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## SENATE BILL No. 418

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DIGEST OF SB 418 (Updated February 15, 2013 12:05 pm - DI 71)

**Citations Affected:** IC 20-24; IC 20-30; IC 20-37.5.

**Synopsis:** Financial literacy instruction. Requires financial literacy instruction in grade 6 through grade 12 in public schools, not including charter schools. Establishes a task force to develop guidelines and model curricula for financial literacy instruction. Establishes a state resource program for financial literacy. Establishes the financial literacy grant fund to assist schools in implementing financial literacy instruction.

**Effective:** July 1, 2013.

A BILL FOR AN ACT to amend the Indiana Code concerning education.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Indiana:*

16 instruction is offered to students in grade 6 through grade 12.

17           **Sec. 3.** (a) The task force shall develop guidelines and model  
18 curricula to carry out this chapter, and present the guidelines and  
19 model curricula to the state board.

20           (b) The state board shall adopt the guidelines and model  
21 curricula.

22           **Sec. 4.** Instruction provided under this chapter must be  
23 appropriate to the grade level in which the information is taught,  
24 and include, between grade 6 and grade 12, skills in the following

  - 27           (A) Making reasonable financial decisions by analyzing

  - 33           (D) Controlling personal information.

  - 37           (A) Developing a plan for spending and saving.
  - 38           (B) Developing a system for keeping and using financial
  - 39           records.
  - 40           (C) Developing a personal financial plan.

  - 42           (A) Identifying the costs and benefits of various types of

- 2 (B) Explaining the purpose of a credit report, including the
- 3 manner in which a credit report is used by lenders.
- 4 (C) Describing the rights of a borrower regarding a credit
- 5 report.
- 6 (D) Identifying methods of avoiding and resolving debt
- 7 problems.
- 8 (E) Reviewing and summarizing federal and state
- 9 consumer protection laws.
- 10 (4) Understanding saving and investing:
- 11 (A) Understanding how saving and investing contribute to
- 12 personal financial well-being.
- 13 (B) Understanding the methods of investing and
- 14 alternatives to investing.
- 15 (C) Understanding how to buy and sell investments.
- 16 (D) Understanding the regulation of financial institutions
- 17 to protect investors.
- 18 **Chapter 3. State Financial Literacy Resource Program**
- 19 **Sec. 1. This chapter applies to a school corporation.**
- 20 **Sec. 2. With assistance from the task force, the department shall**
- 21 **establish a state financial literacy resource program using**
- 22 **designated and identifiable state resources to:**
- 23 (1) support schools in the development of local programs that
- 24 teach financial literacy; and
- 25 (2) provide integrated services to schools, including the
- 26 following:
- 27 (A) Information and materials resource centers.
- 28 (B) Professional development plans and programs.
- 29 (C) Research and development services.
- 30 (D) Technical assistance, including:
- 31 (i) student assessment;
- 32 (ii) program assessment; and
- 33 (iii) program development and implementation.
- 34 **Chapter 4. Financial Literacy Grant Fund**
- 35 **Sec. 1. This chapter applies to a school corporation.**
- 36 **Sec. 2. (a) The financial literacy grant fund is established to**
- 37 **provide grants to schools for the implementation of financial**
- 38 **literacy instruction under this article. The department shall**
- 39 **administer the fund.**
- 40 (b) The expenses of administering the fund shall be paid from
- 41 money in the fund.
- 42 (c) The fund consists of:

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- (1) appropriations from the general assembly;
- (2) gifts, donations, and bequests; and
- (3) grants, including grants from private entities.

(d) The treasurer of state shall invest the money in the fund not currently needed to meet the obligations of the fund in the same manner as other public funds may be invested. Interest that accrues from these investments shall be deposited in the fund.

(e) Money in the fund from sources other than state appropriations at the end of a state fiscal year does not revert to the state general fund.

Sec. 3. A school may apply to the department to receive a grant from the fund in the manner specified by the department.

Sec. 4. A school that receives a grant under this chapter shall submit an annual report to the department that includes the following information:

- (1) The programs or initiatives for which the grant is used.
- (2) The results of the programs for which the grant is used, including aggregated student assessment results, program effectiveness, and student achievement.

**Chapter 5. Financial Literacy Task Force**

Sec. 1. The financial literacy task force is established to:

- (1) develop guidelines and model curricula in financial literacy instruction; and
- (2) oversee the implementation of financial literacy instruction.

Sec. 2. (a) The task force consists of twelve (12) members, appointed by the state superintendent as follows:

- (1) Seven (7) members who hold active teaching licenses under IC 20-28 and who currently teach in grade 6 through grade 12 in content areas related to financial literacy, including mathematics, social studies, business, family and consumer sciences, and economics, recommended by one (1) or more school employee organizations (as defined in IC 20-29-2-14). The number of members that a school employee organization may recommend for appointment to the task force shall be proportional to the number of members of that school employee organization as a percentage of the members of all school employee organizations.
- (2) Five (5) members who represent the banking industry in Indiana, recommended by an Indiana banking industry trade organization.

(b) The organizations set forth in subsection (a) must provide to

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1 the state superintendent an initial list of recommendations for  
2 appointment not later than July 1, 2013.

3 (c) The state superintendent shall develop guidelines for  
4 determining the number of members that a school employee  
5 organization may recommend under subsection (a)(1).

6 Sec. 3. (a) The term of a member is two (2) years.

7 (b) Notwithstanding subsection (a), the initial terms of:

8 (1) four (4) members appointed under section 2(a)(1) of this  
9 chapter; and

10 (2) two (2) members appointed under section 2(a)(2) of this  
11 chapter;

12 as designated by the state superintendent, is one (1) year.

13 (c) A member may be reappointed.

14 Sec. 4. The task force shall meet upon the call of the state  
15 superintendent.

16 Sec. 5. (a) A member of the task force is not entitled to a salary  
17 per diem.

18 (b) A member of the task force is entitled to reimbursement for  
19 traveling expenses and other expenses actually incurred in  
20 connection with the member's duties, as provided in the state travel  
21 policies and procedures established by the Indiana department of  
22 administration and approved by the budget agency.

23 Sec. 6. (a) The task force shall make initial recommendations to  
24 the department and state board concerning guidelines and model  
25 curricula for financial literacy instruction not later than April 1,  
26 2014.

27 (b) The task force shall make an annual report to the  
28 department and state board not later than April 1 of each year.

Page 1, line 3, strike "charter school,".

Page 1, line 4, strike "and accredited nonpublic school".

Page 2, line 25, delete "public schools, including charter" and insert **"a school corporation."**

Page 2, delete line 26.

Page 2, line 32, delete "may" and insert **"shall"**.

Page 3, line 31, delete "public schools, including charter" and insert **"a school corporation."**

Page 3, delete line 32.

Page 4, line 6, delete "only to public schools, including" and insert **"to a school corporation."**

Page 4, delete line 7.

Page 4, delete lines 25 through 26.

Page 5, line 6, delete "the" and insert **"one (1) or more"**.

Page 5, line 7, delete "organization" and insert **"organizations"**.

Page 5, line 7, delete "with the" and insert **". The number of members that a school employee organization may recommend for appointment to the task force shall be proportional to the number of members of that school employee organization as a percentage of the members of all school employee organizations."**
