SENATE BILL No. 1

DIGEST OF SB 1 (Updated February 15, 2013 8:46 am - DI 58)

Citations Affected: IC 5-2; IC 10-19; IC 20-26.

Synopsis: School resource officers. Specifies how a school resource officer program may be established and sets forth duties and responsibilities for school resource officers. Provides that a person, before being appointed as a school resource officer, must successfully complete the training requirements for law enforcement officers and receive 40 hours of certified school resource officer training. Establishes the Indiana secured school fund under the administration of the department of homeland security to provide matching grants to enable school corporations and charter schools to establish programs to: (1) employ school resource officers; (2) conduct threat assessments of school buildings; or (3) purchase safety equipment and technology. Creates the secured school safety board to approve or disapprove applications for matching grants from the fund and to develop best practices for school resource officers. Provides that a matching grant from the fund may not exceed the lesser of: (1) 50% of the total costs of the funded program; or (2) \$50,000 per year. Specifies that, to be awarded a matching grant, a school (including a coalition of schools applying jointly) must have an ADM of at least 1,000, and that a school may receive only one matching grant each year. Eliminates the use of the safe school fund for purchasing equipment for the detection of firearms and other weapons, using dogs to detect firearms and explosives, and purchasing other equipment and materials used to enhance the safety of schools.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 5-2-10.1-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.106-2005,
2 SECTION 1, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 2. (a) The Indiana safe schools fund is
4 established to do the following:
- 5 (1) Promote school safety through the **use of dogs trained to**
6 **detect drugs and illegal substances.**
 - 7 (A) ~~purchase of equipment for the detection of firearms and~~
8 ~~other weapons;~~
 - 9 (B) ~~use of dogs trained to detect firearms, drugs, explosives,~~
10 ~~and illegal substances; and~~
 - 11 (C) ~~purchase of other equipment and materials used to~~
12 ~~enhance the safety of schools.~~
 - 13 (2) Combat truancy.
 - 14 (3) Provide matching grants to schools for school safe haven
15 programs.
 - 16 (4) Provide grants for school safety and safety plans.
 - 17 (5) Provide educational outreach and training to school personnel

- 2 (A) the identification of;

6 (b) The fund consists of amounts deposited:

- 7 (1) under IC 33-37-9-4; and
 8 (2) from any other public or private source.

9 (c) The institute shall determine grant recipients from the fund with
 10 a priority on awarding grants in the following order:

- 11 (1) A grant for a safety plan.
 12 (2) A safe haven grant requested under section 10 of this chapter.
 13 (3) A safe haven grant requested under section 7 of this chapter.

14 (d) Upon recommendation of the council, the institute shall establish
 15 a method for determining the maximum amount a grant recipient may
 16 receive under this section.

17 SECTION 2. IC 5-2-10.1-9 IS AMENDED TO READ AS
 18 FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 9. (a) Each school
 19 corporation shall designate an individual to serve as the school safety
 20 specialist for the school corporation. **A school resource officer (as**
 21 **described in IC 20-26-18-1) may serve as a school safety specialist.**

22 (b) The school safety specialist shall be chosen by the
 23 superintendent of the school corporation with the approval of the
 24 governing body.

25 (c) The school safety specialist shall perform the following duties:

- 26 (1) Serve on the county school safety commission, if a county
 27 school safety commission is established under section 10 of this
 28 chapter.
 29 (2) Participate each year in a number of days of school safety
 30 training that the council determines.
 31 (3) With the assistance of the county school safety commission,
 32 if a county school safety commission is established under section
 33 10 of this chapter, develop a safety plan for each school in the
 34 school corporation.
 35 (4) Coordinate the safety plans of each school in the school
 36 corporation as required under rules adopted by the Indiana state
 37 board of education.
 38 (5) Act as a resource for other individuals in the school
 39 corporation on issues related to school discipline, safety, and
 40 security.

