DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

Citations Affected: IC 6-9-24-8.

Synopsis: Use of food and beverage taxes. Authorizes Nashville to use its food and beverage taxes to finance, construct, improve, equip, operate, and maintain sidewalks and other streetscape improvements.

HOUSE BILL No. 1133



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning taxation.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

1 SECTION 1. IC 6-9-24-8 IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
2 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 8. (a) If a tax is imposed under
3 section 3 of this chapter, the fiscal body of the municipality shall
4 establish a food and beverage tax receipts fund.
5 (b) The fiscal officer of the municipality shall deposit in this fund
6 all amounts received under this chapter.
7 (c) Any money earned from the investment of money in the fund
8 becomes a part of the fund.
9 (d) Money in this fund shall be used by the municipality ~~solely~~ to:
10 (1) finance, construct, improve, equip, operate, and maintain
11 public parking and public restroom facilities; ~~or to~~
12 (2) renovate, equip, operate, and maintain any structure that may
13 be used as a public parking or public restroom facility; ~~or~~
14 (3) **finance, construct, improve, equip, operate, and maintain**
15 **sidewalks and other streetscape improvements.**
16 The municipality may enter into lease or contractual arrangements, or
17 both, with governmental, not-for-profit, or other private entities to



- 1 operate and maintain these facilities **and improvements.**
