DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 22-12-11.

Synopsis: Toylike lighters. Makes the retail sale or distribution of a toylike lighter a Class C infraction. Provides that the state fire marshal or a designated law enforcement officer may enforce toylike lighter laws. Authorizes the fire prevention and building safety commission to adopt rules to implement the toylike lighter law.

Effective: Upon passage.

HOUSE BILL No. 1078



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning public safety.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 22-12-11 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
2 AS A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 UPON PASSAGE]:
4 **Chapter 11. Toylike Lighters**
5 **Sec. 1. It is the intent of the general assembly, by this chapter,**
6 **to protect the public welfare and promote safety throughout**
7 **Indiana. In enacting this chapter, the general assembly finds the**
8 **following:**
9 (1) **Toylike lighters have features that are attractive to**
10 **children, including visual effects, flashing lights, musical**
11 **sounds, and toylike designs.**
12 (2) **The federal Consumer Product Safety commission has**
13 **recalled thousands of toylike lighters since 1996 due to the**
14 **dangers of toylike lighters to public safety.**
15 (3) **In Indiana and the United States, fire setting by children**
16 **has resulted in several deaths and millions of dollars in**
17 **property damage and destruction.**



1 **Sec. 2. As used in this chapter, "toylike lighter" means a**
 2 **mechanical or electrical device typically used for lighting**
 3 **cigarettes, cigars, or pipes that is designed to resemble a cartoon**
 4 **character, toy, gun, watch, musical instrument, vehicle, animal,**
 5 **food, beverage, or similar article, or that plays musical notes, has**
 6 **flashing lights for entertainment, or has other entertaining**
 7 **features. A toylike lighter may operate on any fuel, including**
 8 **butane, isobutane, or liquid fuel. The term does not include the**
 9 **following:**

10 (1) A lighter manufactured before January 1, 1980.

11 (2) A lighter incapable of being fueled or lacking a device
 12 necessary to produce combustion or a flame.

13 (3) Any mechanical or electrical device primarily used to
 14 ignite fuel for fireplaces or for charcoal or gas grills.

15 (4) Standard disposable and refillable lighters that are printed
 16 or decorated with logos, labels, decals, artwork, or heat
 17 shrinkable sleeves.

18 **Sec. 3. (a) An individual may not:**

19 (1) sell at retail;

20 (2) offer for retail sale; or

21 (3) distribute for retail sale or promotion in Indiana;

22 **a toylike lighter.**

23 (b) An individual who violates this section commits a Class C
 24 **infraction.**

25 **Sec. 4. The prohibition in section 3 of this chapter does not apply**
 26 **to the transportation of toylike lighters through Indiana or the**
 27 **storage of toylike lighters in a warehouse or distribution center in**
 28 **Indiana that is closed to the public for purposes of retail sales.**

29 **Sec. 5. This chapter may be enforced by:**

30 (1) the state fire marshal or the state fire marshal's designee;

31 (2) a state, county, or municipal law enforcement officer; or

32 (3) a municipal code enforcement officer.

33 **Sec. 6. The commission may adopt rules under IC 4-22-2 to**
 34 **implement this chapter.**

35 **SECTION 2. An emergency is declared for this act.**
