

**CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORT
DIGEST FOR EHB 1348**

Citations Affected: IC 21-7-13-13.5; IC 21-12; IC 21-13; IC 21-14-6-2; IC 21-18.5-4-5.

Synopsis: Administration of scholarships and grants. Adds a definition of "credit hours". Makes changes to the definition of "academic term". Provides that, beginning on September 1, 2014, the commission for higher education (commission) shall annually publish a schedule of award amounts for the Frank O'Bannon grant and the twenty-first century scholars program (jointly referred to as an "award") based on a recipient's expected family contribution. Provides that the method currently used to determine an award amount expires September 1, 2014. Provides that the commission may offer award incentives based on a student's school performance. Provides that an individual is not eligible for a Frank O'Bannon grant if the individual is eligible to receive a twenty-first century scholarship. Provides that the limit on eligibility is four academic years for: (1) higher education awards; (2) freedom of choice grants; (3) tuition grants from the twenty-first century scholars program; (4) part-time student grant program; (5) insurance education scholarship fund; (6) minority teacher scholarships; (7) special education, occupational therapy, and physical therapy scholarships; (8) National Guard tuition supplement program; (9) tuition exemption for senior citizens; and (10) tuition and fee exemption for the children and surviving spouse of a public safety officer killed in the line of duty. (Current law provides that the limit for eligibility is eight semesters or 12 quarters.) Makes changes to the grade point average requirements for students who receive a higher education award or participate in the twenty-first century scholars program. Repeals provisions relating to: (1) the duties of the Indiana college placement and assessment center; and (2) a requirement that the commission shall provide a statistical report that describes twenty-first century scholar awards. Adds a definition of "degree map". Provides that, not later than August 1, 2013, the commission for higher education (commission) shall develop guidelines to provide a state educational institution guidance for establishing degree maps for each full-time student attending the state educational institution. Requires, for a full-time student that enrolls after July 31, 2014, that a state educational institution develop a degree map based on the student's specific educational objective or course of study. Requires a state educational institution to ensure that courses necessary for the student to comply with the student's degree map are available for the student during the academic term in which the student is required to complete the particular course in accordance with the student's degree map. Provides that a state educational institution must provide a course to the student at no cost during the next academic term in which the course is offered if: (1) the state educational institution does not offer a course that the student must take

to comply with the student's degree map during the current academic term; (2) the timing of the course conflicts with other courses the student is required to take to comply with the student's degree map for the current academic term; or (3) the course is full. Requires the commission to study and evaluate the financial costs for students pursuing postsecondary education and strategies to increase affordability and on time completion of postsecondary programs. Requires the commission to submit a report to the legislative council by November 1, 2013. Makes conforming amendments. **(This conference committee report: (1) makes changes to the definition of "credit hours"; (2) adds a definition of "academic honors student"; (3) adds a definition of "accelerated progress"; (4) makes changes concerning the types of students for whom the commission shall determine award amounts separately; (5) makes changes to provisions relating to additional awards; (6) clarifies that additional award amounts may be reduced if the total amount of base and additional awards exceeds the amount appropriated for that particular year and that the base award may not be reduced from the amount awarded for the previous academic year; (7) removes a provision making a student who receives a twenty-first century scholarship ineligible for a grant from the National Guard tuition supplement or scholarship extension program; (8) changes, from November 1, 2013, to October 1, 2013, the date by which the commission shall develop degree mapping guidelines; (9) provides that a state educational institution is not required to provide a course at no cost if the state educational institution provides an alternative degree map that does not require the student to take the course that semester; and (10) requires the commission for higher education to study certain issues relating to the financial costs for pursuing postsecondary education and on time completion and submit a report to the legislative council by November 1, 2013.)**

Your Conference Committee appointed to confer with a like committee from the House upon Engrossed Senate Amendments to Engrossed House Bill No. 1348 respectfully reports that said two committees have conferred and agreed as follows to wit:

that the House recede from its dissent from all Senate amendments and that the House now concur in all Senate amendments to the bill and that the bill be further amended as follows:

