

# HOUSE BILL No. 1087

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 8-2.1-24-3.

**Synopsis:** Transportation of household effects and furniture. Provides that the law regarding certification of motor carriers providing intrastate transportation of property by motor vehicle does not apply to motor vehicles that are used to provide transportation for household effects or furniture for compensation.

**Effective:** July 1, 2013.

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# HOUSE BILL No. 1087



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning transportation.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 8-2.1-24-3, AS AMENDED BY P.L.9-2010,  
 2 SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE  
 3 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 3. Except as provided in section 18 of this chapter,  
 4 this chapter does not apply to the following:  
 5 (1) Motor vehicles used exclusively for carrying United States  
 6 mail.  
 7 (2) Motor vehicles while being used or operated under the  
 8 control, direction, and supervision of:  
 9 (A) the United States government, the state, or a political  
 10 subdivision; or  
 11 (B) the board of trustees of a state institution.  
 12 (3) Motor vehicles while transporting supplies, livestock feed  
 13 ingredients, fertilizer, or fertilizing materials that are in transit to  
 14 or from farms.  
 15 (4) Motor vehicles:  
 16 (A) controlled and operated by a farmer when used in the  
 17 transportation of the farmer's agricultural commodities and



- 1 products of those commodities or in the transportation of  
 2 supplies to the farm;
- 3 (B) controlled and operated by a nonprofit agricultural  
 4 cooperative association (or by a federation of agricultural  
 5 cooperative associations if the federation does not possess  
 6 greater powers or purposes than the cooperative associations);  
 7 (C) used in carrying property consisting of livestock or  
 8 agricultural commodities (not including manufactured  
 9 products) if the motor vehicles are not used in carrying:
- 10 (i) other property;  
 11 (ii) agricultural commodities; or  
 12 (iii) passengers;  
 13 for compensation; or
- 14 (D) used in carrying livestock feed or feed ingredients, if those  
 15 products are transported to a site of agricultural productions or  
 16 to a business enterprise engaged in the sale of agricultural  
 17 goods to a person engaged in agricultural production.
- 18 This chapter shall not be construed to apply to motor vehicles  
 19 owned, leased, controlled, or operated by a nonprofit cooperative  
 20 association, either incorporated or unincorporated, that was in  
 21 existence on July 6, 1961.
- 22 (5) Motor vehicles, commonly known as armored cars, used  
 23 exclusively to transport, under written bilateral contract, coin,  
 24 currency, bullion, securities, precious metals, jewelry, precious  
 25 stones, money, legal tender, stocks and bonds, negotiable and  
 26 nonnegotiable instruments and securities, postage and revenue  
 27 stamps, and other valuable documents and rare objects.
- 28 (6) Motor vehicles operating exclusively in intrastate commerce  
 29 that have a gross vehicle weight, gross vehicle weight rating,  
 30 gross combination weight, or gross combination weight rating  
 31 equal to or less than twenty-six thousand (26,000) pounds.  
 32 However, the motor vehicle may not be:
- 33 (A) used to provide for-hire transport;  
 34 (B) designed or used to transport sixteen (16) or more  
 35 passengers, including the driver; or  
 36 (C) used to transport hazardous material in amounts requiring  
 37 a placard.
- 38 **(7) Motor vehicles that are used to provide transportation for**  
 39 **household effects or furniture for compensation.**

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