41 SECTION 3. IC 5-2-10.1-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.2-2006,
 42 SECTION 11, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE

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1 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 10. (a) A county may establish a county
2 school safety commission.
3 (b) The members of the commission are as follows:
4 (1) The school safety specialist for each school corporation
5 located in whole or in part in the county.
6 (2) The judge of the court having juvenile jurisdiction in the
7 county or the judge's designee.
8 (3) The sheriff of the county or the sheriff's designee.
9 (4) The chief officer of every other law enforcement agency in the
10 county, or the chief officer's designee.
11 (5) A representative of the juvenile probation system, appointed
12 by the judge described under subdivision (2).
13 (6) Representatives of community agencies that work with
14 children within the county.
15 (7) A representative of the Indiana state police district that serves
16 the county.
17 (8) A representative of the Prosecuting Attorneys Council of
18 Indiana who specializes in the prosecution of juveniles.
19 (9) Other appropriate individuals selected by the commission.
20 (c) If a commission is established, the school safety specialist of the
21 school corporation having the largest ADM (as defined in
22 IC 20-18-2-2) in the county shall convene the initial meeting of the
23 commission.
24 (d) The members shall annually elect a chairperson.
25 (e) A commission shall perform the following duties:
26 (1) Perform a cumulative analysis of school safety needs within
27 the county.
28 (2) Coordinate and make recommendations for the following:
29 (A) Prevention of juvenile offenses and improving the
30 reporting of juvenile offenses within the schools.
31 (B) Proposals for identifying and assessing children who are
32 at high risk of becoming juvenile offenders.
33 (C) Methods to meet the educational needs of children who
34 have been detained as juvenile offenders.
35 (D) Methods to improve communications among agencies that
36 work with children.
37 (E) Methods to improve security and emergency preparedness.
38 (F) Additional equipment or personnel that are necessary to
39 carry out safety plans.
40 (G) Any other topic the commission considers necessary to
41 improve school safety within the school corporations within
42 the commission's jurisdiction.

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1 (3) Provide assistance to the school safety specialists on the
2 commission in developing and requesting grants for safety plans.

3 (4) Provide assistance to the school safety specialists on the
4 commission and the participating school corporations in
5 developing and requesting grants for school safe haven programs
6 under section 7 of this chapter.

7 (5) Assist each participating school corporation in carrying out
8 the school corporation's safety plans.

9 **(6) Provide assistance to a school resource officer in**
10 **developing and implementing the comprehensive local school**
11 **safety plan (as described in IC 20-26-18-2).**

12 (f) The affirmative votes of a majority of the voting members of the
13 commission are required for the commission to take action on a
14 measure.

15 SECTION 4. IC 5-2-10.1-12, AS AMENDED BY P.L.132-2007,
16 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
17 UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 12. (a) Each school within a school
18 corporation shall establish a safe school committee. The committee
19 may be a subcommittee of the committee that develops the strategic
20 and continuous school improvement and achievement plan under
21 IC 20-31-5.

22 (b) The department of education, ~~and~~ the school corporation's school
23 safety specialist, **and, upon request, a school resource officer (as**
24 **described in IC 20-26-18-1)** shall provide materials to assist a safe
25 school committee in developing a plan for the school that addresses the
26 following issues:

27 (1) Unsafe conditions, crime prevention, school violence,
28 bullying, and other issues that prevent the maintenance of a safe
29 school.

30 (2) Professional development needs for faculty and staff to
31 implement methods that decrease problems identified under
32 subdivision (1).

33 (3) Methods to encourage:

34 (A) involvement by the community and students;

35 (B) development of relationships between students and school
36 faculty and staff; and

37 (C) use of problem solving teams.

38 (c) As a part of the plan developed under subsection (b), each safe
39 school committee shall provide a copy of the floor plans for each
40 building located on the school's property that clearly indicates each
41 exit, the interior rooms and hallways, and the location of any hazardous
42 materials located in the building to the law enforcement agency and the

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1 fire department that have jurisdiction over the school, **and to the**
 2 **department of homeland security established by IC 10-19-2-1.**

3 SECTION 5. IC 10-19-11 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
 4 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 5 UPON PASSAGE]:

6 **Chapter 11. School Safety**

7 **Sec. 1. The following definitions apply throughout this chapter:**

8 (1) "ADM" refers to average daily membership determined
 9 under IC 20-43-4-2.

10 (2) "Board" refers to the secured school safety board
 11 established by section 3 of this chapter.

12 (3) "Fund" refers to the Indiana secured school fund
 13 established by section 2 of this chapter.

14 (4) "Local plan" means the comprehensive local school safety
 15 plan described in IC 20-26-18-2.

16 (5) "School corporation or charter school" includes:

17 (A) a coalition of school corporations;

18 (B) a coalition of charter schools; or

19 (C) a coalition of both school corporations and charter
 20 schools;

21 that intend to jointly employ a school resource officer or to
 22 jointly apply for a matching grant under this chapter, unless
 23 the context clearly indicates otherwise.