- 1 Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert the following:
- 2 SECTION 1. IC 21-7-13-13.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
- 3 CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
- 4 [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: **Sec. 13.5. "Degree map" refers to**
- 5 **a student reference developed by a state educational institution**
- 6 **under guidelines developed by the commission under IC 21-12-14-1**
- 7 **that provides an academic term by academic term sequence of**
- 8 **course options that will allow a full-time student to complete:**
- 9 **(1) a baccalaureate degree within four (4) academic years; or**
- 10 **(2) an associate degree within two (2) academic years;**
- 11 **in the student's intended field of study. The reference must specify**
- 12 **the expected date that the student will earn a baccalaureate degree**
- 13 **or an associate degree and the academic requirements that a**
- 14 **student should complete each academic year to timely earn a**
- 15 **degree.**
- 16 SECTION 2. IC 21-12-1-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2007, SECTION
- 17 253, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
- 18 SEPTEMBER 1, 2013]: **Sec. 2. "Academic term" means a semester, a**
- 19 **trimester, or a quarter, whichever applies or any other equivalent**
- 20 **term set forth by an eligible institution and used to divide an**
- 21 **academic year into periods in which classes are held.**

1 SECTION 3. IC 21-12-1-7.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
 2 AS A **NEW SECTION** TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 3 UPON PASSAGE]: **Sec. 7.5. "Credit hours" refers to credit hours**
 4 **used in a traditional semester school, in which an associate degree**
 5 **typically requires sixty (60) credit hours and a baccalaureate**
 6 **degree typically requires one hundred twenty (120) credit hours.**

7 SECTION 4. IC 21-12-1.5-0.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
 8 CODE AS A **NEW SECTION** TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 9 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: **Sec. 0.5. This chapter applies to a**
 10 **student who initially enrolls in an eligible institution before**
 11 **September 1, 2013.**

12 SECTION 5. IC 21-12-1.7 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA CODE
 13 AS A **NEW CHAPTER** TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 14 SEPTEMBER 1, 2013]:

15 **Chapter 1.7. Establishment of Award Amounts by the**
 16 **Commission for Higher Education**

17 **Sec. 1. For purposes of this chapter, "academic honors student"**
 18 **refers to a student who:**

- 19 (1) for the student's first academic year, graduated from high
 20 school with an academic honors diploma or technical honors
 21 diploma; or
 22 (2) for a student's most recently concluded academic year that
 23 is after the student's first academic year, maintained a
 24 cumulative grade point average of at least 3.0 on a 4.0 grading
 25 scale or its equivalent as established by the eligible institution.

26 **Sec. 2. For purposes of this chapter, "accelerated progress"**
 27 **means successfully completing:**

- 28 (1) at least thirty-nine (39) credit hours or the equivalent by
 29 the end of the student's first academic year; or
 30 (2) at least seventy-eight (78) credit hours or the equivalent by
 31 the end of the student's second academic year.

32 **Sec. 3. (a) This section applies to an academic year beginning**
 33 **after August 31, 2014. The commission shall publish annually a**
 34 **schedule of award amounts for the higher education award and**
 35 **freedom of choice grant issued under this article. The schedule**
 36 **must provide award amounts on the basis of the recipient's**
 37 **expected family contribution. The expected family contribution**
 38 **shall be derived from information submitted on the recipient's**
 39 **financial aid application form. The commission shall determine**
 40 **award amounts separately for:**

- 41 (1) recipients attending approved public state educational
 42 institutions (except Ivy Tech Community College);
 43 (2) Ivy Tech Community College;
 44 (3) recipients attending a nonprofit college or university listed
 45 in IC 21-7-13-6(c); and
 46 (4) recipients attending approved postsecondary credit
 47 bearing proprietary institutions.

48 (b) The schedule of award amounts published under subsection
 49 (a) shall offer a larger award to a recipient who, as of the student's
 50 most recently concluded academic year, has successfully
 51 completed:

1 (1) at least thirty (30) credit hours or the equivalent by the
2 end of the student's first academic year;

3 (2) at least sixty (60) credit hours or the equivalent by the end
4 of the student's second academic year; or

5 (3) at least ninety (90) credit hours or the equivalent by the
6 end of the student's third academic year.

7 A student's academic years used to determine if the student meets
8 the requirements of this subdivision are not required to be
9 successive calendar years.

