

# HOUSE BILL No. 1466

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## DIGEST OF INTRODUCED BILL

**Citations Affected:** IC 12-8-15.

**Synopsis:** Social workers in school programs. Requires the office of the secretary of family and social services to develop and implement an evidence-based program model that partners with elementary and high schools to provide social services to children, parents, caregivers, teachers, and the community. Allows the office of the secretary to contract with an entity to implement the program model and sets forth requirements that the contractor must meet.

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## HOUSE BILL No. 1466



A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning human services.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1 SECTION 1. IC 12-8-15 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE AS  
2 A **NEW** CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
3 1, 2013]:

4 **Chapter 15. Social Services Programs in Schools**

5 **Sec. 1. (a) The office of the secretary shall develop and**  
6 **implement an evidence-based program model that partners with**  
7 **elementary schools (as defined in IC 20-18-2-4) and high schools**  
8 **(as defined in IC 20-18-2-7) to provide social services to children,**  
9 **parents, caregivers, teachers, and the community to prevent**  
10 **substance abuse, promote healthy behaviors, and maximize student**  
11 **success.**

12 **(b) The program model developed under this chapter must**  
13 **include the following:**

- 14 **(1) Substance abuse counseling and prevention, including:**  
15 **(A) problem identification;**  
16 **(B) programs and strategies;**  
17 **(C) referral to community resources;**



- 1 (D) post treatment care; and  
 2 (E) case management.  
 3 (2) Assistance for children who are at-risk for dropping out of  
 4 school.  
 5 (3) Grief counseling and suicide prevention.  
 6 (4) Parenting skills and family communication education.  
 7 (5) Social skills education and development.  
 8 (c) The office of the secretary may initiate the program model  
 9 required by this section as a pilot project in the southwestern  
 10 region of Indiana.  
 11 Sec. 2. (a) The office of the secretary may contract with an  
 12 entity to provide services for the program model described in  
 13 section 1 of this chapter. The entity must meet the following  
 14 requirements:  
 15 (1) Be a nonprofit organization that is qualified as exempt  
 16 from federal income taxation under Section 501(c)(3) of the  
 17 Internal Revenue Code.  
 18 (2) Be incorporated or registered in Indiana as a business with  
 19 at least five (5) years of experience in providing  
 20 evidence-based prevention programs and social work services  
 21 in a school setting.  
 22 (3) Employ at least ten (10) individuals with a master's degree  
 23 in social work to provide evidence-based programs and  
 24 strategies that meet the needs of children, families, and  
 25 teachers in school settings.  
 26 (4) Partner with schools, churches, and other entities to  
 27 provide services to children and families.  
 28 (5) Provide independent evaluations that demonstrate the  
 29 entity's success at:  
 30 (A) reducing risk factors;  
 31 (B) improving protective factors;  
 32 (C) increasing resiliency; and  
 33 (D) decreasing the individual concerns;  
 34 of students.  
 35 (b) If the office of the secretary contracts with an entity under  
 36 subsection (a), the office of the secretary shall contract with an  
 37 independent third party to do the following:  
 38 (1) Evaluate the outcomes of the contractor's program model.  
 39 (2) Prepare an annual report measuring the contractor's  
 40 outcomes and assessing the effect of the program model.  
 41 The office of the secretary shall provide a copy of the report  
 42 required by this subsection to the legislative council in an