24 (6) "School resource officer" has the meaning set forth in
 25 IC 20-26-18-1.

26 **Sec. 2. (a) The Indiana secured school fund is established to**
 27 **provide matching grants to enable school corporations and charter**
 28 **schools to establish programs under which a school corporation or**
 29 **charter school (or a coalition of schools) will:**

30 (1) employ a school resource officer or enter into a contract or
 31 a memorandum of understanding with a:

32 (A) local law enforcement agency;

33 (B) private entity; or

34 (C) nonprofit corporation;

35 to employ a school resource officer;

36 (2) conduct a threat assessment of the buildings within a
 37 school corporation or operated by a charter school; or

38 (3) purchase equipment and technology to:

39 (A) restrict access to school property; or

40 (B) expedite notification of first responders.

41 (b) The fund shall be administered by the department.

42 (c) The fund consists of:

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- 1 (1) appropriations from the general assembly;
 2 (2) grants from the safe schools fund established by
 3 IC 5-2-10.1-2;
 4 (3) federal grants; and
 5 (4) amounts deposited from any other public or private
 6 source.

7 (d) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
 8 money in the fund.

9 (e) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not
 10 currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same
 11 manner as other public money may be invested. Interest that
 12 accrues from these investments shall be deposited in the fund.

13 (f) Money in the fund at the end of a state fiscal year does not
 14 revert to the state general fund.

15 **Sec. 3. (a) The secured school safety board is established to:**

- 16 (1) approve or disapprove applications for matching grants to
 17 fund programs described in section 2(a) of this chapter;
 18 (2) evaluate local plans submitted by school resource officers;
 19 and
 20 (3) develop best practices for a school resource officer to
 21 employ in order to successfully carry out the officer's
 22 responsibilities under IC 20-26-18-1(a)(2).

23 (b) The board consists of five (5) members appointed as follows:

- 24 (1) The executive director or the executive director's designee.
 25 The executive director or designee will serve as the
 26 chairperson of the board.
 27 (2) The attorney general or attorney general's designee.
 28 (3) An employee of a local school corporation or charter
 29 school appointed by the governor.
 30 (4) A local law enforcement officer appointed by the governor.
 31 (5) The state superintendent of public instruction or the
 32 superintendent's designee.

33 (c) The board shall establish criteria to be used in evaluating
 34 applications for matching grants from the fund. These criteria
 35 must:

- 36 (1) be consistent with the fund's goals; and
 37 (2) provide for an equitable distribution of grants to school
 38 corporations and charter schools located throughout Indiana.

39 **Sec. 4. (a) The board may award a matching grant to enable a**
 40 **school corporation or charter school (or a coalition of schools**
 41 **applying jointly) to establish a program to employ a school**
 42 **resource officer, conduct a threat assessment, or purchase**

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1 equipment to restrict access to the school or expedite the
 2 notification of first responders in accordance with section 2(a) of
 3 this chapter.

4 (b) A matching grant awarded to a school corporation or
 5 charter school under this section may not exceed the lesser of:

6 (1) fifty percent (50%) of the total costs of the program; or

7 (2) fifty thousand dollars (\$50,000) per year;

8 for a two (2) year period beginning on or after May 1, 2013.

9 (c) A school corporation or charter school may receive only one
 10 (1) matching grant under this section each year.

11 Sec. 5. (a) A school corporation or charter school may annually
 12 apply to the board for a matching grant from the fund for a
 13 program described in section 2(a) of this chapter. A school
 14 corporation or charter school may apply to the board for a
 15 matching grant from the fund only if the school corporation or
 16 charter school (or coalition of schools applying jointly) has an
 17 ADM of at least one thousand (1,000).

18 (b) The application must include the following:

19 (1) A concise description of the school corporation's or
 20 charter school's security needs.

21 (2) The estimated cost of the program to the school
 22 corporation or charter school.

23 (3) The extent to which the school corporation or charter
 24 school has access to and support from a nearby law
 25 enforcement agency, if applicable.

26 (4) The ADM of the school corporation or charter school (or
 27 the combined ADM of the coalition of schools applying
 28 jointly).

29 (5) Any other information required by the board.

30 Sec. 6. A school corporation or charter school that is awarded
 31 a matching grant under this chapter is not required to repay or
 32 reimburse the board or fund the amount of the matching grant.

