **Chapter 1. Definitions**

6 **Sec. 1. As used in this article, "music therapy" means the**
7 **clinical and evidence-based use of music interventions to**
8 **accomplish individualized goals within a therapeutic relationship.**

9 **Sec. 2. As used in this article, "practitioner" means a person**
10 **who holds:**

- 11 (1) **an unlimited certificate;**
- 12 (2) **a limited or probationary certificate;**
- 13 (3) **a temporary certificate; or**
- 14 (4) **an intern certificate;**

15 **issued by a board regulating a profession or an occupation.**

16 **Chapter 2. Activity by Noncertified Individuals**

17 **Sec. 1. This chapter does not prohibit a practitioner from**



1 performing music therapy functions if the practitioner is acting
2 within the scope of the practitioner's certificate.

3 **Sec. 2. Except as provided in section 1 of this chapter, an**
4 **individual may not:**

5 (1) profess to be a certified music therapist or a music
6 therapist;

7 (2) use the initials "MT-BC" or any other words, letters,
8 abbreviations, or insignia indicating or implying that the
9 individual is a certified music therapist; or

10 (3) practice music therapy;

11 unless the individual holds and maintains the credentialing
12 administered by the Certification Board for Music Therapists.

13 **Sec. 3. An individual who recklessly, knowingly, or intentionally**
14 **violates section 2 of this chapter commits a Class B misdemeanor.**