10 (c) The schedule of award amounts shall set forth an amount for
11 recipients described in subsection (a)(1) that is equal to fifty
12 percent (50%) of the amount for recipients described in subsection
13 (a)(3).

14 (d) This subsection expires September 1, 2016. A student that
15 initially enrolls in an eligible institution for an academic year
16 beginning before September 1, 2013, is eligible for the larger award
17 determined under subsection (b) regardless of the student's credit
18 completion.

19 Sec. 4. (a) This section applies to a student who initially enrolls
20 in an eligible institution for an academic year beginning after
21 August 31, 2013.

22 (b) The commission shall offer an additional award to a recipient
23 who:

24 (1) is an academic honors student;

25 (2) received an associate degree before enrolling in a
26 baccalaureate degree program; or

27 (3) made accelerated progress during the recipient's most
28 recently concluded academic year.

29 (c) The commission may establish one (1) or more student
30 performance incentives in addition to those listed under subsection
31 (b).

32 (d) The commission shall determine the amount of each
33 incentive bonus annually, based on the available appropriation.

34 Sec. 5. (a) If the sum of awards under sections 3 and 4 of this
35 chapter exceeds the appropriation in a given year, the commission
36 shall reduce the level of awards offered under section 4 of this
37 chapter as necessary so that the sum of awards under sections 3
38 and 4 of this chapter does not exceed the appropriation.

39 (b) The commission may increase, but shall not decrease, the
40 amounts of awards published under section 1 of this chapter from
41 the amount offered the previous academic year.

42 Sec. 6. (a) As used in this section, "annual award amount" refers
43 to:

44 (1) for a recipient of a Frank O'Bannon award, the amount a
45 recipient is entitled to receive under sections 3 and 4 of this
46 chapter; or

47 (2) for a recipient of a twenty-first century scholars award,
48 the amount a recipient is entitled to receive under IC 21-12-6.

49 (b) The annual award amount may be used in any of the
50 academic terms offered by an eligible institution, including
51 summer terms.

1 **(c) An eligible institution, in consultation with the recipient, may**
 2 **reserve up to one hundred percent (100%) of a recipient's annual**
 3 **award amount for use in the summer.**

4 SECTION 6. IC 21-12-3-1, AS AMENDED BY P.L.107-2012,
 5 SECTION 16, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 6 SEPTEMBER 1, 2013]: Sec. 1. (a) An applicant is eligible for a first
 7 year higher education award under this chapter if the student meets the
 8 following requirements:

9 (1) The applicant is a resident of Indiana, as defined by the
 10 commission.

11 (2) The applicant:

12 (A) has successfully completed the program of instruction at
 13 an approved secondary school;

14 (B) has been granted a:

15 (i) high school equivalency certificate before July 1, 1995;
 16 or

17 (ii) state of Indiana general educational development (GED)
 18 diploma under IC 20-10.1-12.1 (before its repeal),
 19 IC 20-20-6 (before its repeal), or IC 22-4.1-18; or

20 (C) is a student in good standing at an approved secondary
 21 school and is engaged in a program that in due course will be
 22 completed by the end of the current academic year.

23 (3) The financial resources reasonably available to the applicant,
 24 as defined by the commission, are such that, in the absence of a
 25 higher education award under this chapter, the applicant would be
 26 deterred from completing the applicant's education at the
 27 approved postsecondary educational institution that the applicant
 28 has selected and that has accepted the applicant. In determining
 29 the financial resources reasonably available to an applicant to
 30 whom IC 21-18.5-4-8 applies, the commission must consider the
 31 financial resources of the applicant's legal parent.

32 (4) The applicant will use the award initially at that approved
 33 postsecondary educational institution.

34 (5) If the student is already enrolled in an approved postsecondary
 35 educational institution, the applicant must be a full-time student
 36 and be making satisfactory progress, as determined by the
 37 commission, toward a first baccalaureate degree.

38 (6) The student declares, in writing, a specific educational
 39 objective or course of study and enrolls in:

40 (A) courses that apply toward the requirements for completion
 41 of that objective or course of study; or

42 (B) courses designed to help the student develop the basic
 43 skills that the student needs to successfully achieve that
 44 objective or continue in that course of study.

