## Proposed Changes in Methods and Standards of Medicaid Payments for Home Health Agencies

In accordance with public notice requirements established at 42 CFR 447.205 and Section 1902(a)(13)(A) of the Social Security Act, the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration, Office of Medicaid Policy and Planning (OMPP) publishes this notice of proposed changes to the reimbursement methodology for Medicaid services provided by enrolled home health agencies.

The OMPP proposes to modify reimbursement formulas by reducing rates currently paid to home health agencies under the Medicaid state plan and state regulations at <u>405 IAC 1-4.2</u> by five percent below what would have otherwise been in effect. This reduction shall be effective April 1, 2010. This reduction shall remain in effect through the end of state fiscal year 2011, June 30, 2011. Beginning July 1, 2011, such Medicaid rates shall have the five percent reduction removed from the rate then in effect.

This change in reimbursement is necessary in order to avoid a budgetary shortfall and to remain within the available Medicaid appropriation. It is estimated that the fiscal impact of these changes will be a savings of state and federal expenditures of approximately \$1.9 million for SFY 2010 and \$9.6 million for SFY 2011.

These changes will be adopted in an emergency rule. A copy of this notice is now on file at the Indiana Government Center South, 402 West Washington Street, Room W451 and open for public inspection.
