DIGEST OF SB 105 (Updated January 23, 2013 11:17 am - DI 106)

**Citations Affected:** IC 31-33.

**Synopsis:** Child abuse and neglect inquiries. Provides that when confronted with a potential case of child abuse or neglect, any law enforcement employee, judiciary employee, medical doctor, employee of a medical doctor, or school official may contact a local office of the department of child services to report and inquire about the suspected child abuse or neglect.

**Effective:** July 1, 2013.

## SENATE BILL No. 105

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning family law and juvenile law.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

1           SECTION 1. IC 31-33-1-2 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE  
2 AS A **NEW** SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE JULY  
3 1, 2013]: **Sec. 2. When confronted with a potential case of child**  
4 **abuse or neglect, any:**  
5           (1) **law enforcement employee;**  
6           (2) **judiciary employee;**  
7           (3) **medical doctor or employee of a medical doctor; or**  
8           (4) **school official;**  
9 **may contact a local office of the department to report and inquire**  
10 **about the suspected child abuse or neglect.**
