DIGEST OF SB 401 (Updated January 30, 2013 4:06 pm - DI 110)

Citations Affected: IC 7.1-3.

Synopsis: Microbreweries at trade shows. Allows a microbrewery, with the approval of the alcohol and tobacco commission, to participate in a trade show or an exposition for not more than 45 days in a calendar year.

Effective: July 1, 2013.

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SENATE BILL No. 401

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning alcohol and tobacco.

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:

- 1 SECTION 1. IC 7.1-3-2-7, AS AMENDED BY P.L.71-2012,
2 SECTION 2, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
3 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 7. The holder of a brewer's permit or an
4 out-of-state brewer holding either a primary source of supply permit or
5 an out-of-state brewer's permit may do the following:
6 (1) Manufacture beer.
7 (2) Place beer in containers or bottles.
8 (3) Transport beer.
9 (4) Sell and deliver beer to a person holding a beer wholesaler's
10 permit issued under IC 7.1-3-3.
11 (5) If the brewer's brewery manufactures not more than thirty
12 thousand (30,000) barrels of beer in a calendar year for sale or
13 distribution within Indiana, the permit holder may do the
14 following:
15 (A) Sell and deliver beer to a person holding a retailer or a
16 dealer permit under this title.
17 (B) Be the proprietor of a restaurant.

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- 1 (C) Hold a beer retailer's permit, a wine retailer's permit, or a
 2 liquor retailer's permit for a restaurant established under clause
 3 (B).
 4 (D) Transfer beer directly from the brewery to the restaurant
 5 by means of:
 6 (i) bulk containers; or
 7 (ii) a continuous flow system.
 8 (E) Install a window between the brewery and an adjacent
 9 restaurant that allows the public and the permittee to view both
 10 premises.
 11 (F) Install a doorway or other opening between the brewery
 12 and an adjacent restaurant that provides the public and the
 13 permittee with access to both premises.
 14 (G) Sell the brewery's beer by the glass for consumption on the
 15 premises. Brewers permitted to sell beer by the glass under
 16 this clause must furnish the minimum food requirements
 17 prescribed by the commission.
 18 (H) Sell and deliver beer to a consumer at the permit premises
 19 of the brewer or at the residence of the consumer. The delivery
 20 to a consumer may be made only in a quantity at any one (1)
 21 time of not more than one-half (1/2) barrel, but the beer may
 22 be contained in bottles or other permissible containers.
 23 (I) Sell the brewery's beer as authorized by this section for
 24 carryout on Sunday in a quantity at any one (1) time of not
 25 more than five hundred seventy-six (576) ounces. A brewer's
 26 beer may be sold under this clause at any address for which the
 27 brewer holds a brewer's permit issued under this chapter if the
 28 address is located within the same city boundaries in which the
 29 beer was manufactured.
 30 **(J) With the approval of the commission, participate:**
 31 **(i) individually; or**
 32 **(ii) with other permit holders under this chapter;**
 33 **in a trade show or an exposition at which products of each**
 34 **permit holder participant are displayed, promoted, and**
 35 **sold. The commission may not grant to a holder of a permit**
 36 **under this chapter approval under this clause to**
 37 **participate in a trade show or exposition for more than**
 38 **forty-five (45) days in a calendar year.**
 39 (6) If the brewer's brewery manufactures more than thirty
 40 thousand (30,000) barrels of beer in a calendar year for sale or
 41 distribution within Indiana, the permit holder may own a portion
 42 of the corporate stock of another brewery that:

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- 1 (A) is located in the same county as the brewer's brewery;
- 2 (B) manufactures less than thirty thousand (30,000) barrels of
- 3 beer in a calendar year; and
- 4 (C) is the proprietor of a restaurant that operates under
- 5 subdivision (5).
- 6 (7) Provide complimentary samples of beer that are:
- 7 (A) produced by the brewer; and
- 8 (B) offered to consumers for consumption on the brewer's
- 9 premises.
- 10 (8) Own a portion of the corporate stock of a sports corporation
- 11 that:
- 12 (A) manages a minor league baseball stadium located in the
- 13 same county as the brewer's brewery; and
- 14 (B) holds a beer retailer's permit, a wine retailer's permit, or a
- 15 liquor retailer's permit for a restaurant located in that stadium.
- 16 (9) For beer described in IC 7.1-1-2-3(a)(4):
- 17 (A) may allow transportation to and consumption of the beer
- 18 on the licensed premises; and
- 19 (B) may not sell, offer to sell, or allow sale of the beer on the
- 20 licensed premises.
