DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 9-30-10-5.

Synopsis: Habitual violators of traffic laws. Provides that the bureau of motor vehicles may not suspend a person's driving privileges for being a habitual violator of traffic laws unless the bureau mails a notice concerning the suspension to the person not more than two years after the date the person accumulated the most recent judgment that made the person a habitual violator.

Effective: July 1, 2013.

HOUSE BILL No. 1059



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning motor vehicles.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 9-30-10-5 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
2 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 5. (a) If it appears from
3 the records maintained in the bureau that a person's driving record
4 makes the person a habitual violator under section 4 of this chapter, the
5 bureau shall, **not more than two (2) years after the date on which**
6 **the person accumulated the most recent judgment that makes the**
7 **person a habitual violator under section 4 of this chapter**, mail a
8 **notice** to the person's last known address **a notice** that informs the
9 person that the person's driving privileges will be suspended in thirty
10 (30) days because the person is a habitual violator according to the
11 records of the bureau.

12 (b) Thirty (30) days after the bureau has mailed a notice under this
13 section, the bureau shall suspend the person's driving privileges for:

- 14 (1) except as provided in subdivision (2), ten (10) years if the
15 person is a habitual violator under section 4(a) of this chapter;
- 16 (2) life if the person is a habitual violator under section 4(a) of
17 this chapter and has at least two (2) violations under section



1 4(a)(4) through 4(a)(7) of this chapter;
2 (3) ten (10) years if the person is a habitual violator under section
3 4(b) of this chapter; or
4 (4) five (5) years if the person is a habitual violator under section
5 4(c) of this chapter;
6 **if the bureau satisfied all the requirements concerning the notice**
7 **set forth in subsection (a).**
8 (c) The notice must inform the person that the person may be
9 entitled to relief under section 6 of this chapter or may seek judicial
10 review of the person's suspension under this chapter.