33 Sec. 7. The department shall report before October 1 of each
 34 year to the budget committee concerning matching grants awarded
 35 under this chapter during the previous fiscal year.

36 SECTION 6. IC 20-26-18 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
 37 AS A NEW CHAPTER TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 38 UPON PASSAGE]:

39 **Chapter 18. School Resource Officers**

40 Sec. 1. (a) As used in this chapter, "school resource officer"
 41 means an individual who:

42 (1) has completed the training described in subsection (b); and

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- 1 **(2) is employed by or assigned to one (1) or more school**
- 2 **corporations or charter schools to:**
- 3 **(A) develop and implement the comprehensive local school**
- 4 **safety plan under section 2 of this chapter; and**
- 5 **(B) carry out any additional responsibilities assigned to the**
- 6 **school resource officer in the employment agreement,**
- 7 **contract, or memorandum of understanding to:**
- 8 **(i) protect against outside threats to the physical safety**
- 9 **of students;**
- 10 **(ii) prevent unauthorized access to school property; and**
- 11 **(iii) secure schools against violence and natural disasters.**
- 12 **(b) Before being appointed as a school resource officer, an**
- 13 **individual must have:**
- 14 **(1) successfully completed the minimum training**
- 15 **requirements established for law enforcement officers under**
- 16 **IC 5-2-1-9; and**
- 17 **(2) received at least forty (40) hours of certified school**
- 18 **resource officer training through:**
- 19 **(A) the Indiana law enforcement training board**
- 20 **established by IC 5-2-1-3;**
- 21 **(B) the National Association of School Resource Officers;**
- 22 **(C) a certified school resource officer instructor; or**
- 23 **(D) another organization that offers certified instruction to**
- 24 **school resource officers.**
- 25 **(c) Certified training described in subsection (b)(2) must include**
- 26 **instruction regarding skills, tactics, and strategies necessary to**
- 27 **address the special nature of:**
- 28 **(1) school campuses; and**
- 29 **(2) school building security needs and characteristics.**
- 30 **Sec. 2. (a) A school resource officer may be employed:**
- 31 **(1) by one (1) or more school corporations or charter schools**
- 32 **through a contract between a local law enforcement agency**
- 33 **and the school corporation or school corporations or the**
- 34 **charter school or charter schools;**
- 35 **(2) solely by one (1) or more school corporations or charter**
- 36 **schools;**
- 37 **(3) solely by a local law enforcement agency that assigns the**
- 38 **school resource officer to one (1) or more school corporations**
- 39 **or charter schools through a memorandum of understanding**
- 40 **between the local law enforcement agency and the school**
- 41 **corporation or school corporations or the charter school or**
- 42 **charter schools; or**

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1 (4) through a contract between an Indiana business that
2 employs persons who meet the qualifications of a school
3 resource officer and the school corporation or school
4 corporations or the charter school or charter schools.

5 (b) A contract or memorandum of understanding entered into
6 under subsection (a) must state the nature and scope of a school
7 resource officer's duties and responsibilities. A school resource
8 officer's duties and responsibilities include the duty to develop and
9 implement a comprehensive local school safety plan that will do the
10 following:

11 (1) Protect against outside threats to the physical safety of
12 students.

13 (2) Prevent unauthorized access to school property.

14 (3) Secure schools against violence and natural disasters.

15 (c) A school resource officer shall consult with local law
16 enforcement officials and first responders in developing the
17 comprehensive local school safety plan.

18 (d) A school resource officer shall provide a copy of the
19 comprehensive local school safety plan to the secured school safety
20 board (as established by IC 10-19-11-3) for evaluation.

21 (e) On or before August 1 of each year, each school resource
22 officer, using a format required by the department, shall prepare
23 and file with the department an evaluation report concerning the
24 implementation of the comprehensive local school safety plan at
25 each school at which the school resource officer is employed or to
26 which the school resource officer is assigned.

27 Sec. 3. (a) A school resource officer may:

28 (1) make an arrest;

29 (2) conduct a search or a seizure of a person or property;

30 (3) carry a firearm; and

31 (4) exercise other police powers with respect to the
32 enforcement of Indiana laws.

33 (b) A school resource officer has jurisdiction in every county
34 where the school corporation or charter school employing the
35 officer operates a school. This subsection does not restrict the
36 jurisdiction that a school resource officer may possess due to the
37 officer's employment by a law enforcement agency.

38 SECTION 7. An emergency is declared for this act.