45 **(7) The student is not eligible to receive a twenty-first century**
 46 **scholarship under IC 21-12-6.**

47 (b) This subsection applies to an individual who:

48 (1) meets the requirements set forth in subsection (a); and

49 (2) before the date that eligibility is determined by the
 50 commission, has been placed by or with the consent of the
 51 department of child services, by a court order, or by a licensed

1 child placing agency in:

- 2 (A) a foster family home;
 3 (B) the home of a relative or other unlicensed caretaker;
 4 (C) a child caring institution; or
 5 (D) a group home.

6 The commission shall consider an individual to whom this subsection
 7 applies as a full-need student under the commission's rules when
 8 determining the eligibility of the individual to receive financial aid
 9 administered by the commission under this chapter.

10 SECTION 7. IC 21-12-3-2, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2007, SECTION
 11 253, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 12 SEPTEMBER 1, 2013]: Sec. 2. A higher education award recipient is
 13 not eligible for assistance after the recipient has received an award for
 14 a total of eight (8) semesters or twelve (12) quarters of postsecondary
 15 education: **the number of academic terms that constitutes four (4)**
 16 **undergraduate academic years.**

17 SECTION 8. IC 21-12-3-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.107-2012,
 18 SECTION 18, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 19 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 5. (a) This section applies to the maximum grant
 20 that may be offered to an eligible student for an associate degree
 21 program at a postsecondary credit bearing proprietary educational
 22 institution that qualifies as an approved postsecondary educational
 23 institution.

24 (b) The maximum amount of a grant that may be offered to an
 25 eligible student in a program at a postsecondary credit bearing
 26 proprietary educational institution is equal to the maximum amount of
 27 an award the student could receive under this chapter if the student
 28 were enrolled at Ivy Tech Community College.

29 **(c) This section expires July 1, 2014.**

30 SECTION 9. IC 21-12-3-9, AS AMENDED BY P.L.169-2011,
 31 SECTION 3, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 32 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 9. ~~(a)~~ A higher education award for a student in
 33 a program leading to a baccalaureate degree may be renewed for a total
 34 of three (3) undergraduate academic years following the academic year
 35 of the first award or until an earlier time as the student receives a
 36 degree normally obtained in four (4) undergraduate academic years. A
 37 higher education award for a student in a program leading to a
 38 technical certificate or an undergraduate associate degree may be
 39 renewed for the number of academic years normally required to obtain
 40 a certificate or degree in the student's program. The commission may
 41 grant a renewal only upon application and only upon its finding that:

- 42 (1) the applicant has successfully completed the work of a
 43 preceding year;
 44 (2) the applicant remains domiciled in Indiana;
 45 (3) the recipient's financial situation continues to warrant an
 46 award, based on the financial requirements set forth in section
 47 (1)(a)(3) of this chapter;
 48 (4) the applicant is eligible under section 2 of this chapter; ~~and~~
 49 (5) ~~subject to subsection (b)~~; if the student initially enrolls in an
 50 eligible institution for a semester (or its equivalent) beginning

1 after June 30, 2012, the student maintains at least the following
2 cumulative grade point average:

3 (A) For credit hours applicable to the equivalent of the
4 applicant's freshman academic year, a cumulative grade point
5 average that the eligible institution determines is satisfactory
6 academic progress; and

7 (B) For credit hours applicable to the equivalent of the
8 applicant's sophomore academic year, a cumulative grade
9 point average of 2.25 on a 4.0 grading scale or its equivalent
10 as established by the eligible institution.

11 (C) For credit hours applicable to the equivalent of the
12 applicant's junior or senior academic year, a cumulative grade
13 point average of 2.5 on a 4.0 grading scale or its equivalent as
14 established by the eligible institution;

15 (6) if the student initially enrolls in an eligible institution for
16 an academic year beginning after August 31, 2013, the student
17 successfully completes:

18 (A) at least twenty-four (24) credit hours or the equivalent
19 by the end of the student's first academic year;

20 (B) at least forty-eight (48) credit hours or the equivalent
21 by the end of the student's second academic year; and

22 (C) at least seventy-two (72) credit hours or the equivalent
23 by the end of the student's third academic year.

