Notice of Changes in Methods and Standards for Medicaid Payments for Hospitals

In accordance with public notice requirements of 42 CFR 447.205, and Section 1902(a)(13)(A) of the Social Security Act, the Indiana Family and Social Services Administration, Office of Medicaid Policy and Planning (OMPP) publishes this notice of proposed changes to the reimbursement methodology for Medicaid services provided by enrolled hospitals.

The OMPP proposes to extend the five percent reimbursement that is currently in place for rates paid to all hospitals under the Medicaid state plan and state regulations at [405 IAC 1-8](#) (hospital outpatient services, excluding ambulatory surgical center reimbursement) and [405 IAC 1-10.5](#) (inpatient hospital services). The current expiration date of June 30, 2011, will be extended to June 30, 2013. Beginning July 1, 2013, rates shall return to the level that was in effect prior to the five percent reduction. Such Medicaid rates shall have the five percent reduction removed from the rates then in effect.

This change in reimbursement is necessary in order to avoid a budgetary shortfall and to remain within the available Medicaid appropriation. It is estimated that the fiscal impact of these changes will be a savings of state and federal expenditures of approximately \$40.8 million for SFY 2012 and \$61.3 million for SFY 2013.

These changes will be adopted in an emergency rule.