24 A student's academic years used to determine if the student
25 meets the requirements of this subdivision are not required to
26 be successive calendar years. A recipient who fails to meet the
27 credit hour requirement for a particular academic year
28 becomes ineligible for an award during the next academic
29 year. The recipient may regain eligibility for an award in
30 subsequent academic years if the recipient meets the
31 aggregate credit hour requirements commensurate with the
32 recipient's academic standing. In addition, the commission
33 may allow a student who is otherwise ineligible under this
34 subdivision for an award during the next academic year to
35 maintain eligibility for an award if the student submits a
36 petition to the commission and the commission makes a
37 determination that extenuating circumstances (as determined
38 by the commission) prevented the student from meeting the
39 requirements of this subdivision.

40 (b) After the first semester or its equivalent at the eligible institution
41 that a person does not achieve the requisite cumulative grade point
42 average specified in subsection (a)(5), the person is considered to be on
43 probation and must achieve the requisite cumulative grade point
44 average by the next semester or its equivalent at the eligible institution
45 in order to continue to receive benefits under this chapter.

46 SECTION 10. IC 21-12-3-9.5 IS ADDED TO THE INDIANA
47 CODE AS A NEW SECTION TO READ AS FOLLOWS
48 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: **Sec. 9.5. (a) This section applies to a
49 student who initially enrolls in an eligible institution before
50 September 1, 2013.**

51 (b) Beginning in an academic year beginning after August 31,

1 **2014, a student who graduated from high school with an academic**
 2 **honors diploma is entitled to receive the following additional**
 3 **award amount each academic year:**

4 **(1) For a student attending Ivy Tech Community College or**
 5 **a postsecondary credit bearing proprietary educational**
 6 **institution, seven hundred dollars (\$700).**

7 **(2) For a student attending a state educational institution,**
 8 **eight hundred dollars (\$800).**

9 **(3) For a student attending a nonprofit college or university,**
 10 **one thousand four hundred dollars (\$1,400).**

11 **(c) This section expires September 1, 2016.**

12 SECTION 11. IC 21-12-3-10, AS AMENDED BY P.L.169-2011,
 13 SECTION 4, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 14 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 10. Out of funds available after commitments
 15 have been met under sections 8 and 9 of this chapter, awards shall be
 16 issued to persons who have successfully completed at least one (1)
 17 academic year but not more than three (3) academic years in approved
 18 postsecondary educational institutions if they meet the eligibility
 19 requirements of:

20 (1) sections 1, 2, and (if applicable) ~~9(a)(5)~~ **9(5) or 9(6)** of this
 21 chapter; or

22 (2) sections 4, 5, and (if applicable) ~~9(a)(5)~~ **9(5) or 9(6)** of this
 23 chapter.

24 The awards shall be handled on the same basis as renewals under
 25 section 9 of this chapter.

26 SECTION 12. IC 21-12-3-11, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2007,
 27 SECTION 253, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 28 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 11. **(a)** A higher education award
 29 issued under this section and sections 8, 9, and 10 of this chapter
 30 extends to all educational costs for the academic year for which the
 31 award is made, but only to the extent of:

32 (1) current financial need (as measured under section 1(3) of this
 33 chapter); or

34 (2) the maximum fees regularly assessed to resident
 35 undergraduates at any state educational institution, as determined
 36 annually by the commission;

37 whichever is smaller.

38 **(b) This section expires September 1, 2014.**

39 SECTION 13. IC 21-12-4-2, AS AMENDED BY P.L.107-2012,
 40 SECTION 19, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 41 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 2. A person is eligible for a freedom of choice
 42 grant if:

43 (1) the person is qualified for a higher education award under the
 44 terms of IC 21-12-3-1, IC 21-12-3-2, and IC 21-12-3-3 or
 45 IC 21-12-3-4, ~~and IC 21-12-3-5~~, even if lack of funds prevents the
 46 award or grant;

47 **(2) for a freedom of choice grant awarded before September**
 48 **1, 2014**, the person has a financial need that exceeds the award,
 49 as determined in accordance with:

50 (A) this chapter, IC 21-18.5-4, IC 21-12-2, and IC 21-12-3;
 51 and

- 1 (B) the rules of the commission; and
 2 (3) the person will attend an approved postsecondary educational
 3 institution that:
 4 (A) either:
 5 (i) operates in Indiana, provides an organized two (2) year or

 13 any state agency or entity.

14 SECTION 14. IC 21-12-4-4, AS ADDED BY P.L.2-2007,
 15 SECTION 253, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 16 [EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 4. **(a) This subsection applies**
 17 **before September 1, 2014.** The amount of a freedom of choice grant
 18 may not exceed the difference between:

- 19 (1) the amount of the total financial need of the student, as
 20 determined under the commission's rules; and
 21 (2) the:
 22 (A) higher education award made under IC 21-12-3-1,
 23 IC 21-12-3-2, and IC 21-12-3-3 or IC 21-12-3-4 and
 24 IC 21-12-3-5; or
 25 (B) sum necessary to pay educational costs at the institution;

 31 SECTION 227, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS
 32 [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE]: Sec. 9. The commission may order
 33 the auditor of state to transfer money ~~from~~ **among** the freedom of
 34 choice grant fund, ~~to~~ the higher education award fund, **and the**
 35 **twenty-first century scholars fund, as needed to meet the**
 36 **obligations of the funds.** The auditor of state shall make the transfer
 37 ordered by the commission with the approval of the budget director and
 38 the governor.

39 SECTION 16. IC 21-12-6-5, AS AMENDED BY P.L.107-2012,
 40 SECTION 22, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 41 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 5. (a) To qualify to participate in the program, a
 42 student must meet the following requirements:

- 43 (1) Be a resident of Indiana.
 44 (2) Be:
 45 (A) enrolled in grade 7 or 8 at a:
 46 (i) public school; or
 47 (ii) nonpublic school that is accredited either by the state
 48 board of education or by a national or regional accrediting
 49 agency whose accreditation is accepted as a school
 50 improvement plan under IC 20-31-4-2; or

- 1 (B) otherwise qualified under the rules of the commission that
 2 are adopted under IC 21-18.5-4-9(2) to include students who
 3 are in grades other than grade 8 as eligible students.

 12 SECTION 58, IS AMENDED TO READ AS FOLLOWS [EFFECTIVE
 13 JULY 1, 2013]: Sec. 5. For purposes of administering this chapter, if
 14 the commission receives an offer of a gift, grant, devise, or bequest, the
 15 commission may accept a stipulation on the use of the donated funds.
 16 In this case, **before September 1, 2014**, IC 21-12-3-11 (higher
 17 education award) and IC 21-12-4-4 (freedom of choice grant), **or, after**
 18 **August 31, 2014, the requirements under IC 21-12-1.7-3 concerning**
 19 **higher education awards and freedom of choice grants**, do not
 20 apply. Before accepting a gift, grant, devise, or bequest, the
 21 commission shall determine that the purposes for which the donor
 22 proposes to provide funds are:

- 23 (1) lawful;
- 24 (2) in the state's best interests; and
- 25 (3) generally consistent with the commission's programs and
 26 purposes.

27 If the commission agrees to a stipulation on the use of donated funds,
 28 the commission and the donor, subject to approval by the budget
 29 agency and the governor or the governor's designee, shall execute an
 30 agreement.

31 SECTION 35. [EFFECTIVE UPON PASSAGE] **(a) As used in this**
 32 **SECTION, the "commission" refers to the commission for higher**
 33 **education established in IC 21-18-2-1.**

34 **(b) The commission shall study and evaluate the following**
 35 **issues:**

- 36 **(1) The financial costs for students pursuing postsecondary**
 37 **education, including worker certifications, associate degrees,**
 38 **and baccalaureate degrees. The commission shall identify**
 39 **opportunities, methods, and strategies to increase the**
 40 **affordability of certification and degree programs in Indiana.**
- 41 **(2) On time degree completion rates for public and nonpublic**
 42 **Indiana colleges and universities. The commission shall**
 43 **identify opportunities, methods, and strategies to increase the**
 44 **percentage of students in Indiana who complete a degree on**
 45 **time.**

46 **(c) Not later than November 1, 2013, the commission shall**
 47 **report its finding under subsection (b) to the legislative council in**
 48 **an electronic format under IC 5-14-6.**

49 SECTION 36. **An emergency is declared for this act.**
